SUBJECT: Department of Defense Participation in the President's Trip to Japan and Russia

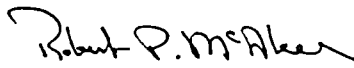
1. This memorandum provides modifications to my original memo of the same subject. To meet adjustments to the President's schedule, request consideration for the following:

Kurt Campbell, DASD (Asia and Pacific) will be required to assist the Secretary of Defense in Korea. He will also be the senior DoD representative in Japan during the President's visit. Request that provisions be made to allow DASD Campbell to travel with the President's party from Cheju, ROK to Japan.

After the Secretary of Defense departs Japan for Korea, several staff officers will remain behind to do the final work on the Joint Security Declaration prior to the President's arrival. While they will not participate in any of the President's meetings, they may require limited access to facilities in the general vicinity. To facilitate their movement and the participation of DASD Campbell, request appropriate official credentials/badges be provided for the following persons (I.D. photos for these five individuals are attached):

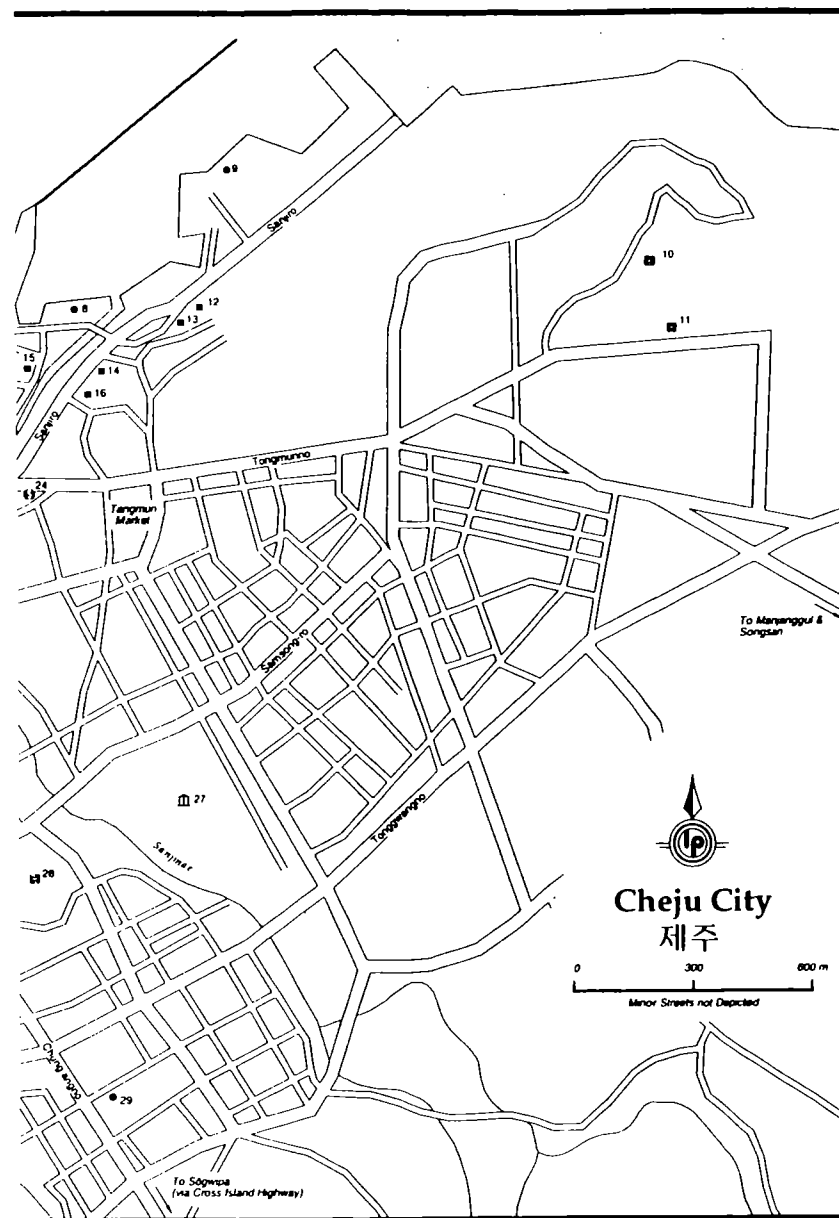
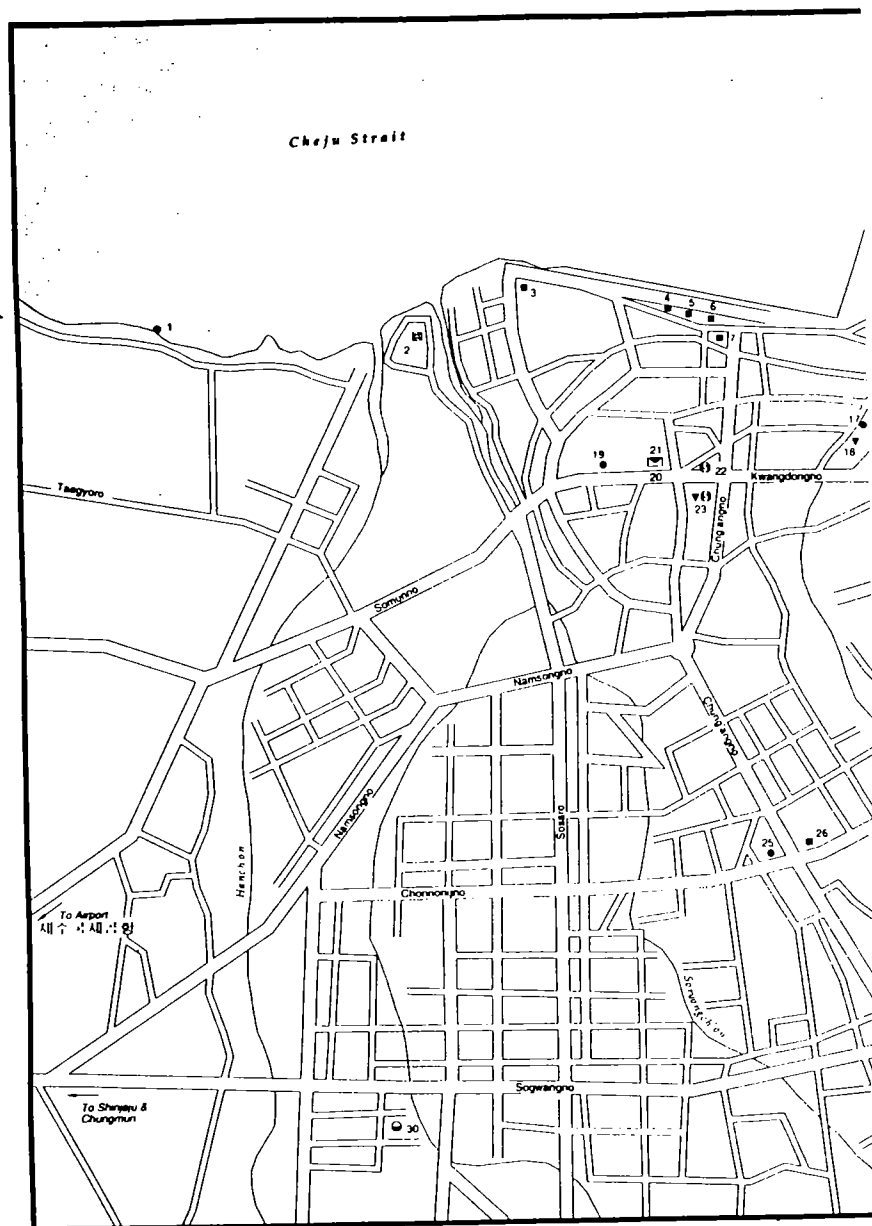

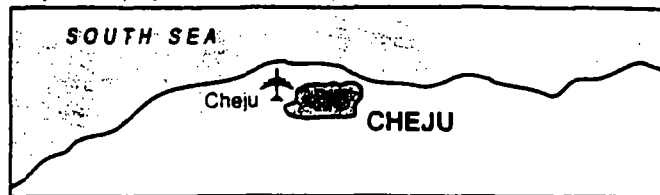
