3. Some Tips on Communications:

- Documents can be sent to the traveling party via the Situation Room for processing and transmission to the WHCA Communications Center at the trip site or aboard Air Force One anytime.

- To send documents to AF-1 please use the following procedures:

- If on the NSC computer system, E-mail these to @ COMM with passing instructions that provide a specific sense of your time criteria.

- If not on the NSC system, deliver a copy of the document with passing instructions and a disc to the Situation Room. Documents on disc (WORD) are preferred because they are easier to process and transmit. Paper documents can be either scanned and sent digitally or sent via facsimile but in both cases this is far slower than having a disc.

- To send a message to the trip site Communications Center follow the same steps. Clear passing instructions and specific time criteria

are important. If you alert the intended recipient that a document is headed their way, they can inform the WHCA Communications Center of their whereabouts to speed delivery. After hours delivery sometimes pose a problem, please include specific guidance as to whether or not to wake up the intended recipient or such other guidance suitable to the circumstance

- Sending E-mail to the NSC Office:

-- NSC E-mail is available at all three stops. Remember, however, that trip events regularly require the traveling party to be away from the nsc office. Consequently, they will not get a message until the next time they log-on and review their inbox. If you need to bring something to the attention of a traveler, cc: @ Comm and indicate near the top of the text that this is time sensitive and needs to be brought to the attention of the recipient. Both the Sitroom Comm Assistant and/or Comm Assistant at the trip site will intervene to notify the addressee of important e-mail and arrange for immediate delivery if warranted. Use of this latter service should relate to an impending trip event...not all circumstances.

- Sending message traffic to a trip event site please follow the below instructions:

-- When sending messages to an event site the same procedures for sending to AF-1 and the trip Comm Center apply. This is the slowest form of processing messages because the WHCA Communications Vehicle(Roadrunner) is the only platform handling message traffic, and although capable, it does not have the same capacity as the Comm Center. It is imperative, therefore, that messages going to Roadrunner be related to the event in progress, the next event or some situation requiring urgent notification of an NSC or other White House Principal.

- SVTS is available in **Japan and Korea** it should be scheduled in advance, through the Situation Room Communication Assistant.
- NSC Systems Trip Officer (NSTO) will travel ahead to each stop for set up and checking of of NSC Lan. They will not be at respective sites for the entire POTUS visit. The Communication Assistants are available to assist with operations and problem-solving of the NSC LAN and SVTS, and can communicate telephonically with the NSTO if needed.

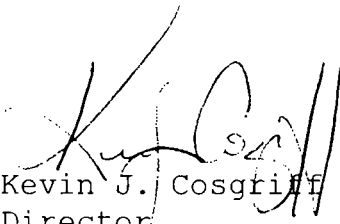

Office Space & Location

1. Three (3) adjoining rooms in the RON hotel:
 - a) APNSA/DAPNSA Suite
 - b) NSC Executive Secretariat Staff
 - c) NSC Senior Staff
2. Adjacent to or across the hall from the White House Communications Agency (WHCA) Trip Communications Center.
3. In close proximity to the White House Traveling Staff Office.

NSC Staff Sleeping Quarters

1. APNSA (suite) [if not on the USSS secure floor], DAPNSA, and NSC Executive Secretary sleeping quarters should be located on the same wing as the NSC offices behind the WHCA Security Force sentry.
2. Sleeping quarters of the remaining NSC traveling staff members (including the NSC Systems Trip Officer and Situation Room Communications Assistant) should be within walking proximity to the NSC offices (i.e., no more than 2 floors away).

Data

The NSC requires continuous data connectivity from the POTUS trip site to the NSC local area network (LAN) at the White House. This connectivity consists of an encrypted 64kb data circuit utilizing a Cisco router and Cabletron MMAC hub.

Pagers:

1. One AlphaMate paging system is required in the NSC Executive Secretariat office.
2. Additionally, in the event that the Washington DC WHCA-issued pagers do not function, all traveling NSC Staff members require a pager.

Unclassified Facsimile Machine:

1. One plain-paper unclassified facsimile machine is required in the WHCA Trip Communications Center to facilitate unclassified message traffic for NSC Staff.

Photocopy Machine:

1. One photocopy machine is required in the NSC Executive Secretariat office.

Video

1. In Kuala Lumpur, Tokyo, and Seoul: Secure Video Teleconference System (SVTS) node in the NSC Senior Staff office utilizing on demand 384kb video circuit.
2. Bandwidth permitting SVTS node will be tuned to CNN to provide NSC Staff with world news when not engaged in a conference.

NSC TRIP OFFICE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PRESIDENT'S TRIP TO
GUAM, MALAYSIA, JAPAN, & KOREA

Power

1. Computers, phones, and SVTS equipment in the NSC office must be connected to (all 3):
 - a) WHCA's filtered power supply
 - b) Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS)
 - c) WHCA's Emergency power supply

Physical/Technical Security

1. The NSC offices must be a Temporary Sensitive Compartmented Information Facility (TSCIF).
2. TS/SCI Cleared WHCA Security Force sentry must be posted 24 hours-a-day, 7 days-a-week while classified information is stored and processed in the NSC offices.

Operational Status

1. All of the above requirements must be satisfied and the NSC offices declared fully operational no later than 8 hours prior to POTUS/NSC Staff arrival and preferably by local close of business the day before.

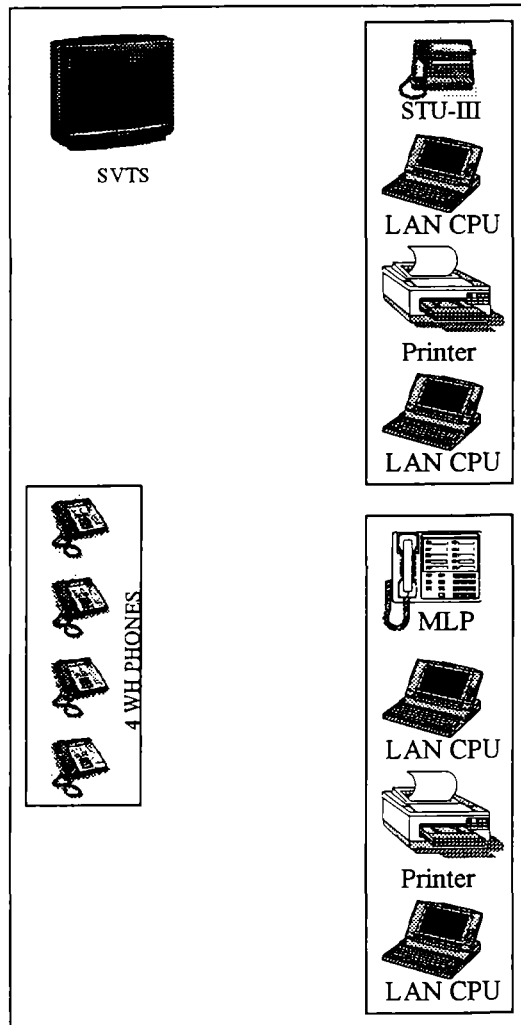

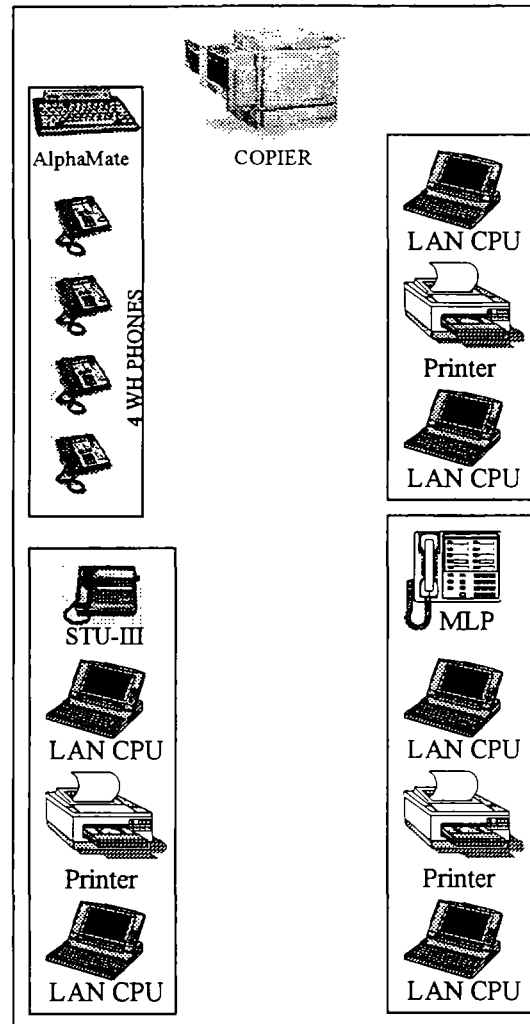

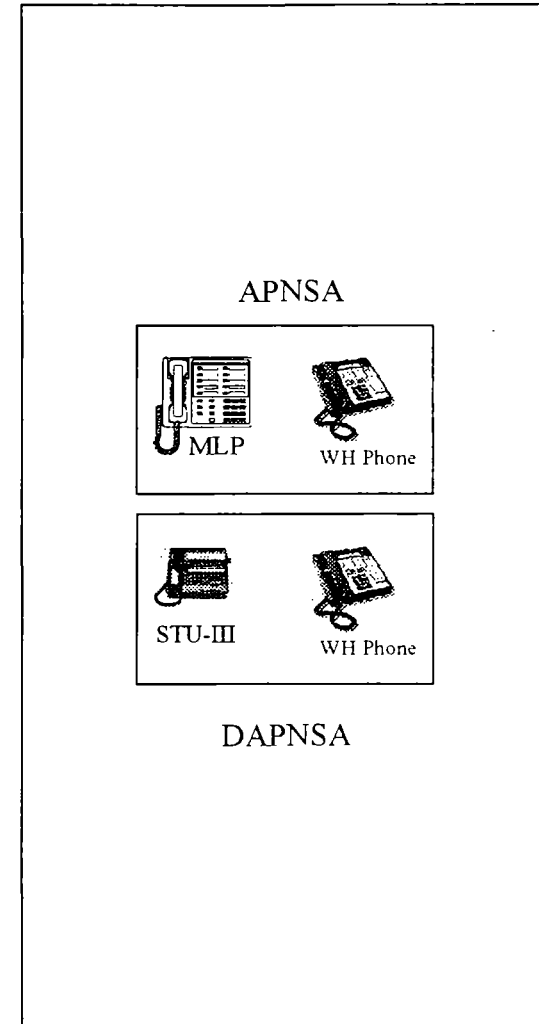
