STATEMENT BY THE PRESS SECRETARY

Presidential Travel to Mexico, the Caribbean, Central and South
America

The President will travel to Mexico from April 11-12 and to the Caribbean, Central and South America and from May 6-13. The May trip will include stops in Barbados, Costa Rica, Brazil, and Argentina.

By traveling first to Mexico, the President will highlight Mexico's role as our third largest trading partner and its ongoing economic recovery, as reflected by its successful repayment, three years ahead of schedule, of the U.S. loan package. The President's visit to Mexico will also focus on our increasingly close partnership on issues of counter-drug cooperation, law enforcement, migration and the environment.

The President's travel will advance initiatives launched at the Miami Summit of the Americas and will demonstrate the Administration's ongoing commitment to building a hemispheric community of free market democracies. Following on the February 26 State Visit by Chile's President Frei, the President's trips will help set the stage for the second hemispheric Summit, to be held March 1998 in Santiago. The President has asked Mack McLarty, his Counselor and Special Envoy for the Americas, to coordinate preparations for these trips and U.S. participation in the Santiago Summit.

THE PRESIDENT'S TRIP TO LATIN AMERICAQuestion:

What is the purpose of the President's Upcoming Trip to Latin America? What countries will he visit? Will a Fast Track proposal be unveiled before or immediately following this visit?

Answer:

The President's trip to Latin America and the Caribbean will demonstrate our recommitment to U.S. engagement and leadership in world affairs and especially in our own hemisphere. The new realities of the region -- democracy, economic growth, and increased respect for human rights and the rule of law -- have shown that the hemisphere is ready for increased integration and greater cooperation.

The timing and itinerary for the President's visit are still to be determined, but I anticipate he will make stops in both South and Central America and the Caribbean.

The Administration will seek fast-track authority in the coming weeks. We continue to believe that hemispheric economic integration is key to our mutual well-being. Fast-track authority is an essential tool for achieving this important goal.

SUBJECT: President's Trip to Mexico, Latin America and

REF: State

1. The President intends to travel to Mexico from April 11-12 and Latin America and the Caribbean from May 6-13. The latter trip will include stops in Barbados, Costa Rica, Brazil, and Argentina. The two trips will be built around the themes of the Miami Summit of the Americas, and will provide an opportunity to signal the Administration's commitment to further efforts towards the construction of a hemispheric community of free market democracies.

2. Action addressees are asked to approach host governments immediately to lay out our concept for the visits and confirm acceptability of our proposed dates. Mini-summits with Caribbean and Central American nations will be held in Barbados and Costa Rica respectively. Agendas for these Summits will be the subject of future discussions between our governments. In the case of San Jose, we propose invitations to the heads of state from Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica and Panama. In the case of Bridgetown, we propose invitations to the CARICOM governments and Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

3. A/S Davidow spoke with President Figueres February 4.

Figueres was delighted at the prospect of a Presidential visit and agreed to host a regional meeting of the Central American Presidents. Ambassador Hyde received an equally enthusiastic response from PM Owen Arthur who is pleased to host the Caribbean meeting. Davidow also spoke with Argentine Vice Foreign Minister Cisneros, Brazilian Deputy Foreign Minister Rego Barros, and the Argentine and Brazilian ambassadors in Washington, all of whom were enthusiastic about the upcoming visit. A/S Davidow stressed in each conversation the need for confidentiality until the official announcement is made by the White House.

4. Posts should advise Washington immediately of any schedule conflicts during the dates we propose. Posts are invited to offer suggestions regarding possible Presidential events to include policy rationales in the context of our Summit of the Americas agenda. The White House will probably announce the trip in a press release on February 5.

5. For Belize: President Figueres stated that in addition to the Central American presidents and Panama, he would invite Belize. Yet, we know that Belize is also a CARICOM member. Embassy should decide to which regional meeting Belize should be invited.

PRESIDENT'S TRAVEL TO THE REGION - OVERARCHING THEMES

- Renewal and recommitment of US engagement and leadership in world affairs: 50 year anniversary of the Marshall Plan, hosting the G7, US has benefitted from post-War establishment of international institutions and an increasingly integrated world economy; world has benefitted from open US markets and leadership in support of the post-War system. Generosity of spirit, mutual reward. Our own hemisphere is ready for increased integration and greater cooperation, and engagement in the hemisphere critical to our own well-being domestically.
- Historic moment, unrivalled opportunities: President's travel will reeducate the US public to the new realities of the region--democracy, economic growth, increasing respect for human rights and the rule of law, peace in Central America. Shared values, common interests. Affirm progress, Miami vision, optimistic future outlook.
- Neighbors, partners, and friends: Region can be a valued partner in achieving our policy goals. Support for firm steps in world trouble spots (Iraq, Bosnia, Haiti), counternarcotics, terrorism, immigration, environmental concerns, peaceful democratic transition in Cuba. Once at loggerheads, we're now working together to make our lives safer, more prosperous, fairer, and cleaner.
- Democracy Delivers (Putting People First): Now that democracy and economic reform are the norms in Latin America/Caribbean, governments must deliver the fruits of freedom and reform. Reinvention of government to make it stronger (not bigger), more responsive to the people, fairer, more just. Improve education, business opportunity, anti-corruption and attack on traditional ways of doing business, personal safety and individual responsibility. Need to pay special attention to those who have not yet benefitted, set the table for Santiago Summit of the Americas. Our posture is market oriented, with sensitivity to social issues.
- Vision of a Greater America: Economic integration is key to our mutual well-being, and in many ways is the lynchpin for the rest of our hemispheric agenda. US must recover mantle of leadership in hemispheric integration efforts. First step is concrete action for broad fast track authority; thereafter, Chile accession to NAFTA, CBI enhancement, FTAA 2005 can progress concurrently.

COUNTRY SPECIFIC MESSAGES

Frei Visit

Opening salvo in restoring momentum to the Summit of the Americas process and reassertion of US commitment to the Miami goal of a hemispheric community of open market democracies. We need a clear and firm message on fast track/Chile's accession to NAFTA (renewal of US leadership role in hemispheric trade matters, vision of greater America); commitment for Presidential travel to Santiago Summit and setting the table for the Santiago Summit agenda (democracy delivers), support for broad bilateral relationship including agriculture, narcotics (true partnership), not just trade aspects.

Mexico

Bilateral relationship is uniquely broad, deep. Mexico is a valued partner in achieving mutual goals such as trade expansion, counternarcotics, immigration issues (neighbors, partners, friends). Visit will begin to decouple Mexico from rest of hemisphere; we can no longer afford the luxury of viewing the rest of the hemisphere through a "Mexico prism." NAFTA relationship must be fully functioning--cross border trucking, avocados, etc (we need to shore up our base before we can implement a vision of a greater Americas). Progress on environmental issues such as tuna/dolphin, and political and economic reform (democracy delivers).

Hemispheric Visit

- Caribbean - CBI enhancement is perhaps the critical issue (vision of a greater America). Emphasize benefits of true partnership to address narcotics, immigration, trade and investment issues (partnership). Put in context of US national security microenterprise (historic moment with unrivalled opportunities). Highlight civil society and role of women in development (democracy delivers).
- Brazil - Key bilateral relationship in terms of hemispheric integration, highlight economic reform, trade and US investment issues (vision of greater America). Brazil is the giant of South America, we need to recognize its weight in the world while stressing our common agenda in environment, narcotics, peace in Peru/Ecuador, nuclear non-proliferation, etc (partnership).
- Argentina - Perhaps our best friend in South America, stress benefits of US engagement and partnership to deal with issues of common concern (partnership). Key player on FTAA, can help moderate Brazil; we need a sophisticated approach. Also emphasize economic reform, trade, and investment (vision of greater America). Moderation of external policies such as Falklands/Malvinas, space program with democratic governance (democracy delivers).
- Central America - Similar to Caribbean, CBI enhancement. Emphasize benefits of true partnership for narcotics, immigration, trade and investment (partnership). Put in context of US national security. Highlight end of regional conflicts, role of small, medium sized businesses in development, environmental issues (democracy delivers).

Purpose

To approve a list of foreign press events timed to coincide with your meetings with foreign leaders in Washington and your foreign travel to Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean.

Background

As a result of the election and other time constraints, your ability to meet with the foreign press has been limited in the past year. Now, with a full schedule of foreign visitors and overseas travel during the next few months, we recommend you make use of the opportunities the foreign press offers to demonstrate American leadership to foreign publics and to reflect strong U.S. leadership overseas back into the United States.

What follows is a checklist of proposed foreign press opportunities tied to the scheduled visits of Canadian Prime Minister Chretien (April 8) and Japanese Prime Minister Hashimoto (April 25) and your travel to Mexico, Costa Rica and Barbados (May 6-10).

RECOMMENDATIONS

Chretien Visit (April 8): We recommend one Canadian TV interview. The Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) can cover both French- and English-speaking Canada and will make a transcript available to Canadian print media.

Mexico, Costa Rica and Barbados (May 6-10): Before your trip, we recommend two interviews: 1) with a group of Mexican journalists and 2) with a group from Central America and the Caribbean.
