Thank you for taking the time to visit us at Defense Special Weapons Agency (DSWA) this past Monday. We had a good discussion on a wide variety of issues. As a follow-up to those discussions, I am including some further information on the Deterrence Framework and an information paper on Exercise Ulchi Focus.

I have spoken to BGen Chip Gregson since you visited DSWA in reference to your WMD Section IV and to summarize for him our discussions on Monday. I will be attending a workshop later this week in the Pentagon on ACOM's new role in consequence management; I understand that Mr. Steve Simon will be attending from the NSC. 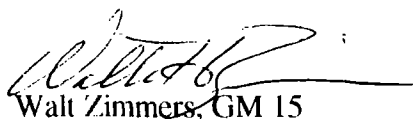
PURPOSE: Provide a summary overview of Defense Special Weapons Agency (DSWA) WMD support to the Combined Forces Command; US Forces Korea, and the ROK for the major combined exercise, Ulichi Focus. The proponent for this support is the Weapons Effects Directorate (WE), Modeling and Simulation Center (Mr. Walt Zimmers, Chief).

BACKGROUND: Exercise Ulichi Focus is the major annual wargame played by all of the combatant command elements in the ROK. It is centered on a scenario which involves the full range of potential combat activities in the event of an aggression by nK forces across the 38th parallel. DSWA has supported the WMD play and issue addressal of the exercise for the past 10 years with a variety of technical and personnel support. In the past several years the emphasis has been on supporting the WMD effects analysis and countermeasures functions in the combined forces headquarters.

DISCUSSION: This year as in the past several, DSWA/WE is deploying support elements to the CFC headquarters to:

- Provide the CINC and his staff with on-scene WMD effects and countermeasures staff capability at the CINC command post and in the WMD Cells throughout the exercise area.
- Demonstrate enhanced simulation and prediction technologies and effects to support the exercise WMD scenario.
- Deploy and utilize the DSWA/WE developed Hazard Prediction Consequence Assessment models and supporting infrastructure of analysis and assessment.
- Demonstrate and utilize the DSWA/WE Modeling and Simulation worldwide connectivity to DSWA homebase assets and data bases from the CINC Headquarters.
- Provide a forum for further assessment and development of technical support to the WMD requirements of USFK/CFC.

This years exercise will be conducted during the last three weeks of August. DSWA will support with augmentees and technical support models and connectivity to HQ DSWA during that period. Additionally, 8 people will be deployed to support in-country.
