The members of the Security Council take note of the oral and written reports of International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Director General Dr. Hans Blix on the background to the IAEA Board of Governors' resolution of 1st April 1993 (GOV/2644). The members of the Council also take note of the letter of 12 March 1993 of the Permanent Representative of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) to the President of the Security Council (S/....), enclosing one from his Foreign Minister in accordance with Article X of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT).

The members of the Council are concerned at the situation which has arisen. They reaffirm the importance of achieving the universality of NPT and of States parties to the NPT honoring their commitments under it.

The members of the Council also express their support for the North-South Joint Declaration on the Denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula, and call for its full implementation.

The members of the Council welcome all efforts aimed at resolving this situation and in particular encourage the IAEA to continue its consultations with the DPRK and its constructive endeavors for a proper settlement of the nuclear verification issue in the DPRK.

The members of the Security Council will continue to follow the situation closely.

The Board of Governors,

- (a) Recalling its Resolution (GOV/2636) of 25 February 1993 and Resolution (GOV/2639) of 18 March 1993,
 - (b) Noting that there has been no positive response from the DPRK by the end of March,
 - (c) Having considered the Report of the Director General (GOV/2643) and, in particular, the conclusions in paragraph 12, that the DPRK is in non-compliance with the terms of its Safeguards Agreement with the Agency and,
 - (d) Taking account of the rights and obligations under that Agreement,
1. Finds, based on the Report of the Director General, that the DPRK is in non-compliance with its obligations under its Safeguards Agreement with the Agency;

2. Further finds, pursuant to Article 19 of the Agreement, that the Agency is not able to verify that there has been no diversion of nuclear material required to be safeguarded under the terms of the Safeguards Agreement to nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices;
3. Calls upon the DPRK to remedy forthwith its non-compliance, including by granting without further delay access to specific additional information and to two locations as set out in the Director General's request to the DPRK of 9 February 1993;
4. Decides, as required by Article XII.C. of the Statute and in accordance with Article 19 of the Agreement, to report the DPRK's non-compliance and the Agency's inability to verify non-diversion of nuclear material required to be safeguarded, to all Members of the Agency and to the Security Council and General Assembly of the United Nations;
5. Requests the Director General to make the report referred to in paragraph 4 above on behalf of the Board;
6. Requests the Director General to continue his efforts and dialogue to implement fully the Agreement and to keep the Board informed of any significant developments;
7. Decides to remain seized of the matter.

STATEMENT BY RICHARD BOUCHER

Based on their meeting in Vienna on March 17, 1992, the governments of the three NPT depositary states -- Russia, the UK, and the U.S., wish to make the following statement.

-- "We express regret and concern at the announcement by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) of its intention to withdraw from the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT).

-- Since the NPT is an essential element of international peace and security, DPRK withdrawal from the NPT would constitute a serious threat to regional and international stability.

-- We question whether the DPRK's stated reasons for withdrawing from the Treaty constitute extraordinary events relating to the subject matter of the Treaty. In this regard, we recall that nuclear-related security assurances have been provided to the DPRK as a non-nuclear weapon state party to the NPT.

-- Remaining a party to the Treaty and complying fully with its terms would be in the DPRK's interests. It would help to reassure the international community about the nature of the DPRK's nuclear program and the DPRK's desire for positive international relations, including peaceful nuclear cooperation.

-- Moreover, DPRK withdrawal from the NPT would jeopardize stability on the Korean peninsula, which has improved in recent years, and undermine efforts to implement the North-South Joint declaration on Denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula.

-- We urge the DPRK to retract its announcement and to comply fully with its Treaty commitments and its safeguards obligations, which remain in force. In this respect, we strongly support the efforts of the International Atomic Energy Agency to implement its safeguards agreement with the DPRK."

The three governments call upon all NPT parties to associate themselves with this statement and to urge the DPRK to reconsider its position and to fulfill its commitments under the Treaty.

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I agree with you also that there ought to be ways found to have the funds flow directly from the G7 or individual countries to their businesses, rather than to the government, if possible. This is a situation that needs to be worked on at several levels. But I would emphasize that as far as the macroeconomic assistance is concerned, it's our belief that it needs to be done on a multilateral level; that is, that the industrial democracies need to work together, because so much of the debt is in the hands of other countries other than the United States.

REP. LIVINGSTON: Thank you.

Shifting to what was Yugoslavia, the latest news reports indicate that Russia has asked the U.N. Security Council to delay a scheduled vote on a no-fly zone over Bosnian territory. Presumably, Mr. Yeltsin's troubles, and the current negotiations and problems between his administration and the parliament play some role.

But in the meantime, the Bosnians, I heard on the radio today, are very very concerned that any delay plays into the hands of the Serbs, and the Serbs continue to push their efforts.

How do you view that situation? And do you see any possibility of an early resolution?

SECRETARY CHRISTOPHER: Congressman, I do see the possibility of an early resolution. I do not think there will be a prolonged delay.

Let me step back and put that just in a little broader context if I might. The United States has been favorable to the enforcement of the no-fly resolution of the U.N. Security Council for some time, dating back at least to my statement on the 10th of February.

We've been urging all the parties to agree to the enforcement of a no-fly zone.

As you know, Great Britain and France were reluctant to have that done in the past because they thought it would jeopardize their troops on the ground. And we had to give concern to that.

They have been asking at a minimum for somewhere between seven and 28 days of notice before a no-fly zone would be enforced. And more broadly, they were opposed to it generally speaking.

Just within the last week, France has indicated a willingness to support a no-fly zone, and we're working that matter through the U.N. It is something that can't be done alone; it needs to be done in conjunction with our United Nations allies and other friends.

I would say that the delay that was announced yesterday will be a relatively short-term delay. I don't expect any prolonged delay. And my feeling is that we will finally be able to proceed with the enforcement of a no-fly zone within a relatively short period of time.

Now, that is an important step. At the moment, Mr. Livingston, it may be more important psychologically than it is actually. There have been some flights, but there have not been a tremendous volume of flights. But we intend to keep pushing forward on that as we have on the other elements of a program that we laid down on the 10th of February.

REP. LIVINGSTON: In another part of the world, the North Koreans have backed off from the nuclear nonproliferation treaty, and are of course declining international inspection of their nuclear sites.

What efforts are being made to encourage them to comply with the treaty?

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SECRETARY CHRISTOPHER: Mr. Livingston, that is a very serious problem that has certainly engaged our attention. At the present time, the IAEA, the International Atomic Energy Association, is proceeding to try to persuade the North Koreans to withdraw--to remain part of the endeavor, and to go forward, and to permit the inspections to take place.

We've been working on this with the other countries in the region trying to persuade the North Koreans that their decision was an erroneous one, and we hope that that will take place.

As you probably know, their withdrawal has a 90-day period on it. They cannot withdraw except on 90 days' notice, so there is some period of time to work.

What will happen is, the IAEA will review this matter. If they conclude that North Korea is in violation, then the matter will be referred to the U.N. Security Council. We would expect that to happen perhaps before the end of the month, or about the first of the month. And then there will be enforcement action taken within the U.N. Security Council.

I've been pleased to hear from experts that we believe the sanctions can be effective with North Korea. There has been some comment that they are so isolated that sanctions might not have any effect on them.

But if we get to the point of the IAEA recommending to the U.N., and then the U.N. taking action against North Korea, there seem to be a number of ways in which pressure can be put on them, and perhaps we won't have to get to that point because they'll realize earlier on that they made a mistake in withdrawing from this convention.

So we're working the situation with other countries in the region who might have a particular influence with North Korea. It is a serious problem.

REP. LIVINGSTON: It is indeed. Would you care to give us some idea of the types of sanctions you have in mind?

SECRETARY CHRISTOPHER: Well, they're primarily in the field of raw materials; certain kinds of exports that they need in order to run their economy; various--oil, gas, other kinds of raw materials, and perhaps some measure of food. The information that I have this morning is that there are some sanctions that can be effective with them even though they've been very isolated.

REP. LIVINGSTON: Just one more question, Mr. Secretary. On Nicaragua, there is old money in the till, I think for fiscal year '92, that was conditioned on some--the progress of property claims, improvement of human rights situations, and civilian reform of police and military.

Apparently, \$50 million of about \$100 million was released in December, and another \$50 million is in the pipeline, still subject to those conditions. We're getting a lot of stories that, frankly, there hasn't been much progress along those lines in Nicaragua. UNO, one of the participating parties--in fact the winning, victorious party in the last elections--has even added a longer list of conditions for future release of money to the country. Because they feel that the administration really has not complied with some of the very basic demands that we have made in this country.

And lastly, on March 18th, Congressman Chris Smith of New Jersey and I sent a letter to the government of Nicaragua requesting that an independent U.N. OAS mission be established to investigate various charges against the Nicaraguan government, including human rights violations.
