Please find attached an analysis of concrete possibilities for US-DPRK collaboration on urgent energy issues in the DPRK economy. Also, it may be worth spending some time ensuring that the US philanthropic community is apprised of the need to respond to DPRK needs given its capability to move significant funds at short notice (albeit, subject to US government approval).

We will circulate shortly a study of US options for regional economic and environmental cooperation in Northeast Asia that pertain to drawing the DPRK out of its box, written by Mark Valencia at the East West Center; and another on DPRK decision making by Alexandre Mansourev at Columbia University.

ENERGY SECTOR COLLABORATION WITH THE DPRK

October 29/93

Peter Hayes*

In this research note, I outline six possibilities for US and multilateral collaboration with the DPRK to overcome its urgent problems in the energy sector as part of a negotiated settlement of the nuclear impasse. The projects range from the small (\$0.5 million, single shot) to large (\$10 million plus, multi year programs). Some can be implemented immediately; others would take some years to crank up.

I assume that the reader is acquainted with other analyses that provide essential background which is not repeated here.² Also, potential US-DPRK collaboration in developing a DPRK nuclear fuel cycle, in particular, the provision of an LWR, is not addressed here.³

In each case, I cover the following issues: 1) topic; 2) short summary of need; 3) US action to fulfil need; 4) estimated funding required; 5) possible US supplier of resources; 6) likely DPRK counterpart; and 7) security implications of project.

PROJECT 1

- *Topic:* Real Time Electric Power System Dispatch
- *Short Summary:* The power system lacks an modern, automated, and computerised supervisory and monitoring capability that can support a load

dispatching function in real time. The pilot project underway with UNDP support to rectify this deficiency covers four critical power plants and substations only. The UNDP project will not resolve this problem at a system level.

- **US action to fulfil need:** The US could: (a) agree to permit the leading candidate to supply the requisite computer for the UNDP project (a Chinese firm producing US computers under license) to export the necessary equipment to the DPRK to allow the UNDP project to proceed; (b) undertake a large scale refurbishment of the electrical transmission and distribution system.

- *Estimated funding required:* (a) none (UNDP \$1.5 million is already allocated); (b) up to a billion dollars per year could be spent on refurbishing of the transmission and distribution system as a whole over 5 years.⁴ Obviously, this figure exceeds US resources (let alone will), but indicates that there are no practical limits on how much the US might invest in this area of need.

- *Possible US supplier of resources:* (a) US technology licensee in China; (b) USAID and IBRD/ADB.

- *Likely DPRK counterpart:* The Electric Power Dispatching Bureau's Electric Power Production and Dispatching Control Center (EPPDCC) under the Electric Power Industry Commission (EPIC).

- *Security implications of project:* the lights going out in Pyongyang is a major embarrassment to the DPRK government. This project should reduce outages somewhat. It is a cheap, fast way to send a positive signal to the DPRK in an area that will have positive, tangible and highly valued results for the DPRK leadership and that would require minimal interagency deliberation in the United States. As the relevant dispatch center for item (a) is above ground and vulnerable, this capability would not be expected to last long in wartime; the dismemberment of the transmission and distribution system that would ensue in a war would also render the computer equipment unusable even if it survived attack. Item (b) would not last long in wartime.

PROJECT 2

- *Topic:* Clean Coal Technology

- *Short Summary:* The DPRK lacks basic coal beneficiation (cleaning ex-mine, pre-powerhouse) and stack emission control technology in electric power and industrial plants.

- **US action to fulfil need:** The US could: (a) provide services to analyse the sectoral needs for investment funds to address these two environmental

dimensions of local and regional (acid rain fallout on South Korea and Japan) of coal production and use; (b) implement pilot clean up projects in these areas.

- *Estimated funding required:* (a) for beneficiation and emissions control study--\$0.5-1 million; (b) for two pilot projects, \$2-10 million.
- *Possible US supplier of resources:* USAID.
- *Likely DPRK counterpart:* Ministry of Coal Mining, the Institute of Coal Chemical Technology and the Mineral Processing Technology Center.
- *Security implications of project:* none in the military dimension; possible positive impact in terms of promotion of DPRK involvement in regional environmental cooperation to address the acid rain problem.

PROJECT 3

- *Topic:* Reforestation and Rural Energy Needs
- *Short Summary:* (a) The Government has a national forestry program but lacks many basic resources needed to pursue a rational and sustainable reforestation strategy including land use mapping, surveying and monitoring ecosystem health and rates of recovery in pilot reforestation project areas. It also needs external technical assistance to review forestry legislation with regard to policies and regulations that need to be modified or updated to facilitate reforestation on degraded forests. (b) Although the Government has initiated a rudimentary research and pilot program on renewable energy for rural communities (especially on biogas, solar hot water, microhydro), it lacks a comprehensive rural energy analytical, research and policy framework in which to define research and development priorities for renewable energy technology, and the means to design and evaluate pilot integrated rural energy projects.
- *US action to fulfil need:* The United States could provide TA resources for provincial pilot reforestation and pilot integrated rural energy projects in the context of a review of national forest and rural energy policy.
- *Estimated funding required:* (a) \$0.5-3 million could be reasonably absorbed by DPRK forestry institutions; (b) \$0.5-1.5 million could be expended usefully in rural energy survey and integrated rural energy technology pilot projects.
- *Possible US supplier of resources:* USAID; US Office of Science and Technology Policy; LBL
- *Likely DPRK counterpart:* for (a) DPRK Academy of Forestry; for (b) Institute of Thermal Engineering.
- *Security implications of project:* none in the military dimension. Possible positive contribution in terms of building a DPRK commitment to fulfil its obligations to increase its carbon sink under the Climate Change Convention to which it is signatory.

PROJECT 4

- *Topic:* Diffusion of Fluidised Bed Combustion Technology
- *Short Summary:* A nearly completed UNDP project supported the transfer of second generation circulating fluidised bed combustion boiler (CFBC) technology

from China to the DPRK. This technology involves pulverising low grade coal, and "fluidising" it by suspending the resultant particulates in a flow of hot air. The technology increases combustion efficiency and reduces polluting emissions. The UNDP project transferred the design and manufacturing capability from China to the DPRK for the CFBC; helped with the construction of a test rig and pilot plant; and helped with construction and operation of a prototype 35 tonne of steam/hour prototype intended for application in industrial and municipal boilers. The DPRK government plans to disseminate the technology widely but lacks the resources to do so rapidly. The 2nd generation CFBC increases combustion efficiency by about 10-15 percent over the widely used first generation "bubble" FBC technology (of which about 1,000 units already operate). About 12,000 small and medium sized boilers from 1-2 up to 35 tonnes of steam per hour could use the technology, resulting a major decrease in coal demand, local pollution from coal production and use, and reduction in global greenhouse gas emissions. More information is needed to identify investment opportunities in the dissemination of the new technology in key sectors such as chemicals, textiles, and food processing.

- **US action to fulfil need:** The United States could provide technical assistance in scaling up the DPRK pilot plant, and in implementing pilot projects at various scales and end use sectors; and could support a national program to disseminate the technology to all potential adopters/end users.
- *Estimated funding required:* (a) \$1-10 million for pilot plants to full scale national dissemination program of the technology.
- *Possible US supplier of resources:* DOE
- *Likely DPRK counterpart:* Institute for Thermal Engineering and the Centre for Rational Energy Use
- *Security implications of project:* none in the military dimension.

PROJECT 5

- *Topic:* National Energy Planning
- *Short Summary:* The energy sector involves literally dozens of line agencies and commissions in the DPRK. There is no central energy planning in the DPRK. A review of energy sector institutional arrangements, pricing policies, taxes, subsidies, sources of technological innovation, and integration of energy objectives with economic and environmental goals is badly needed in the DPRK.
- **US action to fulfil need:** The United States could provide technical assistance to produce an energy sector review and proposed national energy sector plan for the DPRK.
- *Estimated funding required:* (a) \$0.5-1 million.
- *Possible US supplier of resources:* USAID; DOE
- *Likely DPRK counterpart:* State Planning Commission and Centre for Rational Energy Use.
- *Security implications of project:* none in the military dimension.

PROJECT 6

- ***Topic:*** Demand Side Management (Electrical Power Sector)
- ***Short Summary:*** Virtually every DPRK end user of energy, including electricity, is wasteful. The DPRK needs to define the objectives and scope of a national demand side management (DSM) program for its electrical sector, and to select priorities for implementing the program among classes of electrical consumers.
- ***US action to fulfil need:*** The United States could provide technical assistance to define a national DSM strategy and action plan for consideration by multilateral donors, to include technical potential for DSM, economics of DSM, institutional development, and training requirements for DSM program.
- ***Estimated funding required:*** (a) \$0.5-1 million for DSM study.
- ***Possible US supplier of resources:*** USAID; DOE
- ***Likely DPRK counterpart:*** Electric Power Industry Commission (EPIC), the Institute for Thermal Engineering, and the Centre for Rational Energy Use
- ***Security implications of project:*** none in the military dimension.
