(August 12, 1994)**

The delegations of the United States of America (USA) and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) met in Geneva from August 5-12, 1994, to resume the third round of talks on a comprehensive resolution of the nuclear issue. They reaffirmed the principles of the June 11, 1993, U.S.-DPRK joint statement.

Furthermore, both sides reached agreement on the following objectives, which will be part of a comprehensive solution of the nuclear issue:

① (1) The DPRK is prepared to replace its graphite-moderated reactors and related systems with light water reactor (LWR) technology, and the U.S. is prepared to arrange the provision of an LWR project of approximately 2,000 MW(e) to the DPRK and to arrange for interim energy alternatives to the DPRK's graphite-moderated reactors. Upon receipt of U.S. assurances, the DPRK will freeze construction of the 50 MW(e) and 200 MW(e) reactors, forgo reprocessing, and seal and safeguard the Radio-Chemical Laboratory.

② (2) To build trust between the U.S. and the DPRK, both sides are prepared to begin a process to establish diplomatic representation in each other's capitals and to reduce barriers to trade and investment.

③ (3) The DPRK is prepared to remain a party to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and to implement its fullscope IAEA safeguards obligations.

(4) To help achieve peace and security on a nuclear-free Korean peninsula, the DPRK is prepared to resume talks with the Republic of Korea and to implement fully the North-South Declaration on Denuclearization.

Other important issues remain to be resolved. Both sides agree that expert-level meetings are necessary to discuss the replacement of the DPRK's graphite-moderated program with LWR technology and the disposition of spent fuel. Accordingly, both sides have agreed to recess the talks so that expert-level meetings can be held in the U.S. and the DPRK. The DPRK and U.S. will resume their talks in Geneva in September 1994 at a mutually agreed time.

Assistant Secretary Robert Gallucci's comments to the press at 8:45 p.m. on Monday, August 8, at the DPRK Mission in Geneva.

(Begin transcript) We usually start our comments after our meetings by indicating how many hours we have met. I believe it was about nine hours today that we met, counting the lunch period when we lunched together and continued our conversations. Today, I would characterize our talks again as detailed, business-like and would say they were useful.

On Friday I would note that the United States came to Geneva with some detailed proposals and a presentation. After that session you will recall we decided to take the weekend off to give an opportunity for the DPRK particularly to take account of the presentation that we had made, for all of us to think about the comments each side had made.

This morning we began and the DPRK presented a detailed proposal of its own. We spent the day discussing that proposal. We are going to take tomorrow for essentially the same reason that we took the weekend off, and that is to consult with capitols. We plan on meeting again on Wednesday morning at 10:00 o'clock at the U.S. Mission. I would say today that we made some progress on some of the issues outstanding between us, but of course there are many issues -- many complicated issues -- yet to be resolved. We have certainly a ways to go. Ladies and gentlemen, I will stand for a few questions.

Q. ...spent fuel?

A. I said that there are many complicated issues, and certainly spent fuel is one of those issues. There are many others. I don't think it is going to be useful for me to talk about areas in which there is no progress, and areas which we didn't go into specific details of negotiations. The negotiations are ongoing, so I am going to ask you to understand that there are some details I am not going to go into.

Q. How long will you negotiate?

A. We didn't actually determine that today. I think on Wednesday we will be talking not only about the substance of the proposals that were made by us on Friday and by the DPRK today but also how we will proceed after Wednesday. All I can tell you at this point

is that we will meet on Wednesday.

Q. Anything new in their proposal?

A. The DPRK made new proposals today just as we came to Geneva with new proposals of our own, and we need to do some studying of those proposals.

Q. Jeff Smith of the Washington Post. Did you find anything in the DPRK's proposals this morning to compensate, and did you make any progress on the light-water reactor question?

A. We found the DPRK's proposals interesting, requiring -- certainly worthy of -- study and consideration, and we're going to do that. On the issues that we dealt with today, the light water reactor issue wasn't the only issue, but it was one we dealt with.

Q. Proposal or proposals?

A. I didn't mean anything significant by the singular. We came with some ideas. The DPRK came today with some ideas. You could call them proposals, as you will.

Q. A set of proposals?

A. You like a set of proposals, you can call them a set of proposals, but I like proposal myself.

Q. On Wednesday are you going to make new proposals?

A. I think one of the things we will do tomorrow is to figure out again in consultation with capitols how we will respond on Wednesday.

Q. Whole settlement or one issue?

A. Many of the issues were contained in our initial proposal on Friday, and many of the issues were contained in the set of ideas put forward today by the DPRK. Not all are completely comprehensive.

KANG - August 8 - Geneva

Ladies and Gentlemen, I am sorry that I had to keep you waiting such a long time. In fact, throughout the day, we have had (inaudible) and complicated work. On Friday, last week, we got the proposals from the United States, and afterwards we studied the American proposals and on the basis of deep study of the American proposals, we on Monday, today, made our own proposals to the American delegation. And we made important proposals with regard to our effort to resolve the nuclear issue. Our discussion for Monday has been so detailed, and so serious that we have to take up nine hours for our discussions.

Despite many hours of discussions today on Monday, of course there are many points on which still the two sides have different views, but on the other hand there are certain points on which we share together.

And the U.S. delegation at today's discussion said that they will carefully and closely examine and study the proposals coming from the DPRK delegation, and we agreed that we meet again on Wednesday morning at 10 A.M. at the U.S. Mission. So I think this concludes the outline of our discussions today.

Q. Was there any proposal regarding steel rods?

In fact, at the moment, and so far, we have been so upset ... (inaudible) ... over suspicions about our own nuclear activities. This base of suspicion is concentrated on the graphite moderated reactor power plant we have built in the DPRK by ourselves. That in order to address and adequately remove such suspicions about our nuclear program, we intend to freeze our system of graphite moderated reactors.

But I want to make it quite clear that we will be prepared to freeze the system of graphite moderated reactor power plant in the DPRK provided that we be given actually and technically the light water reactor power plant system. And we want to receive a few and proper and appropriate compensations for the freeze we have proposed to impose on the construction of the graphite moderated reactor power plants which are still under construction. This is most reasonable and justifiable demand on the part of the DPRK. However, there are other complications, and complicated issues with respect to our proposal to freeze our nuclear activities and also with respect to the provision of light water power reactor plants. And that is the reason why our discussion has been so serious and very intensive, which also required many hours of discussions.

At today's discussion we advanced proposals with respect to the spent fuel rods, the spent fuel rods that can be adapted and treated in such a way that can make the international community feel easy about it.

Q. Inaudible

We are still in the middle of the talks with the United States,

therefore I cannot disclose the details about the compensation.

We have proposed, and we have the proper way to deal with the spent fuel rods from the five megawatt reactor, and the way that we do will certainly ease the concerns of the international community.

We have proposed these ways and still the both sides are discussing both of these ways, so I cannot at the moment tell you all the details.

Q. Inaudible

About the specific technical ways on prolonging the life of the spent fuel rods in the ponds at the moment, I think that we are still talking about that, and we are trying to near an agreement on that particular point, but however I cannot tell any details about that, still we are engaged in detailed discussions about that.

About the details you would be interested in, I think we would let you know at the end of our discussions.

(inaudible) ... that question is still under discussion with the American delegation.

When we have the further discussions on Wednesday, then we can see whether we can have good possibility of a breakthrough.

Geneva, August 12, 1994

The delegations of the United States of America (U.S.) and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) met in Geneva from August 5-12, 1994, to resume the third round of talks.

Both sides reaffirmed the principles of the June 11, 1993, U.S.-DPRK joint statement and reached agreement that the following elements should be part of a final resolution of the nuclear issue:

(1) The DPRK is prepared to replace its graphite-moderated reactors and related facilities with light water reactor (LWR) power plants, and the U.S. is prepared to make arrangements for the provision of LWRs of approximately 2,000 MW(e) to the DPRK as early as possible and to make arrangements for interim energy alternatives to the DPRK's graphite-moderated reactors. Upon receipt of U.S. assurances for the provision of LWRs and for arrangements for interim energy alternatives, the DPRK will freeze construction of the 50 MW(e) and 200 MW(e) reactors, forego reprocessing, and seal the Radiochemical Laboratory, to be monitored by the IAEA.

(2) The U.S. and the DPRK are prepared to establish diplomatic representation in each other's capitals and to reduce barriers to trade and investment, as a move toward full normalization of political and economic relations.

(3) To help achieve peace and security on a nuclear-free Korean Peninsula, the U.S. is prepared to provide the DPRK with assurances against the threat or use of nuclear weapons by the U.S., and the DPRK remains prepared to implement the North-South Joint Declaration on the Denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula.

(4) The DPRK is prepared to remain a party to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and to allow implementation of its safeguards agreement under the Treaty.

Important issues raised during the talks remain to be resolved. Both sides agree that expert-level discussions are necessary to advance the replacement of the DPRK's graphite-moderated program with LWR technology, the safe storage and disposition of the spent fuel, provision of alternative energy, and the establishment of liaison offices. Accordingly, expert-level talks will be held in the U.S. and

DPRK or elsewhere as agreed. The DPRK and U.S. agreed to recess their talks and resume in Geneva on September 23, 1994.

In the meantime, the U.S. will pursue arrangements necessary to provide assurances for the LWR project to the DPRK as part of a final resolution of the nuclear issue, and the DPRK will observe the freeze on nuclear activities and maintain the continuity of safeguards, as agreed in the June 20-22, 1994, exchange of messages between Assistant Secretary of State Robert L. Gallucci and First Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs Kang Sok Ju.
