RE: CHANGES IN ROK STATEMENT AND PRESS GUIDANCE ON T/S '94

We have made the following changes in our statement and press guidance on the suspension of Team Spirit '94.

Changes in the Statement on the Suspension of Team Spirit '94:

- * In the third paragraph, the phrase *with the expectation* has been replaced with the phrase *on the premise*.
- * The entire fourth paragraph has been deleted.

Changes in the ROK Press Guidance for the Announcement of the Suspension of Team Spirit '94:

- * In the Answer to Question #3, the final sentence beginning *The implementation of* has been deleted.
- * The Answer to Question #5 has been entirely rewritten and should read: When Team Spirit is actually suspended, we have no combined exercise planned which will replicate the Team Spirit exercise. However, we will continue to conduct other existing combined exercises.
- * The Answer to Question #6 has been entirely rewritten and should read: We can consider the permanent suspension of Team Spirit when there is substantial improvement in South-North relations through military confidence-building measures and when North Korea gives up its nuclear development programs and abandons its ambition to communize the whole peninsula. However, even if the threat from the North diminishes, we need to conduct combined exercises as long as the Republic of Korea and the U.S. remain allies. As the degree of the threat from the North diminishes, the character of such exercises may change.

Statement on the Suspension of Team Spirit '94
(unofficial translation)

The Korean Government has seriously studied the question of conducting Team Spirit '94, while assessing the security situation on the Korean Peninsula through close consultation with the government of the United States.

Recently, progress has been achieved on the process of resolving the North Korean nuclear question, as North Korea has agreed to accept the inspection activities which were requested by the IAEA in the seven declared nuclear facilities. North Korea has also agreed to resume working-level contacts in order to discuss the exchange of special envoys between South and North Korea.

In view of this progress, the governments of the Republic of Korea and the United States have decided to suspend Team Spirit '94, on the premise that IAEA inspections of the North Korean nuclear facilities will be successfully concluded and that substantive discussions towards the resolution of the North Korean nuclear question will be undertaken through the exchange of special envoys between South and North Korea.

**REPUBLIC OF KOREA PRESS GUIDANCE FOR THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE
SUSPENSION OF THE '94 TEAM SPIRIT EXERCISE**

I. The ROK Government's Position on the Team Spirit Exercise:

- A. The Team Spirit Exercise, as the backbone of the Korea-U.S. combined defense posture, is essential to our security.
 - 1. This exercise is of a purely defensive nature designed to deal with the North Korean military threat.
 - 2. As long as the Korea-U.S. combined defensive system remains in place, this exercise remains a crucial element of it.
- B. Our position, however, has been that we can be flexible in considering the suspension of Team Spirit once North Korea demonstrates a positive attitude in the resolution of the nuclear issue. We have taken this position in hopes that a decision to suspend Team Spirit will contribute towards furthering a positive North Korean attitude on the nuclear issue.

II. Background for the Suspension of Team Spirit '94:

- A. At the ROK-U.S. summit meeting in November 1993, the two presidents came to a mutual understanding on the Team Spirit issue. They agreed that if North Korea accepts IAEA inspections and responds favorably to the South-North Dialogue, the ROK and the U.S. will consult on whether or not to conduct Team Spirit in 1994, taking into account the prevailing security situation on the Korean Peninsula at that time. The two presidents also agreed that the final decision regarding this matter will be made by the Korean side.
- B. More immediately, on February 15, 1994, at the North Korea-IAEA meeting, North Korea agreed to accept the inspections required by the IAEA on all seven declared nuclear facilities. Those inspections have just begun. The South-North working-level talks to arrange special envoys have also begun today.
- C. Therefore, today's announcement of the suspension of Team Spirit '94 is a result of the ROK-U.S. mutual understanding on the issue. President Kim made his final determination on the issue in accord with the ROK-U.S. mutual understanding and with a view to

resolving the North Korean nuclear issue as soon as possible and consolidating peace on the Korean peninsula.

III. Questions & Answers Guidance

1. Q: You said that you have decided not to conduct Team Spirit this year with the expectation of substantive discussions between South and North Korea. What do you mean by "expectation"?

A: "Expectation" means that, in order for the suspension of the Team Spirit exercise for this year to be finalized, the IAEA inspections should be satisfactorily completed, and there should be substantive discussions on the resolution of the nuclear issue through the exchange of special envoys between South and North Korea.

2. Q: What do you mean by the expression "IAEA inspections should be satisfactorily completed"?

A: First and foremost, the judgment as to whether the inspections have been satisfactorily completed is to be made by the IAEA, which is the inspecting party. Secondly, we believe that the IAEA inspection team, during its stay in North Korea, should be allowed to conduct all the required inspection activities with no hindrances. Finally, the inspection results should be acceptable not only to the IAEA but also to the entire international community.

3. Q: What do you mean when you say that there should be substantive discussions on the resolution of the nuclear issue through the exchange of special envoys?

A: The mere exchange of special envoys is not sufficient. When the envoys are exchanged, substantive consultations on how to resolve the nuclear issue should occur.

4. Q: If you are not happy with the results of the IAEA inspections and/or the exchange of special envoys between South and North Korea does not smoothly occur, then will your government conduct Team Spirit this year?

A: As was noted in our announcement, if such conditions are not fulfilled, we will reconsider our decision to suspend Team Spirit. We hope, though, that such a situation will not occur.

5. Q: With the suspension of Team Spirit, do you plan other combined exercises in Team Spirit's place?

A: When Team Spirit is actually suspended, we have no combined exercise planned which will replicate the Team Spirit exercise. However, we will continue to conduct other existing combined exercises.

6. Q: We expect that, at the third round of U.S.-DPRK talks, the question of the permanent suspension of Team Spirit will be raised. What is your government's position on this question?

A: We can consider the permanent suspension of Team Spirit when there is substantial improvement in South-North relations through military confidence-building measures and when North Korea gives up its nuclear development programs and abandons its ambition to communize the whole peninsula. However, even if the threat from the North diminishes, we need to conduct combined exercises as long as the Republic of Korea and the U.S. remain allies. As the degree of the threat from the North diminishes, the character of such exercises may change.
