DONOR ASSISTANCE STRATEGY FOR BOSNIA

The lack of adequate donor assistance continues to hinder successful civilian implementation of Dayton. We are particularly concerned about the slow pace of economic reconstruction. Despite significant donor commitments, only about \$15-30 million has actually been delivered thus far, and with little accompanying PR. Other important programs on which the U.S. has taken a leadership role--elections, UN police, train and equip, and demining--are also at risk due to insufficient funding.

In the critical period leading up to elections in August, we need to ensure that the maximum amount of assistance is delivered to advance our objectives in these key areas. This will require U.S. leadership in providing funding, in working to ensure others contribute, and, finally, in ensuring that the overall effort is properly coordinated. Special attention must be given to coordinating on reconstruction with the World Bank, High Representative and influential donor governments.

Coordination on Reconstruction Assistance

Coordination is proceeding fitfully and lacks political leadership. World Bank technical expertise and the various donors meetings have helped to identify projects and generate pledges. But coordination efforts have had only limited success thus far in linking financial commitments to the specific reconstruction priorities. And they have not generated pressure at high levels on governments to meet commitments. The Sarajevo task forces, in particular, must provide more frequent and more effective donor coordination.

The central role of the World Bank in coordinating reconstruction assistance should continue. But the High Representative's Office should exert more political leadership in pushing donors to act and in helping the World Bank and donors better assess the political impact of reconstruction projects. This would include visits by the High Rep to Washington (for discussions with the World Bank) and to other capitals to drum up financial support. The World Bank, the European Commission (EC), and High Rep's Office must also work more closely to get the task forces moving. U.S. representatives should discuss possible gameplans with Bildt, the World Bank, and the Commission on a regular basis.

U.S., European and World Bank Achievements

Since Dayton, the U.S. Government has dispersed or obligated almost all of the President's \$85.7 million "quick impact" assistance. This included \$73 million for humanitarian activities and \$12.7 million for reconstruction (Attachment A.) Of the additional \$50 million from SEED pledged at Brussels December 21 (for total reconstruction assistance of \$62.7 million), \$32 million, largely for fast-impact municipal rehabilitation, privatization and enterprise restructuring, has been notified to Congress. Results should be noticeable by June if Congress does not further delay disbursements with holds.

The EC has signed agreements to disburse a \$80 million tranche of reconstruction assistance, and is expected to pledge an additional \$200 million at the April Conference. Several member states (Netherlands) have provided first quarter assistance, but others (Germany, France and the UK) have been slower. EC reps have asked that the U.S. push them.

By March 28, the World Bank expects to have approved four sector projects totaling \$420 million (\$120 million of Bank funds and \$300 million from donor governments--the Bank's highest priority is to secure that co-financing). A \$90-million Structural Adjustment Credit (SAC) is also under consideration. Disbursement from the \$160 million Emergency Recovery Project approved in February will begin soon. Bosnia will become a member of the Bank as soon as it accepts the arrears plan approved at the March 14 Board meeting.

Rollout of Assistance over the Next Three Months

A large-scale rollout of reconstruction assistance is possible over the next three months if the U.S. and other donors can resolve funding issues and World Bank projects receive the required parallel financing. AID believes it can obligate and begin disbursing \$50 million of the \$145 million supplemental for infrastructure and small business lending within 60 days of Congressional approval. This would be on top of an additional \$25 million for municipal rehabilitation and shelter that AID expects to roll out in April-May. Until we have a clearer picture on the supplemental's timing, however, we will need to hold back obligating the remainder of the package. (A substantial portion is for technical assistance. If the supplemental fails or is delayed, we would want to reconsider the heavy commitment for technical assistance in this package.)

Other donor assistance will accelerate in the next three months, including higher levels of activity from the EU's obligation of its initial \$80 million and commitments from the additional \$200 million to be pledged in April.

Treasury believes that \$60-150 million in World Bank funds could be disbursed by the end of September under the various loan programs now in the pipeline. The speed and level of disbursement will depend on a number of factors, including Bosnia's acceptance of the proposed arrears plan, other donor commitments to parallel financing and the Bosnian Federation's readiness to implement policy and institution-building reforms. Within the next three months, Bosnia should have access at a minimum to \$43 million (including donor and Bosnian funds) of the \$160 million Emergency Recovery Project for critical imports.

Bank staff caution that procurement of infrastructure services and imports is particularly time sensitive. If procurement is delayed beyond May, Bank staff do not believe that infrastructure repairs can be completed in the 1996 construction season, underscoring the need for urgency.

Other Priorities: Elections, Police, Train/Equip and Demining

We are beginning to see progress on all these programs but more donor support is needed to ensure successful implementation. The OSCE is taking the lead on mobilizing funds for elections assistance but commitments to date are inadequate to carry out the kind of intensive assistance the U.S. believes is necessary. On train and equip, we have gotten the attention of several potential donors and succeeded in encouraging broad attendance at the Ankara pledging conference on March 15. However, we still have not obtained firm cash commitments needed to begin the \$200 million training program.

Over 500 police monitors, including 33 U.S. officers, are now deployed in the International Police Task Force. Operations are still hampered by the lack of qualified monitors. OECD governments should provide another 500-600 high-caliber officers. The Mine Action Center has opened and a demining plan has been approved. An additional \$20 million in bilateral aid is required to begin large-scale operations.

Targeting Donors

We have repeatedly appealed to 40-50 potential donor countries on reconstruction and other U.S. funding priorities. We now must re-target a small number of key countries to make new contributions and influence others. The following countries were selected because they have not made sufficient commitments and have the capability to do more given their foreign policy interests in Bosnia and the NATO mission: Canada, the UK, France, Netherlands, Germany, Spain, Italy, Austria, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, UAE, Australia, Malaysia, Korea, Japan and Brunei.

New Round of Appeals

The next round has to be at the most senior levels, involving the President, cabinet-level officials and U.S. military commanders, with messages tailored to country-specific circumstances. We should also consider sending high-level delegations to several key donors. In our presentations, we should be as explicit as possible in defining the amounts and kinds of assistance expected in all five areas (see Attachments B and C). We should also stress the importance of having as much assistance as possible disbursed on high-visibility projects before the elections.

To have maximum impact, our messages should be tied to action-forcing events (Attachment D). In particular, we will want to ensure that the donations made at the April 12-13 ministerial-level donors' meeting are adequate to make this conference a success.

Public Relations

We must communicate progress on economic reconstruction and activities underway to both the U.S. media and other opinion molders and the general public here and in Bosnia. While economic reconstruction has been slower than other aspects of implementation, this was anticipated by the World Bank and other donors. There are also a number of successes to report.

S/AL's public affairs advisor has just returned from Bosnia where she has been assessing public relations needs. The interagency PA working group will meet to develop a public affairs strategy aimed at both Bosnian and international publics, the Congress, and the press, integrated into our overall media strategy (e.g., election run-up).

ATTACHMENT ASIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS OF \$85 MILLION
"QUICK IMPACT" PROGRAM

Food Aid Began providing emergency food aid totalling 93,000 metric tons to 1.9 million Bosnians. Reopened bakery that will serve Sarajevo, Tuzla and other cities (over 100,000,000 loaves of bread produced). Provided funds to feed 60,000 elderly citizens in Tuzla and Zenica.

Food Production Funded supplies to resume agriculture planting, livestock production and food processing. Will benefit 250,000 people in Sarajevo, Tuzla, Zenica and Mostar.

Clothing Funded project to produce 15,000 winter coats for children in Sarajevo and Gorazde.

Heating Completed rebuilding 17 of 23 boiler houses in the Sarajevo gas system and replaced 6,000 residence gas connections. Over 120,000 residents benefitted.

Water Systems Repaired water pumps and equipment in Sarajevo, restoring regular water service to 180,000 residents.

Reconstruction Signed agreement with contractor to begin mass replacement of glass in Sarajevo homes and business (over 752,000 square feet in 6 months). Projects on residential building repairs also underway in Sarajevo suburb of Dobrinja and multi-ethnic town of Busovaca.

Hospital Repairs Completed repairs on hospitals in Sarajevo, including major winterization work, and begun repairs on health facilities in two towns.

Road Work Replaced road signs in Tuzla and set plans for repaving roads in spring.

School Repairs Began project to renovate elementary schools in Bihac area (e.g., fix pipes, windows and heating).

Radio Station Repaired radio station "Kameleon" in Tuzla region. Station operates 24 hours a day and broadcasts VOA, RFE and local public service programs.

PROPOSED FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS ON DONOR COORDINATION

The following actions are proposed to implement a targeted donor strategy for the next month:

- At the March 23 Contact Group Meeting, we should press participants on contributions and their own efforts to lobby other donors.
- Depending on status of train-and-equip commitments after the March 15 Ankara Meeting, consider calls by the Secretary of Defense, Secretary of State and NSC Advisor to their counterparts on the target donor list to solicit support.
- JCS Chairman (and possibly other military commanders) make appeals on demining support to counterparts of other IFOR military forces.
- Assuming Congressional approval of the \$200 million Bosnia package, in anticipation of the April 12-13 ministerial-level economic reconstruction donors' conference, the President should send a letter (or make phone calls) to the heads of state of targeted countries requesting their support for reconstruction aid and, as appropriate, other programs.
- Step up U.S. contacts with High Rep Bildt, the World Bank and the EU Commission on assistance coordination. Use opportunity of Bildt's April 1-2 visit to Washington and New York to foster improved coordination.
