SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR DOCUMENTS

We have received a request for documents relating to ten export licenses granted to McDonnell Douglas and Douglas Aircraft on September 14, 1994 permitting them to export machinery used in the manufacturing of aerospace products for use by a People's Republic of China owned company called China National Aero-Technology Import and Export Corporation (CATIC). The request is also for documents relating to a 1992 contract between McDonnell Douglas and CATIC for the manufacture of commercial aircraft in China (the "trunkline contract") as well as for documents relating to the CATIC Machining Center in Beijing, China. This request is limited to documents generated in the time period from and including October 1992 through and including December 1995.

Accordingly, please conduct a thorough and complete search of all of your records -- whether in hard copy, computer form or any other form -- for materials that relate to or discuss:

1. **Ten export licenses granted to McDonnell Douglas and Douglas Aircraft by the Department of Commerce on September 14, 1994 permitting them to export machinery from their plant in Columbus, Ohio to the People's Republic of China for use by CATIC. The applications for these export licenses were submitted to the Department of Commerce on May 25, 1994;**
2. **A 1992 contract between McDonnell Douglas and CATIC for the manufacture of commercial aircraft in Beijing (the "trunkline contract"); and**
3. **The CATIC Machining Center in Beijing.**

Every employee is responsible for searching his or her own files and records to ensure a comprehensive search. Each office head or Assistant to the President must certify that his or her staff has done a complete and thorough search.

In addition, if you believe that files from your office that have been archived or sent to the Office of Records Management may contain responsive information, please advise us so that we may ensure that all responsive documents have been located.

All materials must be provided to Associate Counsel to the President Lisa Klem in EEOB Room 482 by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 12, 2000. If you have any questions, please contact Lisa Klem at 6-7804.

when Clinton decided to choose Gore, since I had worked for both of them, I was given the task of staying up all night to draft statements for both of them.

And then I went on all the bus trips, so I saw the friendship bloom. And Roy Neal had a great line that was in (Inaudible) but from that summer, where he talked about how they were like two men who'd been in the same class at college and met each other at the 25th reunion and discovered, even though they hadn't known each other before, that they really clicked, and their families clicked.

he was, you know, in many respects, a ^{good soldier;} Southern gentleman, had a respect for order and authority, and you know, when his country called, he answered. That's been kind of the story of his life.

in some ways, it took its natural course, because the Vice-President was especially interested in a number of areas where the President ~~didn't know as much~~ had an interest, but not the level of expertise. So national security and foreign policy was a natural area for the (Inaudible) role, and Clinton relied on him from the get-go. (Inaudible) Earth In The Balance, and actually a few -- The first interaction between the two in the presidential campaign was in April of that year, when Clinton gave a birthday speech at (Inaudible) in Philadelphia. And he wanted to run the speech by Gore, so we faxed a draft of the speech and I called Gore and got his (Inaudible). So I think Clinton deferred to Gore on environmental issues from then (Inaudible). And Gore had a number of enthusiasms about science and technology and other things that were natural places for him to make his (Inaudible). So in essence, the division of labor was almost apparent from the beginning, now, you know, as time went on, once they were in office, Vice-President (Inaudible). I think the main arrangements from the -- What Gore insisted on -- wisely insisted on from the start -- was that he be treated as a partner. And so he made sure that (Inaudible) was established in Little Rock, ^{to make} made sure that the campaign didn't forget that they had a vice-presidential (Laughs) candidate.

And then the bus trips were extremely important in both forging a personal bond, but also starting a conversation about issues. And so I think they spent a lot of time on the bus talking about what they wanted to do, how they wanted this to work, and the typical tensions that have been apparent in previous tickets didn't emerge, because they were together much of the time, they could talk directly to one another, instead of reading about each other in the press; they were having fun, things were going well, we were winning. And every time Gore did something (Inaudible) Clinton's reaction was, wasn't that a great choice I made? (Laughs) So rather than being threatened by Gore's strengths, he took it as a sign that he'd done the right thing. You can see Gore on the stump with Lieberman, having that same reaction today.

The Vice-President insisted early on that he come to all the key meetings. He was there from the beginning in the transition in Little Rock, helping pick the cabinet, helping to make sure that he had a say in the jobs that he especially cared about. When they put together the economic plan, starting right after we got here, the Vice-President was in on every decision. He arranged his schedule to make sure that every time there was an important meeting with the President, he was there, across the table from him in the cabinet room. And they started having lunch together regularly. (Inaudible) was a chance for them to talk about policy; it was a good chance for the Vice-President to put issues on the President's radar screen. (Inaudible) gotten there. And people -- There was a kind of steady, as you say, merging of the staff. Roy Neal moved over from being his chief of staff to being the President's deputy chief of staff. Jack Quinn went from being his chief of staff to being counsel.

The telecommunications bill, which played such a role in building the new economy, was entirely his baby. I think (Inaudible) that the human genome project, a bunch of other scientific and technological areas where we've made a lot of headway, they're still not, in some ways, considered mainstream political issues, even though they're going to be -- they will become (Inaudible). And then there are just a host of areas where his voice was a swing voice with any administration within the.

(Welfare reform) I had led the pro side of the debate and (Inaudible) Oval Office. So (Inaudible) Leon Pinetta was making the arguments against. And finally, the President turned to the Vice-President and

said, ~~you know~~, what do you think we should do? (Inaudible) ~~and~~ The Vice--President paused because, I think, like all of us, he recognized that this was a historically important decision for the President; ~~the President should make (Inaudible)~~. But then he said, ~~you know~~, on balance, he ~~talked~~ that what the Welfare Reform Bill would do ~~to~~ reform the welfare system outweighed the risks of (Inaudible). And the President thought about it for a couple more minutes and then said, let's do it, (Inaudible). ~~And that scene was replayed a number of times on a number of other issues; that's just one that I was a close witness to.~~ "when the budget." The President used the State of the Union as his organizing blueprint for each year,

I want to sign it.

But the Vice--President always came in with a list of priorities, and generally prevailed. And the things that spring to mind that he fought the hardest for -- he was one of the first to push for after-school funding, which is now the (Inaudible) fastest-growing program in the federal budget. It was \$1 million a year in 1997; \$453 million last year, and we've asked for a billion dollars this year, which would end up (Inaudible). He was the decisive voice for (Inaudible) was familiar with class size reduction, because Tennessee was one of the states that had done it (Inaudible) January of '98.

almost from the beginning of '95, (Inaudible) President and the Vice--President wanted to figure out a way to propose a balanced budget, to get back on the offensive and find a way to stop the Contract With America. And for months, the budget team (Inaudible). But I saw them in a number of budget meetings, where they just -- you know, they weren't sure they were going to be able to convince their own people to do it, but they knew that it was the right thing to do in order to get control. And eventually, by summer, they prevailed and persuaded the (Inaudible) seven-year budget. And I don't think, ~~you know~~, the President could've done that on his own; it would be -- (Inaudible) to underestimate how difficult it is to get things done all by yourself in the administration.
