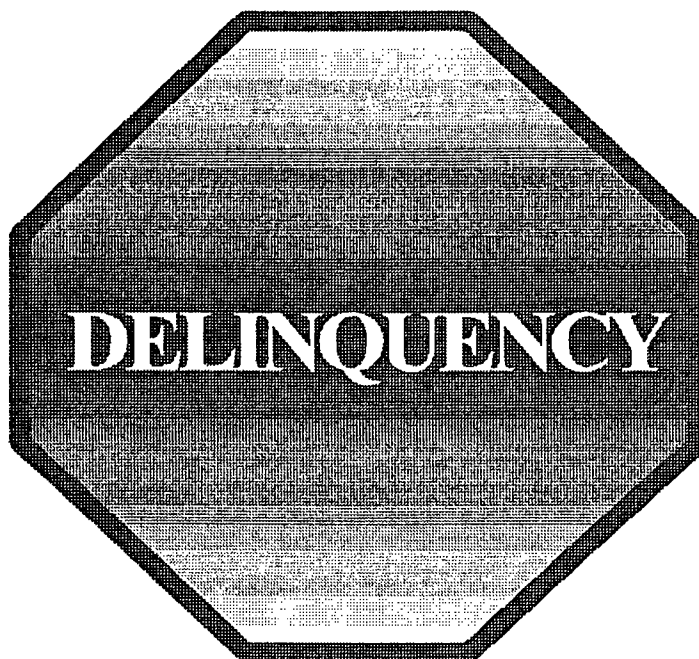

Clinton Presidential Records Digital Records Marker

HOW TO SUBSCRIBE TO JUV JUST

OJJDP invites you to join with us electronically. We recognize that, like us, many of you are new to this arena. OJJDP and the National Criminal Justice Reference Service (NCJRS) are pleased to announce JUV JUST, our newest service for the juvenile justice professional. JUV JUST is an electronic mailing list that will allow you to receive timely and informative juvenile justice information directly from OJJDP.

There is no cost to participate in JUV JUST, although users must have access to Internet E-mail. Please take a moment and subscribe to this service by following these simple steps:

- Send an E-mail message to *listproc@aspensys.com*
- Leave the subject line blank
- In the body of the message, type:
 "subscribe juvjust your name"
 (For example: subscribe juvjust john doe)

It is that simple! For the more adventurous, the **ACCESSING NATIONAL CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFERENCE SERVICE ONLINE CARD** is attached. This card provides easy-to-follow instructions to access the **INTERNET** and the **NCJRS BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEM (NCJRS*BBS)**. JUV JUST will occasionally direct you to these services. Accessing National Criminal Justice Reference Service Online NCJRS Bulletin Board System (NCJRS*BBS)



The NCJRS*BBS provides a wealth of information and publications from the five Office of Justice Programs agencies (see other side of card), the Office for National Drug Control Policy, and NCJRS free of charge.

Access Protocols

- **ASCII:** Text of press releases, publications, and other information can be downloaded in ASCII text to any personal computer.
- **Acrobat™ *:** Many OJP publications are available in Acrobat format that allows full text and graphics—including charts and photographs in color—to be downloaded. Acrobat Reader software allows users on any computer platform to print publications.
- **Acrobat Reader software.** This software is available at no cost to Internet users; access using the ftp address: <ftp.adobe.com>.
- **Graphical User interface.** This graphic interface for the NCJRS*BBS is available for Windows users. The necessary file—[guizip.exe](#)—is available on the Anonymous NCJRS FTP site and on the NCJRS*BBS.

To Access the NCJRS*BBS

- **If you do not have Internet access:**
Direct dial through your modem: **(301) 738-8895**.
Modems should be set at 9600 baud and 8-N-1.

- **If you have Internet access:**

Telnet to: <ncjrsbbs.aspensys.com> —Or—
Gopher to: <ncjrs.aspensys.com> 71

Then register with NCJRS*BBS

- **Type:** *ncjrs* at the initial login prompt.
- System asks if you are a new user. If so, **answer yes** and respond to the registration questions on the screen.
- System then asks you to create a user ID and password. **Type:** *your user ID (e.g., your name)*.
- System prompts you to enter your password. **Type:** *your password*.

Note: You will use this user ID and password each time you connect with NCJRS*BBS.

Then download the Acrobat Reader for Windows and GUI.

To obtain either or both the Acrobat Reader for Windows and the Graphical User Interface (GUI), **select: "Using the new NCJRS*BBS"** menu from the main NCJRS*BBS menu. Then **select: "Acrobat Reader Software"** or **"Graphical User Interface."** Then **select: "About the Acrobat Reader"** or **"About Graphical User Interface,"** which will provide detailed instructions for downloading.

Note: Internet users can obtain the Acrobat Reader for other platforms; use the ftp address: <ftp.adobe.com>.

NCJRS World Wide Web

This service provides a graphical interface to NCJRS information as well as to information from other criminal justice resources around the world. The address for the NCJRS WWW is: <http://ncjrs.aspensys.com:81/ncjrshome.html>

NCJRS Anonymous FTP

When you connect to the NCJRS Anonymous FTP site, you can download full text publications and software. To access:

1. **Type:** *ftp ncjrs.aspensys.com*. System displays a login prompt.
2. **Type:** *anonymous*. System prompts you for your password.

3. **Type:** *your e-mail address:*

(e.g., *jdoe@aol.com*). System displays ftp>

4. **Type:** *cd pub/ncjrs* to change the directory.

5. **Type:** *get README.NCJRS* to download this file that will describe all the documents available at the FTP site or **type:** *ls* to see a list of the files.
