Your message of July 8 discussed several items which I am working on; below is a status report of each.

1. Personnel:

b. As you know, I am working on position descriptions, but that priority moves from top to bottom on a daily basis. What I'm concentrating on right now are performance standards which must be done immediately. These standards must reflect what the person is actually doing in conjunction with their current position description. I will be rewriting position descriptions for Ann and Brad first; Brad's is current, but we want to add Africa. Ann's needs a complete rewrite. When I'm finished with performance standards for Brad and Ann, and new position descriptions for them, I will write standards for Tyler, review Larry's and write a position description for Sandy. I will remind the Advisors that I'm still looking for input for their positions. Do you want something like I did for Joe when I prepared the request for candidates package?

c. The only two possibilities I can think of for space for Brooke Shearer is across from Joe's office where we recently set up a work station, or in our 490 office which could be rearranged to accommodate another desk. Although there are four desks there, usually we have two people in that office at the most.

2. Training

a. My training form has been faxed to Richmond and sent to OSD for approval. I talked to OSD training and was told there would be no problem. I won't know if I'm in the class in Richmond for a while though; it's a very popular course and fills up quickly.

Talbott Pass: White House Security has agreed to place him on permanent access which will include the OEOB as well as the West Wing. This will be effective Monday. If for some reason he encounters any problems, the people that have been involved in getting him on are Craig Livingstone, White House Security, and Nancy Hernreich.

Vouchers: You are correct in pointing out that the delays are not because of inaction in this office. A quick review of your travel file indicates Bronya processed all of your vouchers on the average within a week to ten days after her receiving them. Not a bad turnaround time on our part considering she is only one person and our travel workload has increased substantially.

However let me give you a quick analysis of your travel voucher woes.

Your August voucher has been delayed this long because there was a misunderstanding as to what the Aspen Institute would pay for the trip and what the NSC responsibility would be. This has been rectified and you will be receiving a voucher to cover per diem for meal expenses. (Approx \$38.00 x 4 days). The point in my bringing up the August voucher is to show that the backlog does not go as far back as August. That voucher was screwed up from the start.

Let's deal with your two Sept. vouchers, you traveled Sept 8 thru Sept 17. We received that voucher on October 1. (a delay of approx 3 weeks before it got to us. Your other Sept voucher (travel dates of Sept 26 -29) was sent to Bronya on October 6. Both vouchers were sent to Financial Management by late October by us.

Your October vouchers (two) were processed as follows: You travelled Oct 18-27 and you submitted the voucher on November 4. we sent the voucher to FMD November 22. The second voucher you travelled Oct 7-8. The Voucher came to us on Oct 15 and we sent it on to FMD by November 9.

We are told by FMD that they are processing all of the vouchers received in late October and early November and that payments will be issued within the next 5 to ten days. All of your vouchers, with the exception of the August voucher are in this batch so the checks should be in the mail relatively soon.

Why does this happen? FMD took a big hit in the 25% reduction of staffing and it shows.

Can we do things differently so that travellers are not subsidizing the USG? Yes, if our people know with some anticipation about a trip, let's say two week in advance, we can request a check for a larger advance and cut the cost that people would have to put on their personal credit cards.

The other option is to issue American Express Travel cards to all NSC staff(similar to the now defunct Diners Club card) and you charge all your travel expenses to this card. The card would also allow you to get a larger travel advance. The drawback is that you will still have to get vouchers in and get paid quickly to avoid American Express from hounding you for delinquent payment.

SUBJ: White House Security

Background: In mid-March, allegations that some White House staff members had not yet received security clearances were confirmed by the White House Press Secretary, who disclosed that she had yet to file her own clearance paperwork. This apparently prompted Congressional inquiries on the subject, including a letter to Jim Woolsey from Sen. Deconcini published in the WSJ. Congressional questions have focused on two issues: access to the NID and other intelligence documents, and White House passes (e.g., are passes issued to persons with BI's pending and the number of permanent and temporary passes issued.)

Because White House Counsel supervises the Office of White House Security and is charged with vetting White House/EOP employees for suitability, Alan and I have assisted the Counsel's office in its effort to draft responses to the Hill on behalf of Patsy Thomasson and Lloyd Cutler, largely by addressing those questions relating to the NSC staff rather than the White House as a whole. Bob Manzanares and Pat Nelson have played an integral role in this process. In addition, two Diplomatic Security Service employees have been loaned to the White House Counsel's office this week to provide a "snap shot" assessment of the situation and to determine if there are, in fact, problems with White House security processes. The DS employees will also provide recommendations on any areas that warrant improvement. There has also been some Hill discussion of a GAO review of WH security.

In addition, at Senator Deconcini's urging, David Watkins and representatives from OA and the White House Counsel's office met with Jim Wolf, Security Director for the SSCI, today. I represented the NSC and provided Wolf with a brief overview of how NSC handles personnel security and classified paper flow. Wolf's attention, however, is on how the other 11 EOP elements handle security. In particular: what level BI is conducted on different classes of employees (e.g., Presidential appointees - volunteers); are employees debriefed when leaving the staff; how is derogatory information handled in BI's; drug testing; and the Secret Service's role in the process. Some of Wolf's questions reflected a lack of understanding about the White House pass system and its distinction from the clearance process.

Issues: Based on their initial interviews, the DS representatives are focusing on two areas: (1) the manner in which badges and clearances are granted and accounted for, and (2) the distribution of classified documents within the

WH/EOP. There may be room for systematic improvement in both areas. First, until recently there did not appear to have been a readily available and precise accounting of who within the White House/EOP had a permanent badge, clearance and codeword access. The badge distinction is important as some EOP staff have relied on possession of a permanent blue pass as evidence of a TS security clearance. In fact, experience has shown that a blue pass does not necessarily confirm the holder has a clearance or SCI access. Badges and clearances are distinct.

Second, in some instances classified documents and information likely have been provided to White House personnel who did not hold appropriate security clearances or SCI access at the time. This may have been done directly by the SitRoom, as in the case of the NID going to a Deputy Chief of Staff without verification that he held a TS/SCI clearance. (At the time he held a TS clearance, but had not yet been read in to SCI.) In other instances information may have been passed from one staff member to another. We are not in a position to assess whether any information has been compromised. However, we have not been made aware of any compromises, nor are we aware that such lapses have occurred on more than a few occasions. We will let you know if the DS review finds otherwise.

David Watkins' assessment of the EOP generally seems a fair one: Security was not as good as it could have been and it was not as bad as reported. The procedures have all improved in the last two months.

NSC Staff Issues: The White House Security "issue" does not appear to be about NSC staff clearances and access. While human errors may have been made with respect to the handling of certain documents (e.g., the stuff of security violations), the NSC staff keeps careful track of the security clearances of NSC employees and detailees. In the case of detailees, clearances are certified from Agencies to Bob Manzanares before an employee is given access to the NSC computer or unrestricted access to office space. Clearances are transmitted from NSC/Admin. to the SitRoom before employees are put on cable or intelligence distribution. If a detailee from an agency needs a TS or SCI clearance, NSC Admin will initiate the clearances on his/her behalf.

In the case of NSC employees hired from the private sector, Bob Manzanares initiates a request for clearance from the FBI. Upon completion of a background investigation, Bob will review the FBI's findings and determine whether a potential employee should be granted a clearance. In the case of close calls involving derogatory information, Bob will consult with Nancy. As a separate matter, CIA determines whether direct hire NSC employees should have access to codeword information. Where such access is denied, an employee may appeal to a CIA panel. If this appeal is denied the employee may not work on the NSC staff; as all NSC employees must hold SCI access.

Please let Alan or me know if you have any questions regarding this information. We will keep you posted on the work of the DS team.
