Brooke - Re the pass. For the NSC to get someone a White House pass, I need to have some paperwork in OA showing that person is an employee. We've had trouble with this in the pass, even when the individual had a need to be in the building frequently. WH security prefers to use the access list to allow entry to this group of people.

However, State can arrange for some of its employee to have White House passes. We understand this has been done, although I am not sure what limitations may exist on State's ability to arrange badges. This is at State's request directly to WH security. Once you end your employment at the NSC, the NSC would no longer "sponsor" your access badge. However, you or your new office at State could contact Craig Livingstone in WH security, justify the need, and with luck keep the pass. Craig's number is (x62345).

Brooke - Will and Andy asked me about your comp time. I repeated what Marsha and I had shared with you so far, and let them know I had directed you to Irene McGowan (x51296) for questions about the policy.

Will also asked about the issue of Ramspect-like entitlements for WH employees. The regulations only apply to people going directly from WH to a competitive position. Since you are going to a Schedule C position, this does not apply. You cannot use your service here now to gain competitive status for future jobs. Will was concerned that you did not understand this. Again, this is something that Irene can give you more info on.

FYI, OA Personnel believes the NSC is not part of the WH for this purpose and that NSC employees do not have this mechanism for competing for jobs. However, it is the employing agency that must make the determination of eligibility. You might ask her to discuss this issue as a hypothetical case, as if you were - in her view - eligible for this.

The law says that anyone working in the EOP for more than 6 months must have had a full BI in the last year. A temporary pass could be issued based on a BI not more than 5 years old. When P6/(b)(6) originally came on board for a short period, a new BI was not necessary. Now, nearly 5 years after his 1990 BI, a new pass would normally be needed to extend his access.

The date of the previous BI was June 14th, 1990. Craig Livingstone, Director of White House Security, is willing to approve continued access through June 15, 1995, and will allow a grace period of NTE two weeks after that date. He has taken into consideration the employee's status as a continuous government employee and the FBI name check. This means that the June 30 date that we were given MUST be Michael's last day here. To stay beyond that date will take a full BI, and would take 2-3 months at a minimum.

Again, we'll check with the badge office in the morning and confirm when the badge is available. jgb

NOTE FOR NANCY

The specific question of sexual preference has not been (or shouldn't have been) asked in a background investigation for years. Investigators do ask the subject and sources if there is anything in the subject's history that could be used to coerce or blackmail him. For someone who is HIDING the fact of his homosexuality, this fact could possibly be used to blackmail him. However, the same could be said of heterosexuals who engage in behavior (e.g. adulterous affairs) they're not anxious to share.

The simple fact that an individual is homosexual cannot be used to deny a security clearance.

I have this information from the FBI. Authority for background investigations apparently comes from OPM and as I mentioned, some agencies have their own investigative bodies. ALthough the method may vary (CIA uses polygraphs, WH uses drug tests), the standards are uniform.

I can pursue the question further but it would be helpful if I had Rep. Frank's specific questions in hand. If you can find it, please send me a copy of his letter. Thanks. jgb

^White House reorganizes personnel security office

WASHINGTON (Reuter) - The White House said Wednesday it would place all personnel security operations under a career civil servant, seeking to quell a scandal over its having obtained confidential FBI files on top Republicans.

The move appeared to be designed to limit the political damage from the White House's having improperly sought and obtained sensitive FBI files on more than 400 people in late 1993 and early 1994.

Charles ``Chuck" Easley, a career civil servant with 12 years experience in Army counterintelligence, will head the new security operation, which had previously been split into three separate offices, the White House said in a statement.

The White House announced the appointment shortly before a congressional committee began hearings into the FBI files affair, which has drawn sharp Republican criticism.

``Whether this was part of a larger pattern of trying to compromise the FBI or part of the all-too-familiar pattern of incompetence and incredibly mismanaged record-keeping at the White House will be the subject of further investigation and hearings," said Republican William Clinger of Pennsylvania, who is chairing the committee looking into the matter.

A 20-year army veteran, Easley is now head of the Security Office of the Executive Office of the President, which evaluates appointments to a group of seven federal agencies that are

directly managed by the White House.

This office will take control of the Office of Personnel Security, which had obtained the FBI files a range of people, including senior Republicans like former Secretary of State James Baker and former White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater. Craig Livingstone, the Democratic political operative who then ran the Office of Personal Security, has been put on paid administrative leave pending investigations into why his office had sought the files and why the FBI provided them.

Easley's operation will also take charge of a separate

office run by the National Security Council, which advises the president on foreign policy, to evaluate those hired to work

there.

The White House sought to paint the reorganization as a long-overdue measure that should have been taken by previous presidents.

"It is clear that the procedures in place for some three decades, through seven administrations, at both the White House and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, were not adequate," said White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta.

"This restructuring ... will ensure that these essential security procedures are carried out efficiently, by career professionals, in a manner that protects individual privacy," Panetta added in a statement laying out the reorganization.

"This is a very sensible way to structure this office, but for 30 years we haven't been doing it this way," added White House spokesman Mike McCurry.

"It's a wonder that it hadn't been developed that way under President Bush, President Reagan, President Carter, President Nixon or under President Ford," he said.

Clinton has described the White House's having sought the files as a "bureaucratic snafu" and denied it was seeking the information for political purposes.

"I would never condone or tolerate any kind of enemies list or anything of that kind," he told reporters last week.

But Clinton's political opponents have been loath to take the president at his word and Bob Dole, the presumptive Republican nominee facing Clinton in the Nov. 5 presidential election, has repeatedly criticized the president over the affair.
