TEXT_BODY The TS clearance generally takes about 120 days from the time FBI starts the case, if there are no issues. Getting the SCI takes another couple of weeks after that. Unfortunately, we have not been allowed to ask FBI directly about any cases ever since Filegate (since this could be construed as undue White House pressure on the security process.) We will get periodic updates from White House security which we can pass along to you.

FBI does White House cases on a priority basis -- clearances for those from other agencies can take up to a year.

I told him to disregard it as we hold his clearances and will do the update here. Called DOD to let them know and will re-contact them at completion of the BI. I checked and he is due, (just over 5 yrs) so I told him I'd send our packet to him. Emphasized and explained that clearances don't expire, and we'll take care of the update for him. I may even take a walk over to his office, show and explain the package for his assistant.

Got a call from Laura Marcus inquiring about a TNT intern in process with us (Mooney). Called EOP, case still with FBI. Gave the standard fastest in the government speech, this is an SCI world, can't pressure FBI, filegate, ect, ect. Mooney is a personal friend of hers.
