RE: BI'S GOING TO THE HILL

DATE: MAY 4, 1993

Since the recess, demands by the Hill to review BI's are increasing. I am instituting the following guidelines for the handling thereof, and the reason therefor is simple: I may know things about nominees or their situations that you don't, and thus may need to handle individual nominees either myself or otherwise give them special treatment.

1. Reduce to writing (preferably typed) any requests for review of BI's you may receive directly, including date, time, place, Senator, and BI's requested. Deliver to me ASAP.
2. Check with me before this Office agrees to do anything. If you cannot find me, or if I am unavailable, tell the Hill--and I don't care who is asking--that compliance with their request will have to wait until you can find me. Do not come get a BI on your own and carry it up to the Hill.
3. Use the sign out/return sheets, and be accurate. Unless absolutely necessary, no BI's are to remain outside the safes in my office overnight. I will become, instantly, an unhappy camper if this is not scrupulously adhered to.
4. Do not ever, under any circumstances, discuss the contents of any BI with anyone other than me or a Senator. Again, I don't care who is asking; if it is a Senior White House person (other than Foster or Nussbaum), politely but firmly tell them they must raise their request with me. No exceptions.

5. The ground rules on the Hill are: the Senators can see only the background summaries. No arrest records or interviews are to be attached; never carry interviews or other raw data to the Hill. If I request that you not read a BI, so that you can say that you do not know what is in it, then don't read that BI.
6. The Senators cannot quote the BI's verbatim in notes, they cannot have staff present, they cannot copy the BI's, and conversations between Senators in your presence are not privileged. If you get questions, answer them with one-word answers as much as possible, do not speculate, and if the questions get much beyond the obvious, refer them to me. Avoid under all circumstances telling any Senator that there is nothing in a BI that would trouble him; refer him or her to the language of the BI itself. You can make a general statement that the Administration considers the BI to be generally clean, and you can refer him or her, if asked, to portions thereof that appear pertinent, but never make a statement that there is nothing in the BI that would cause problems.

Interacting with the Senators is a privilege and, of course, is dangerous. Do not get this Office or the Administration in trouble. Your best bet is always to play dumb, take requests/questions down in writing and bring them back here for resolution.

Let me know ASAP if there is anything herein you don't understand. Start compliance with the above and foregoing immediately.

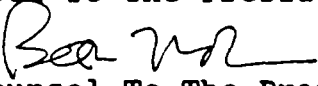
