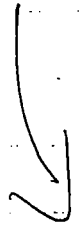

RE: WHITE HOUSE COUNSEL OFFICE SPACE NEEDS

Based on conservative assumptions about our staffing, the following represents our office space needs in the Old Executive Office Building:

- 5 Associate Counsel Offices
(Clearance-Ethics; Presidential Powers; General; General; and Judicial Selection)
- 6 Assistant Counsel Offices
(Clearance/FBI Reports; Clearance/278 Forms; Presidential Powers (OGE); General; General (OGE); and Judicial Selection (OGE))
- 5 Attorney (Assistant Counsel) Offices
(OGE's reviewing 278 Forms)
- 3 Assistant Counsel Offices
(OGE's from Personnel to do vetting)
- 1 Paralegal Office
(judicial selection)
- 1 Executive Assistant/Paper Manager

Total: 21

Also: 6 Staff Assistants
(5 secretaries; 1 clearance form assistant)

The Old Executive Office Building plan dated January 17, 1993, assigns a total of 21 offices to the White House Counsel. (Specifically, the Counsel's office has been assigned the space behind doors 121, 123, 125, 127, 129, 126, 126A, 128, 132, 132A, 134, 136, 138 and 140). Of the 21 offices assigned, 7 are very small offices built into space that appears not to have been subdivided in the past.

Assuming that staff assistants will sit in the open spaces available between offices, the 21 offices currently assigned to the White House Counsel will be sufficient to meet the space needs of the 21 attorney positions (including OGE's) listed above.

As we have discussed, however, the White House Personnel Office has made arrangements to assume at least temporary control of substantial portions of the space originally assigned to the White House Counsel. Specifically, I agreed this past Wednesday, in response to a request to you from Peter Knight, to assign three offices (including one Associate Counsel office) for Personnel Office use -- i.e., the three offices behind doors 121 and 123. Peter told me that this would be the only office space Personnel would need to borrow.

Yesterday, I learned that John Emerson had independently made arrangements, approved by David Watkins, for the Personnel Office to use, for 100 days, an additional four offices assigned to the White House Counsel (including one Associate Counsel office) -- i.e., the four offices behind doors 134 and 136. Although these offices are presently being used to house members of the Personnel Office staff, I had understood that this was a temporary use to facilitate orientation of new personnel, and that this staff would be moving out of the space on February 1 or very shortly thereafter.

As we have discussed, it is important that the various White House offices work together to facilitate smooth and efficient operations. The White House Counsel's Office, however, will face a very heavy workload, particularly in the opening months of the Administration -- when there will be, among other things, a peak volume of financial disclosure and FBI forms to be reviewed and numerous questions connected to the start-up of White House operations. Much of the work performed by the Counsel's Office dovetails with work performed by the Personnel Office, and it would appear inefficient to satisfy Personnel space needs by minimizing the space available for Counsel operations.

SUBJECT: Final Staffing and Compensation Levels
for the Office of the General Counsel

Our final review of your staff and salary levels indicates that you are authorized to employ 20 (regular) and 8 (OGE) staff at aggregate annualized salaries not to exceed \$1,100,000.

As of February 11, payroll tapes indicate you have 15 (regular) and 1 (SGE) individuals on your staff and their annualized salaries total \$910,500.

The staff plan you submitted to me indicates you intend to hire 25 staff (including the OGEs) for a total of \$1,100,000 but you would like the 3 security staff moved to Personnel. While the staff can indeed be moved, their annualized salaries must move with them, lowering your authorization to 25 staff (including 8 OGEs) at aggregate annualized salaries totalling \$1,015,000.

As you can see, you are still within your staff count, but will exceed your salary limit if you staff according to the plan you submitted. Please resubmit a staff plan that includes 25 staff at \$1,015,000 and we will make arrangements to move the security staff to the Personnel budget.
