Dear Mr. Bowsher:

We are writing to request that the GAO conduct a thorough investigation of the procedures that the White House has followed since January 20, 1993 regarding White House passes and security clearances. Executive Order 10450 requires that individuals being employed by the executive branch of the government be investigated to establish their reliability, trustworthiness, good conduct, character and loyalty to the United States.

The recent revelations that many senior aides including Mack McLarty, Dee Dee Myers, William Kennedy, Patsy Thomasson, Ricki Seidman and others did not have or still do not have permanent White House passes after over a year or more at the White House raises serious concerns. The Aldrich Ames case and recent information indicating that individuals were imprisoned or may have even died because of his actions, highlights the importance of following proper procedures.

As you may know, this issue was raised in conjunction with the ongoing GAO investigation into the White House travel office firings. In the travel office investigation questions were raised as to why Harry Thomason had a White House pass that gave him the access to intervene in White House matters. On a number of occasions GAO staff members have suggested an independent investigation into the White House pass procedures would be needed because the White House has only provided very limited information regarding White House passes in the Travel Office investigation.

Over the past several weeks it has become apparent that this White House has failed to follow the standard procedures followed by previous Administrations in processing permanent White House passes and as a result hundreds of White House employees had temporary passes for longer than the customary three to four month period when an employee first starts work at the White House.

We have enclosed for you, correspondence with the White House over the past nine months, a number of newspaper articles

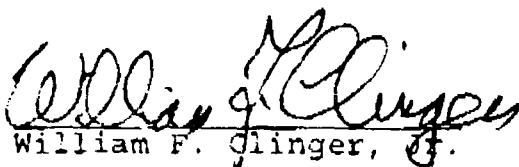
on the lax procedures at the White House regarding passes, and a recent statement made by Congressman Wolf on the subject.

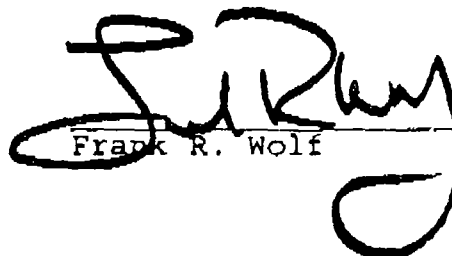
The matters addressed as part of your investigation we believe should include, but not be limited to, how the current staff has responded to the FBI background investigations in terms of their timely response, their cooperation, their providing of accurate and truthful information, the timely processing of financial and tax information and how this information has been processed by the White House Counsel's office and how and when it has been forwarded to the Secret Service for their review and input and if the information that the Secret Service received included the complete file of an individual or if any material was removed or altered in the Counsel's office in any cases. How the Counsel's office has responded to any expressed concerns by the FBI, Office of Government Ethics or Secret Service throughout this process would also be important. Also how security clearances were handled during this time in light of the lengthy delays would be of importance.

In addition, the status of individuals such as James Carville, Paul Begala, Mandy Grunwald and Stanley Greenberg and others who work regularly at the White House should be examined. Are these individuals special government employees? What kind of background investigations have they gone through, how are their conflicts determined? How long can they work at the White House without becoming a special government employee and subject to the same restrictions on outside pay and outside employment as other White House employees?

Please contact us if we can provide you with any additional information.

Dear Mr. Cutler:

Thank you for your letter of July 21, 1994, regarding the review of the White House pass and security clearance processes being conducted at our request by the General Accounting Office (GAO).

From the outset, we want to assure you that we have never had any interest in reviewing the background investigations of members of the White House staff, or violating in any other way their "legitimate privacy interests". In keeping with that intent, we very carefully crafted our request to GAO to obtain only that information necessary to conduct a meaningful analysis while avoiding any invasion of an individual's personal privacy.

You have our assurance that regardless of wherever the GAO review may lead, we will take extraordinary steps not to violate personal privacy concerns. If at any time you believe any of our requests will lead to crossing that line, we hope you will contact us immediately.

We do not believe any of the information requested to date could be considered a personal privacy concern, especially since we have not asked for any individual to be identified by name. All of the specific dates we have requested are merely representative mileposts of the pass and security clearance processes followed at the White House. Without this information it will be impossible for GAO to perform any objective analysis of the overall process.

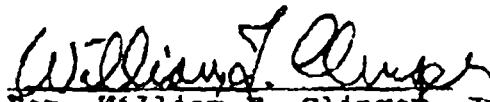
We cannot agree with your suggested condition that the information be provided with the "express understanding that this is not merely the first stage of a broader review". Obviously, the analysis of this data may lead to additional questions. Accordingly, it is quite possible that we may have additional questions regarding the broader context of the pass and security clearance processes. Of course, in pursuing such legitimate requests, we will live by our commitment to avoid specific matters of personal privacy.

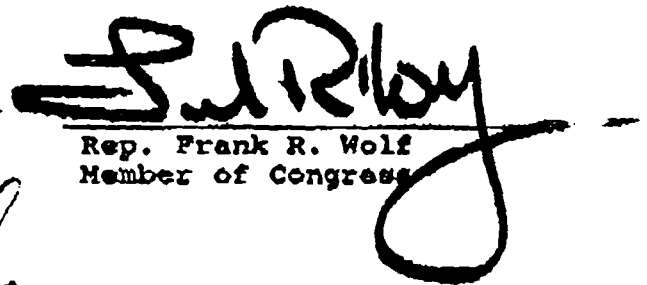

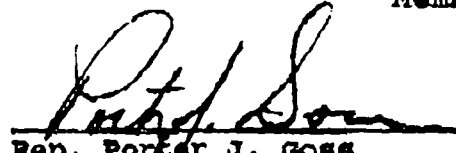

SUBJECT: GAO Pass Audit

This morning, I telephoned Uldis Adamsons, the GAO official who is in charge of the security pass audit. I informed him that the USSS and FBI are still compiling the requested information and that I had no way of predicting how long it would be before they could be expected to finish.

In addition, I explained in some detail why it had taken so long to define the appropriate universe of WHO employees covered by the review. In particular, I indicated that there were "many dozen" individuals, most (but not all) of whom worked at PPO, who came on early in the administration but who were never expected to remain on staff beyond the first "year or so" of the administration. I further indicated that for most of these, the expectation was that, after assisting others find positions, they themselves would be placed elsewhere in government. Finally, I indicated that because such individuals were never "on track to receive a permanent pass," we did not include them in our universe.

Mr. Adamsons stated that he had "no problem" with this cut as it was consistent with the criteria we had negotiated earlier in the year.

Mr. Adamsons also expressed his appreciation for being kept up to date as we seek to comply with GAO's request. He indicated that, while Barbara Comstock and Phil Larson continued to be in frequent contact with him, "he thought he had been able to satisfy them that we are proceeding diligently and in good faith."

The Access Pass and Clearance Process

According to the Secret Service, there are about 7,000 people that have passes that allow them access to various parts of the White House complex. About 1,100 are White House staff. The others include, for example, DOD, GSA, and Secret Service employees, detailees from other agencies, and residence staff. The current process for obtaining a White House access pass and/or security clearance typically works as follows for White House complex employees.

Pre-Employment

Prior to being appointed, applicants must complete the following tasks.

- Applicants must provide pre-employment information such as their name, address, marital status, etc.
- Applicants must undergo a security interview conducted by the White House Personnel Security office.
- Applicants must submit to a drug test. It normally takes about 10 days to get the results, and if they are positive, the individual can be disqualified from appointment.
- Applicants must also undergo an FBI "name check". The Secret Service forwards the employee's name and date of birth to the FBI, which checks the name on the National Crime Indicator Center computer in order to identify any prior criminal activity. The FBI has 60 million names in its files. Almost 13,000 name checks were done for the White House in fiscal year 1993 and over 5,000 checks were done through the first nine months of fiscal year 1994 [update?]. The processing time for a name check is typically three days, according to the FBI.

Obtaining a Temporary Pass

Once hired, an individual's name is placed on the "access list," which means the individual must present positive identification each time he or she enters the White House complex. Also, each new employee has thirty days from the date of appointment to complete the "Security Investigation Data for Sensitive Position" form (Standard Form 86), an FBI investigation consent form, a tax check waiver, a personal data statement questionnaire, and other personal data as needed. This thirty day standard was established by the White House in March 1994. Employees not meeting this standard are to have their access to the White House revoked and are to be placed on a leave without pay status until the paperwork is completed. According to answers provided for the record related to March 22, 1994 hearings before the House Appropriations Subcommittee on the Treasury, Postal Service, and General

Government Appropriations, the White House stated that during 1993, employees typically took 90 to 120 days to complete this paperwork.

All employees who are on track for a permanent pass must complete an SF-86. This would include full time employees and could include students and volunteers depending on the work being performed. In general, persons expected to work 90 days or more are required to submit an SF-86, although in some cases of short "employment," the SF-86 may not be sent to the FBI.

If all actions are concluded without a negative outcome, the White House Office of Personnel Security recommends to the Secret Service that a temporary pass be issued to the employee for a period of 90 days. The employee is fingerprinted by the Secret Service and the fingerprints are sent through the national database and afterwards kept on file by the Secret Service. Each new employee is required to attend a security briefing at which attendance is mandatory and the individual's presence is noted and included in his or her security file.

The SF-86 forms from the White House staff and the Office of Policy Development staff will go either directly to the White House Counsel's office or will go through the Personnel Security office, the director of which reports to the Counsel's office. A security officer in the Office of Administration reviews the SF-86 forms from offices such as the Office of Administration, the Office of Management and Budget, and U.S. Trade Representative. According to White House officials, each SF-86 is reviewed for correctness and completeness (so as to avoid having the FBI send it back) and to determine if there are any immediate issues that need to be addressed.

Obtaining a Permanent Pass

Before a permanent pass or a security clearance can be issued, the FBI must conduct a full-field background investigation. This is initiated when the White House Counsel sends a transmittal to the FBI requesting such an investigation. Included with the transmittal are the Standard Form 86 and related documents.

The FBI target for first time full-field background investigations is 45 calendar days. An updated investigation, which is done every five years, is to be completed in 90 days. These targets were changed during the Bush Administration [what year] due to shortages in FBI staff resources and an increased demand for investigations. The targets had been 30-35 days [which is it?] for a first time investigation and 70 days for a reinvestigation. The FBI estimates that it conducts about 1,000 to 1,500 background investigations a year for the White House--about 25 percent of the FBI total.

If the investigation reveals derogatory information about an employee, the FBI notifies the White House Counsel, who might

request an interim report. At the completion of its investigation, the FBI sends an investigation summary to the White House Counsel and the Secret Service. Depending on the case, the FBI may also send copies of individual interview summaries, but does not typically transmit the complete investigative file.

Once the Counsel's office receives the FBI report, its adjudication process may involve resolving derogatory findings. These findings could involve any number of a wide range of matters of varying severity, such as prior arrests, credit problems, inability to verify previous employment, or simple mistakes. The White House determines what followup needs to be done, which could include contacting the subject individual for additional information or having the FBI investigate further.

White House officials have several sources of information available to them during the adjudication process, such as the FBI's background investigation report, the SF-86, the personal data statement provided by the employee, the tax check results, financial disclosure information, and the NCIC check results. As information is returned from the agencies and departments, it is to be reviewed within five days by the White House Counsel's office and the White House Personnel Security office. Because the White House may decide not to hire certain individuals, the decision to grant a permanent pass involves not just security concerns, but also issues of suitability.

After Counsel has resolved any questions to its satisfaction, the White House makes a written request to the Secret Service for a permanent pass for the employee. According to answers provided for the record related to the above-mentioned March 22, 1994 hearings, during 1993 it took about seven months from the time the FBI completed the investigation to the time the Secret Service was authorized to issue a permanent pass. Because the initial backlog has been resolved and additional resources have been committed to the task, the White House states that this step now takes "a matter of weeks."

The Secret Service, generally within three days, makes a recommendation to the White House as to whether the employee should receive a permanent pass. The Secret Service then issues the permanent pass. White House officials told us that the standard time for an employee to receive a permanent pass has been established as 120 days.

Obtaining a Security Clearance

Employees of the White House Office do not receive standard security clearances but rather an "equivalent" clearance for access purposes. Anyone with a permanent pass has the equivalent of a Top Secret clearance on a need-to-know basis. This is not true of employees of other offices, such as the Office of Administration,

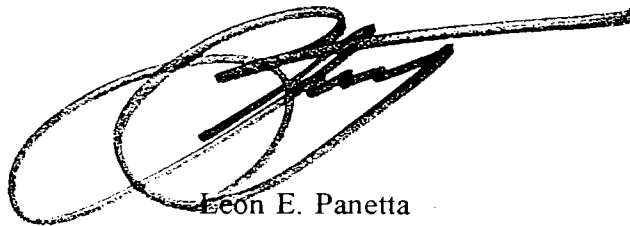

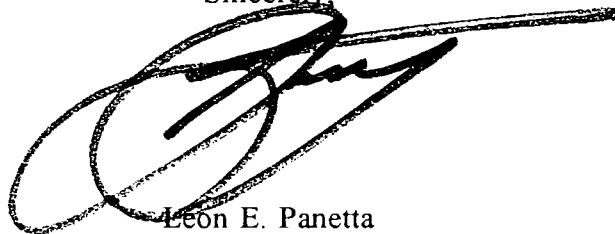

SUBJECT: GAO Pass Audit

I spoke to David Hand today to ask for guidance on the following question. In some instances, an individual comes on payroll, leaves before the BI is done, and then at a later time returns for full time employment. David agreed that in this scenario, the data should reflect the second, but not the first, period of employment.

AT&T contractors

- 8-The departure date should be 9/2/94.
- 10-Temporary pass issue date changed to 12/3/93.
- 13-The EOD should be 10/12/93.

OA/ONDCP contractors

- 1-This individual was originally a 90-day hire, who later became permanent.
- 4-The FBI completed their investigation on 3/1/94.
- 10-Mr. Malone agreed that the 5 digit date extension on the SF-86 date could be removed.
- 11-Mr. Malone agreed that the 5 digit date extension on the SF-86 date could be removed..
- 26-This is a person who got a temporary pass prior to submitting an SF-86. According to the White House officials, at one time, 90-day contractors were not required to undergo an FBI investigation. This policy changed in March 1993 when Chuck Easley, the security officer for OA, decided that short-term hires would need an SF-86 in order to obtain a temporary pass.
- 27-Similar to #26.
- 29-The temporary pass date should be 11/8/93. This is an individual who previously worked for another EOP office, left, and was hired in the current position.
- 39-The temporary pass date should be 8/23/93.
- 40-DOD did the BI, not the FBI.

Intelligence Solutions Contractors

No corrections.

ONDCP

- 4-This person was a volunteer prior to being employed by ONDCP and is now a political appointee needing Senate confirmation.
- 6-The individual worked at the White House prior to ONDCP.
- 9-This is someone who worked at ONDCP, left, and then came back to ONDCP [and left again]. The EOD is for the second tour.
- 10-This person had an existing BI and thus did not need an SF-86. He/she was a holdover from the previous administration and kept getting extended.

- 13-This individual came to ONDCP from another EOP agency. The temporary pass date should be N/A. Mr. Malone agreed that the five digit date extension on the SF-50 date could be removed.

15-The individual interned at the White House prior to ONDCP. The TP date was confirmed as 6/11/93 and the SF-86 date was confirmed as June 3, 1994.

16-The temporary pass date should be 8/15/94. This individual had an earlier temporary pass with another agency. The permanent pass issued date should be 11/23/94.

18-This individual is awaiting Senate confirmation and has asked not to be issued a temporary or permanent pass pending confirmation.

OA

2-This person was an intern prior to being employed by OA and was issued a temporary pass as an intern.

5-Mr. Malone agreed that the 5 digit date extension on the PP issue date could be removed.

7-This person worked at the White House prior to OA.

8-This person worked at the White House prior to OA.

Dear Mr. President:

We are disturbed to learn that the White House Counsel's office has refused to cooperate with the General Accounting Office (GAO) review regarding White House passes, security clearances and outside consultants that we requested on March 23, 1994. GAO has informed us that the White House Counsel's office has refused to provide the information it has requested. In addition, GAO has told us that individuals from the White House Counsel's office have implied that we may no longer be interested in having GAO pursue this matter.

To ensure that there is no misunderstanding, we want to affirm that we remain fully committed to obtaining a complete evaluation of the processes of issuing passes and security clearances and the work being done by outside consultants. We view this as a serious matter that is deserving of your Administration's complete cooperation.

Over the course of the past several months, requests about this situation have been met with evasive, incomplete and even inaccurate responses that have needlessly prolonged an accurate public understanding of this matter. It was only after considerable pressure from the media that the White House revealed that several hundred White House staff had not received their permanent passes or security clearances. Indeed, some senior members of your staff, including Press Secretary Dee Dee Myers, had not even bothered to complete the initial paperwork which is required to initiate a background investigation.

GAO's request, made on our behalf, is straightforward. It merely asks for certain specific dates on which White House staff completed the required steps of the White House pass and security clearance processes. Individuals do not need to be identified by name. The information requested by GAO is basic to the review we have asked them to perform. It is the only way to provide factual data that will permit an objective analysis of the overall process.

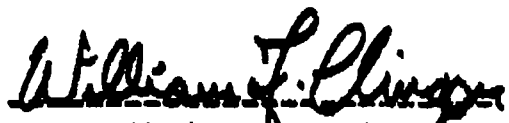

Most of the requested information is maintained by the Office of Administration, Federal Bureau of Investigation, or the United States Secret Service. Accordingly, we do not believe there is any legal basis for a representative of the White House Office to limit or restrict the availability of this information to GAO, especially when they are acting in response to a congressionally requested inquiry. If your Counsel has a contrary opinion that is based in law, we will appreciate hearing from him. In the meanwhile, we have asked GAO to formally request each of the above mentioned agencies to provide the information maintained within their records.

We ask that you give this matter your immediate attention and instruct your Counsel to relinquish his objection to GAO obtaining this information.
