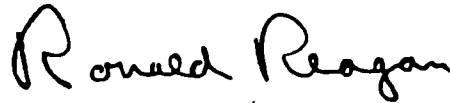

Executive Order 12640 of May 10, 1988

The President's Committee on Employment of People With Disabilities

53 F.R. 16996

By virtue of the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and laws of the United States of America, and in order to provide for the carrying out of the provisions of the Joint Resolution approved July 11, 1949, ch. 302, 63 Stat. 409, as amended, and the provisions of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, P.L. 93-112, Section 501 (a)-(f), as amended, it is ordered as follows:

Section 1. Establishment and Composition of the President's Committee. (a) There is hereby established the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities (hereinafter referred to as the Committee or as the President's Committee).

(b) The Committee shall be composed of a Chairman and not more than four Vice Chairmen, who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the President, and of so many other members as may be appointed thereto from time to time by the Chairman of the President's Committee from among

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persons (including representatives of organizations) who can contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the Committee. Members appointed by the Chairman shall be appointed for a term of 3 years and may be reappointed. The Chairman of the President's Committee may at any time terminate the service of any member of the President's Committee, except any member appointed by the President.

(c) The Chairman of the President's Committee, upon the advice of the Executive Committee (hereinafter provided for), may designate as, or invite to be, associate members of the President's Committee any heads of Federal departments or agencies that have responsibility for training and rehabilitation services or advocate activities touching the field of interest of the Committee or that are leading employers of individuals with disabilities.

(d) Representatives of business, industry, labor, private organizations, public agencies, other concerned organizations, and individuals with disabilities who are not members may be invited to attend meetings of the Committee.

Sec. 2. Functions of the Committee. The President's Committee shall provide advice and information as to the development of maximum employment opportunities for people who are physically disabled, mentally retarded, and mentally ill. To this end the Committee shall advise the President as to information that can be used by employers, labor unions, and national and international organizations, suggest programs for public education, and suggest methods of enlisting cooperation among organizations and agencies, Federal, State, and local officials, Governors' and local Committees on Employment of People with Disabilities, professional organizations, organized labor, and appropriate international organizations. In carrying out these functions vested in it by the Rehabilitation Act, as amended, the Committee shall be guided by the general policies of the National Council on the Handicapped and shall work closely with the Department of Labor, the Department of Education, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Veterans' Administration, State employment security agencies, and State vocational rehabilitation agencies.

Sec. 3. Executive Committee. (a) There is hereby established the Executive Committee of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of the President's Committee, who shall also be the Chairman of the Executive Committee, the Vice Chairman of the President's Committee, and so many additional members as will provide an Executive Committee of not less than 15 and not more than 30 members. The said additional members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years by the Chairman of the President's Committee from among the members of the President's Committee or otherwise. The Chairman of the President's Committee may at any time terminate the service of any member of the Executive Committee.

(b) The Executive Committee shall advise and assist the Chairman of the President's Committee in the conduct of the business of the President's Committee and, as authorized by the President's Committee or the Chairman thereof (with due regard for the responsibilities of other Federal agencies), shall study the problems of people with disabilities in obtaining and retaining suitable employment, invite authorities in the various professional, technical, and other pertinent fields to advise it in the exploration of those problems, and review plans and projects for advocating the employment of people with disabilities.

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Sec. 4. *Advisory Council.* There is hereby established the Advisory Council on Employment of People with Disabilities, which shall advise the President's Committee with respect to the responsibilities of the Committee. The Council shall be composed of the Chairman of the President's Committee, who shall also be the Chairman of the Council, and of the following-named officers, or their respective alternates: Secretary of State; Secretary of the Treasury; Secretary of Defense; The Attorney General; Secretary of the Interior; Secretary of Agriculture; Secretary of Commerce; Secretary of Labor; Secretary of Health and Human Services; Secretary of Housing and Urban Development; Secretary of Transportation; Secretary of Education; Chairman, Equal Employment Opportunity Commission; Administrator of General Services; Director, Office of Personnel Management; Director, United States Information Agency; Administrator of Veterans' Affairs; and the Postmaster General.

Sec. 5. *Administrative and Incidental Matters.* (a) The President's Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Advisory Council shall each meet on call of the Chairman of the President's Committee at a time and place designated by the Chairman. In the case of the President's Committee and the Executive Committee, the Chairman shall call at least one meeting and two meetings, respectively, to be held during each calendar year.

(b) In the absence of designation by the President, the Chairman of the President's Committee may from time to time designate a Vice Chairman of the President's Committee to be one or more of the following-named in the absence of the Chairman: Acting Chairman of the President's Committee, Acting Chairman of the Executive Committee, and Acting Chairman of the Advisory Council. The Chairman of the President's Committee shall from time to time assign other duties to the Vice Chairmen thereof.

(c) The Chairman of the President's Committee shall on behalf of the President direct the President's Committee and its functions.

(d) The Chairman may from time to time prescribe such necessary rules, procedures, and policies relating to the President's Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Advisory Council, and to their affairs, as are not inconsistent with law or with the provisions of this Order.

(e) The Vice Chairmen shall advise and counsel the Committee and shall represent the Committee on appropriate occasions.

(f) All members (including the Chairman and Vice Chairmen) of the President's Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Advisory Council shall serve without compensation. The Chairman and the Vice Chairmen of the President's Committee may receive transportation and per diem allowances as authorized by law for persons serving without compensation. Persons with disabilities serving as Chairman or Vice Chairmen may be compensated for attendant expenses, consistent with government procedures and practices.

(g) Employees of the President's Committee shall be appointed, subject to law, and shall be directed by the Chairman of the Committee. To such extent as may be mutually arranged by the Chairman of the Committee and the Secretary of Labor, employees of the Committee shall be subject to the administrative rules, regulations, and procedures of the Department of Labor.

(h) The Department of Labor is requested to make available to the President's Committee necessary office space and to furnish the Committee, under such arrangements respecting financing as may be appropriate, necessary equipment, supplies, and services. The estimates of appropriations for the oper-

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ations of the Committee shall be included within the framework of the appropriations structure of the Department of Labor, in such manner as the Director of the Office of Management and Budget may prescribe. The Chairman of the Committee, in cooperation with the Assistant Secretary for Administration and Management of the Department of Labor, shall be responsible for the preparation and justification of the estimates of appropriations for the Committee.

Sec. 6. Reporting. The President's Committee shall report annually to the President, who may apprise the Congress, and other interested organizations and individuals on the progress and problems of maximizing employment opportunities for people with disabilities.

Sec. 7. Prior Orders; Transition. (a) To the extent that this Order is inconsistent with any provision of any prior order, or with any provisions of any regulation or other measure or disposition, heretofore issued, made, or taken by the President or by any other officer of the Executive branch of the Government, this Order shall control. Executive Order No. 11480 of September 9, 1969, as amended, is hereby superseded.

(b) Without further action by the President or the Chairman of the Committee, all members, employees, records, property, funds, and pending business of the President's Committee on Employment of the Handicapped provided for in Executive Order No. 11480 of September 9, 1969, as amended, shall on the date of this Order become members, employees, records, property, funds, and pending business of the Committee established by this Order.

(c) The tenure of persons as members of the Committee in pursuance of the provisions of Section 7(b) of this Order, (i), in the case of persons appointed to the predecessor Committee by the President, shall be at the pleasure of the President, and (ii), in the case of other members, shall be for periods equal to their respective unexpired terms under Executive Order No. 11480, as amended, but shall also be subject to the provisions of the last sentence of Section 1(b) of this Order.

HANDICAPPED-MADE PRODUCTS—GOVERNMENT PURCHASE

PUBLIC LAW 92-28; 85 Stat. 77

[S. 557]

An Act to amend the Wagner-O'Day Act to extend its provisions relating to Government procurement of commodities produced by the blind to commodities produced by other severely handicapped individuals, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That:

The Act entitled "An Act to create a Committee on Purchases of Blind-made Products, and for other purposes", approved June 25, 1938 (52 Stat. 1196; 41 U.S.C. 46-48),⁸¹ is amended to read as follows:

"ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMITTEE

"Section 1. (a) Establishment.—There is established a committee to be known as the Committee for Purchase of Products and Services of the Blind and Other Severely Handicapped (hereafter in this Act referred to as the 'Committee'). The Committee shall be composed of fourteen members appointed as follows:

"(1) The President shall appoint as a member one officer or employee from each of the following: The Department of Agriculture, the Department of Defense, the Department of the Army, the Department of the Navy, the Department of the Air Force, the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, the Department of Commerce, the Veterans' Administration, the Department of Justice, the Department of Labor, and the General Services Administration. The head of each such department and agency shall nominate one officer or employee in his department or agency for appointment under this paragraph.

"(2) (A) The President shall appoint one member from persons who are not officers or employees of the Government and who are conversant with the problems incident to the employment of the blind and other severely handicapped individuals.

"(B) The president shall appoint one member from persons who are not officers or employees of the Government and who represent blind individuals employed in qualified nonprofit agencies for the blind.

"(C) The President shall appoint one member from persons who are not officers or employees of the Government and who represent severely handicapped individuals (other than blind individuals) employed in qualified nonprofit agencies for other severely handicapped individuals.

81. 41 U.S.C.A. §§ 46 to 48.

"(b) **Vacancy.**—A vacancy in the membership of the Committee shall be filled in the manner in which the original appointment was made.

"(c) **Chairman.**—The members of the Committee shall elect one of their number to be Chairman.

"(d) **Terms.**—

"(1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3), members appointed under paragraph (2) of subsection (a) shall be appointed for terms of five years. Any member appointed to the Committee under such paragraph may be reappointed to the Committee if he meets the qualifications prescribed by that paragraph.

"(2) Of the members first appointed under paragraph (2) of subsection (a)—

"(A) one shall be appointed for a term of three years,

"(B) one shall be appointed for a term of four years,

and

"(C) one shall be appointed for a term of five years, as designated by the President at the time of appointment.

"(3) Any member appointed under paragraph (2) of subsection (a) to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of such term. A member appointed under such paragraph may serve after the expiration of his term until his successor has taken office.

"(e) **Pay and Travel Expenses.**—

"(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), members of the Committee shall each be entitled to receive the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay in effect for grade GS-18 of the General Schedule for each day (including traveltime) during which they are engaged in the actual performance of services for the Committee.

"(2) Members of the Committee who are officers or employees of the Government shall receive no additional pay on account of their service on the Committee.

"(3) While away from their homes or regular places of business in the performance of services for the Committee, members of the Committee shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in the same manner as persons employed intermittently in the Government service are allowed expenses under section 5703(b) of title 5 of the United States Code.

"(f) **Staff.**—

"(1) Subject to such rules as may be adopted by the Committee, the Chairman may appoint and fix the pay of such personnel as the Committee determines are necessary to assist it in carrying out its duties and powers under this Act.

"(2) Upon request of the Committee, the head of any entity of the Government is authorized to detail, on a reimbursable

basis, any of the personnel of such entity to the Committee to assist it in carrying out its duties and powers under this Act.

"(3) The staff of the Committee appointed under paragraph (1) shall be appointed subject to the provisions of title 5, United States Code, governing appointments in the competitive service, and shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of such title relating to classification and General Schedule pay rates.

"(g) **Obtaining Official Data.**—The Committee may secure directly from any entity of the Government information necessary to enable it to carry out this Act. Upon request of the Chairman of the Committee, the head of such Government entity shall furnish such information to the Committee.

"(h) **Administrative Support Services.**—The Administrator of General Services shall provide to the Committee on a reimbursable basis such administrative support services as the Committee may request.

"(i) **Annual Report.**—The Committee shall, not later than September 30 of each year, transmit to the President and to the Congress a report which shall include the names of the Committee members serving in the preceding fiscal year, the dates of the Committee meetings in that year, a description of its activities under this Act in that year, and any recommendations for changes in this Act which it determines are necessary.

"DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE

"Sec. 2. (a) (1) The Committee shall establish and publish in the Federal Register a list (hereafter in this Act referred to as the 'procurement list') of—

"(A) the commodities produced by any qualified nonprofit agency for the blind or by any qualified nonprofit agency for other severely handicapped, and

"(B) the services provided by any such agency, which the Committee determines are suitable for procurement by the Government pursuant to this Act. Such list shall be established and published in the Federal Register before the expiration of the thirty-day period beginning on the effective date of this paragraph and shall initially consist of the commodities contained, on such date, in the schedule of blind-made products issued by the former Committee on Purchases of Blind-Made Products under its regulations.

"(2) The Committee may, by rule made in accordance with the requirements of subsections (b), (c), (d), and (e) of section 553 of title 5, United States Code, add to and remove from the procurement list commodities so produced and services so provided.

"(b) The Committee shall determine the fair market price of commodities and services which are contained on the procurement list and which are offered for sale to the Government by any qualified nonprofit agency for the blind or any such agency for other

severely handicapped. The Committee shall also revise from time to time in accordance with changing market conditions its price determinations with respect to such commodities and services.

"(c) The Committee shall designate a central nonprofit agency or agencies to facilitate the distribution (by direct allocation, subcontract, or any other means) of orders of the Government for commodities and services on the procurement list among qualified nonprofit agencies for the blind or such agencies for other severely handicapped.

"(d) (1) The Committee may make rules and regulations regarding (A) specifications for commodities and services on the procurement list, (B) the time of their delivery, and (C) such other matters as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act.

"(2) The Committee shall prescribe regulations providing that—

"(A) in the purchase by the Government of commodities produced and offered for sale by qualified nonprofit agencies for the blind or such agencies for other severely handicapped, priority shall be accorded to commodities produced and offered for sale by qualified nonprofit agencies for the blind, and

"(B) in the purchase by the Government of services offered by nonprofit agencies for the blind or such agencies for other severely handicapped, priority shall, until the end of the calendar year ending December 31, 1976, be accorded to services offered for sale by qualified nonprofit agencies for the blind.

"(e) The Committee shall make a continuing study and evaluation of its activities under this Act for the purpose of assuring effective and efficient administration of this Act. The Committee may study (on its own or in cooperation with other public or nonprofit private agencies) (1) problems related to the employment of the blind and of other severely handicapped individuals, and (2) the development and adaptation of production methods which would enable a greater utilization of the blind and other severely handicapped individuals.

"PROCUREMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE GOVERNMENT

"Sec. 3. If any entity of the Government intends to procure any commodity or service on the procurement list, that entity shall, in accordance with rules and regulations of the Committee, procure such commodity or service, at the price established by the Committee, from a qualified nonprofit agency for the blind or such an agency for other severely handicapped if the commodity or service is available within the period required by that Government entity; except that this section shall not apply with respect to the procurement of any commodity which is available for procurement from an industry established under chapter 307 of title 18, United States Code, and which, under section 4124 of such title, is required to be procured from such industry.

"AUDIT

"Sec. 4. The Comptroller General of the United States, or any of his duly authorized representatives, shall have access, for the purpose of audit and examination, to any books, documents, papers, and other records of the Committee and of each agency designated by the Committee under section 2(c). This section shall also apply to any qualified nonprofit agency for the blind and any such agency for other severely handicapped which have sold commodities or services under this Act but only with respect to the books, documents, papers, and other records of such agency which relate to its activities in a fiscal year in which a sale was made under this Act.

"DEFINITIONS

"Sec. 5. For purposes of this Act—

"(1) The term 'blind' refers to an individual or class of individuals whose central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with correcting lenses or whose visual acuity, if better than 20/200, is accompanied by a limit to the field of vision in the better eye to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than 20 degrees.

"(2) The terms 'other severely handicapped' and 'severely handicapped individuals' mean an individual or class of individuals under a physical or mental disability, other than blindness, which (according to criteria established by the Committee after consultation with appropriate entities of the Government and taking into account the views of non-Government entities representing the handicapped) constitutes a substantial handicap to employment and is of such a nature as to prevent the individual under such disability from currently engaging in normal competitive employment.

"(3) The term 'qualified nonprofit agency for the blind' means an agency—

"(A) organized under the laws of the United States or of any State, operated in the interest of blind individuals, and the net income of which does not inure in whole or in part to the benefit of any shareholder or other individual;

"(B) which complies with any applicable occupational health and safety standard prescribed by the Secretary of Labor; and

"(C) which in the production of commodities and in the provision of services (whether or not the commodities or services are procured under this Act) during the fiscal year employs blind individuals for not less than 75 per centum of the man-hours of direct labor required for the production or provision of the commodities or services.

"(4) The term 'qualified nonprofit agency for other severely handicapped' means an agency—

"(A) organized under the laws of the United States or of any State, operated in the interest of severely handicapped individuals who are not blind, and the net income of which does

not inure in whole or in part to the benefit of any shareholder or other individual;

“(B) which complies with any applicable occupational health and safety standard prescribed by the Secretary of Labor; and

“(C) which in the production of commodities and in the provision of services (whether or not the commodities or services are procured under this Act) during the fiscal year employs blind or other severely handicapped individuals for not less than 75 per centum of the man-hours of direct labor required for the production or provision of the commodities or services.

“(6) The term ‘direct labor’ includes all work required for preparation, processing, and packing, but not supervision, administration, inspection, and shipping.

“(7) The term ‘fiscal year’ means the twelve-month period beginning on July 1 of each year.

“(8) The terms ‘Government’ and ‘entity of the Government’ include any entity of the legislative branch or the judicial branch, any executive agency or military department (as such agency and department are respectively defined by sections 102 and 105 of title 5, United States Code), the United States Postal Service, and any non-appropriated fund instrumentality under the jurisdiction of the Armed Forces.

“(9) The term ‘State’ includes the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

“AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS

“Sec. 6. There are authorized to be appropriated to the Committee to carry out this Act \$200,000 each for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, and the next two succeeding fiscal years.”

Sec. 2. The amendment made by the first section of this Act shall take effect on the first day of the first month which begins more than thirty days after the date of enactment of this Act.

RE: **PRESIDENT'S COMMITTEE ON EMPLOYMENT OF PEOPLE
WITH DISABILITIES**

The President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities is an independent federal agency created by Executive Order of the President. Established in 1947 under President Truman, the original aim of the Committee was to facilitate employment opportunities for disabled veterans of World War II. Presently, the Committee works with disability groups to abolish the barriers to employment for all disabled Americans. The Committee provides advice and information concerning the development of maximum employment opportunities for people who are physically disabled, mentally retarded and mentally ill. The Committee is served by a professional staff of 37 authorized full-time employees and has been appropriated the sum of \$4.32 million for Fiscal Year 1994.

The President is responsible for appointing a Chairperson and four Vice-Chairpersons, all of whom serve at his pleasure. This memorandum addresses all five of these positions.

RE: **PRESIDENT'S COMMITTEE ON EMPLOYMENT OF PEOPLE WITH
DISABILITIES (PA)**

I. BACKGROUND

The President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities was established for the purpose of facilitating the development of maximum employment opportunities for people who are physically disabled, mentally retarded and mentally ill. The Committee works with disability groups to abolish employment barriers for all disabled Americans and is served by a staff of 35 authorized full-time employees. The budget for Fiscal Year 1994 is \$4.32 million. The Committee was originally established in 1947 under President Truman to facilitate employment opportunities for disabled veterans of World War II.

II. DISCUSSION

The President is responsible for appointing a Chairperson and four Vice Chairpersons, all of whom serve at his pleasure. These appointments do not require the advice and consent of the Senate. Currently, there are two Vice Chair vacancies.

III. RECOMMENDATION

We recommend that you approve the appointment of the following individuals:

I. KING JORDAN, a Democrat from the District of Columbia, to be Vice Chair of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, vice I. King Jordan. In 1990, Dr. Jordan was appointed Vice Chair of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities by President Bush. Since 1988, Dr. Jordan has served as President of Gallaudet University. Previously, Dr. Jordan was Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Gallaudet from 1986 to 1988; Chair of the Department of Psychology from 1983 to 1986; and faculty member of the Department of Psychology from 1973 to 1983. Dr. Jordan received his B.A. from Gallaudet University in 1970, his M.A. from the University of Tennessee in 1971 and his Ph.D. from the University of Tennessee in 1973.

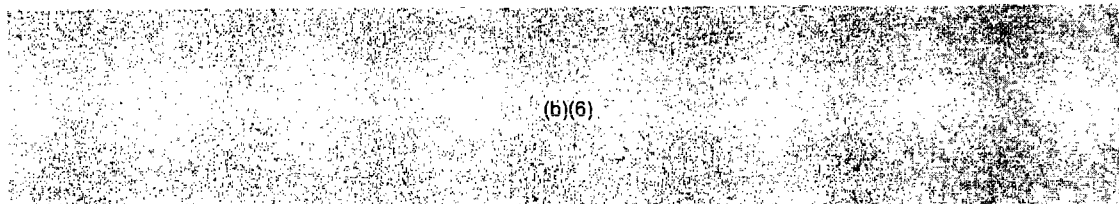

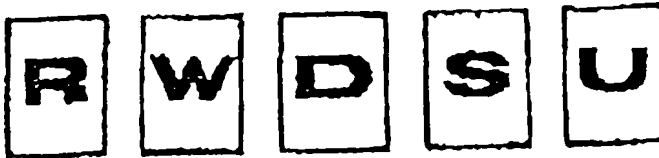

Lenore Miller has been President of the Retail, Wholesale and Department Store Union: AFL-CIO, CLC since September 1986. During her 36 years with the union she has held a variety of union posts: local union secretary-treasurer, pension plan trustee, Assistant to the President of the International Union, Vice President and member of the RWDSU Executive Board, and International Secretary-Treasurer. She also serves as chairperson of the RWDSU Union-Industry Benefit and Pension Plans.

In February 1987, Miller was elected an AFL-CIO Vice President and member of the federation's Executive Council. She is the first woman union president to hold those positions. DR. I. KING JORDAN
PRESIDENT, GALLAUDET UNIVERSITY**

Gallaudet University president I. King Jordan, grew up in Glen Riddle, Pennsylvania, a small town just outside Philadelphia. After finishing high school, he enlisted in the Navy and served four years. Dr. Jordan was involved in an automobile accident when he was 21 years old, which resulted in a profound hearing loss.

Dr. Jordan earned a B.A. in psychology from Gallaudet University in 1970. Gallaudet, which is located in Washington, D.C., is the world's only university with programs and services designed specifically for students who are deaf and hard of hearing. In 1971 Dr. Jordan earned an M.A., and in 1973 he earned a Ph.D. in psychology, both from the University of Tennessee.

Upon earning his doctorate, Dr. Jordan became a faculty member in the Department of Psychology. In 1983 he became chair of the Department of Psychology, and in 1986 he was named dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. Dr. Jordan has made international contributions in education through a number of professional fellowships abroad. He served as a visiting research fellow at Donaldson's School for the Deaf in Edinburgh, Scotland; as an exchange scholar at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, Poland; and as a visiting scholar and lecturer at schools in Paris, Toulouse, and Marseille, France.

After an historic protest on the University campus in 1988 which catapulted the needs and accomplishments of deaf people into a national focus, the Gallaudet Board of Trustees appointed Dr. Jordan the eighth president of Gallaudet and the first deaf president since the institution was established in 1864.

Since then, I. King Jordan has served not only as an international spokesperson for deaf and hard of hearing people, but also as an advocate for persons with disabilities as well. Much sought after as a speaker, Dr. Jordan continues to challenge the American public to examine their attitudes toward people with disabilities and to open their minds, hearts and workplaces to people with disabilities.

Dr. Jordan holds eight honorary degrees and has been the recipient of numerous other awards including the Freedom Award from the Washington Times Corporation, the Courage Center Award, the Washingtonian of the Year Award, the Distinguished Leadership Award from the National Association for Community Leadership, and The 1998 Dandel T. Cloud Leadership Award. In 1990 he was appointed Vice Chair of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities by President George Bush.

Dr. Jordan and his wife, Linda Jordan, live in the historic Edward Milner Gallaudet residence on the Gallaudet campus. They have a daughter, Heidi, who is a graduate of Flagler College in Florida, and a son, King III, who is a graduate of the University of Colorado, and attends the University of Georgia.

It has come to my attention that a most appropriate position with the Administration, and in your Department, may soon become available, a position for which I am uniquely qualified: Chairman of The President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities (PCEPD). The current Chairman, Mr. Justin Dart, appointed by former President Bush, has recently requested that President Clinton replace him. I strongly believe that I would be a perfect replacement.

As you know, PCEPD falls under your jurisdiction as an independent "organization affiliated with the U.S. Department of Labor". Established in 1947 by President Truman as a vehicle to assist World War II disabled veterans in returning to civilian jobs, the Committee has grown into an advisor to the President, an advocate for the employment and employment rights of all disabled individuals, a resource, educational, and deliberative body for all issues of concern to the disabled community, and a leader in the entire field.

As Chairman of the Committee I would chair its Annual Convention, - the largest conference on employment of the disabled in the world - preside over its board meetings, and be available to speak and travel on behalf of the Committee. I know that my recognition and visibility in both the disabled veterans' community and the disabled community at large would be an asset and aid in promoting the goals of the Committee, giving those goals their needed publicity and national exposure. 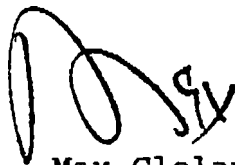

The president of Gallaudet University, I. King Jordan, Ph.D., grew up in Glen Riddle, Pennsylvania, a small town near Philadelphia. After completing high school in 1962, Dr. Jordan enlisted in the Navy and served four years until injuries received in a motorcycle accident resulted in his profound hearing loss when he was 21-years-old.

Dr. Jordan earned a B.A. degree in Psychology from Gallaudet University in 1970. He pursued graduate studies in Psychology at the University of Tennessee, earning a M.A. in 1971 and a Ph.D. in 1973.

Dr. Jordan returned to Gallaudet and joined the faculty as an assistant professor in the Psychology Department from 1973-1977. Promoted to associate professor in 1977 and to full professor in 1982, he was appointed Chairperson of the Department of Psychology in 1983. Dr. Jordan was named Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in 1986. After an historic protest on the university's campus that captured national attention to the needs of deaf people, the Gallaudet University Board of Trustees appointed Dr. Jordan the eighth President of Gallaudet University on March 13, 1988. Dr. Jordan is Gallaudet's first deaf president in the institution's 125-year history.

An active member of a wide range of professional organizations related to both psychology and higher education, Dr. Jordan was instrumental in establishing a special interest group on deafness within the American Educational Research Association and chaired a special interest group on education within the Convention of American Instructors of the Deaf. He presently serves as a member of the Advisory Committee for the National Institute on Deafness.

Dr. Jordan has served as a member of the Research and Education Advisory Panel for the U.S. General Accounting Office and as a consultant on the housing needs of disabled and elderly citizens for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Dr. Jordan has made international contributions in education through a number of professional fellowships abroad. He served as a visiting research fellow at Donaldson's School for the Deaf, Edinburg, Scotland; an exchange scholar, Jagiellonian University, Krakow, Poland; a visiting scholar and lecturer, at institutions in Paris, Toulouse and Marseille, France; and as a member of the Gallaudet delegation at the International Conference on the Education of the Deaf, Manchester, England.

Dr. Jordan is the recipient of numerous awards including the Leadership and Dedication Award for Civil and Human Rights for All Mankind, Washington, D.C. City Council, Ward 5, 1989; the Lawrence Katz Memorial Award, Philadelphia Psychiatric Center, 1989; the Paul Harris Fellow, Rotary Club International District Conference, 1989; Educator of the Year, Delta Phi Epsilon Honorary Society, 1988; the Outstanding Achievement Award, Delaware County Chamber of Commerce, 1988; and the United States Comptroller General's Award, 1987.

Dr. Jordan continues to be an active advocate for deaf, hard of hearing and disabled people. He testifies frequently before Congress and served on the Presidential Transition Committee for the Appointment of Persons with Disabilities, 1989.

Dr. Jordan resides in the historic Edward Miner Gallaudet Residence on campus with his wife, Linda Jordan, who is a teacher in suburban Maryland. The Jordans have two children, a daughter, Heidi, and a son, King. Dr. Jordan is an avid marathon runner, canoeer and hiker.

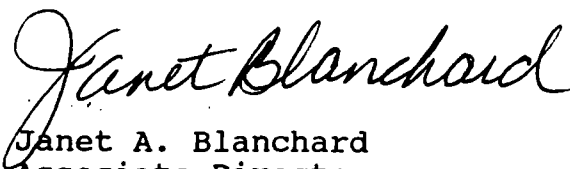
