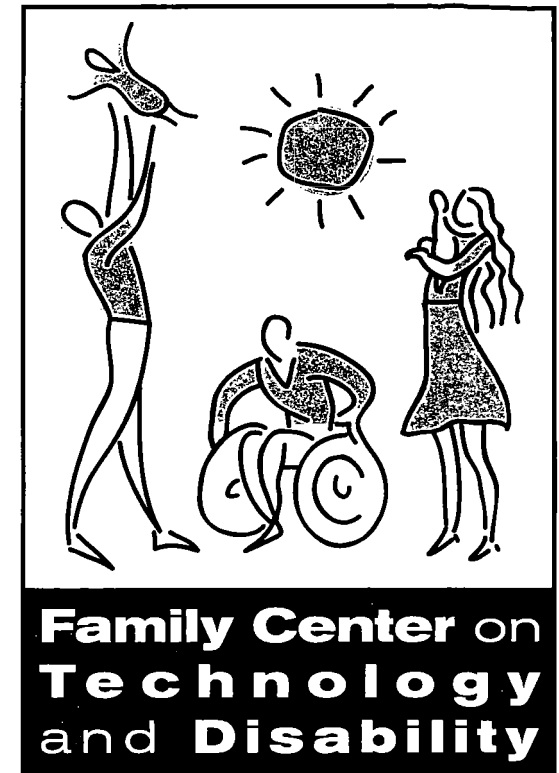

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## **What is the Family Center on Technology and Disability?**

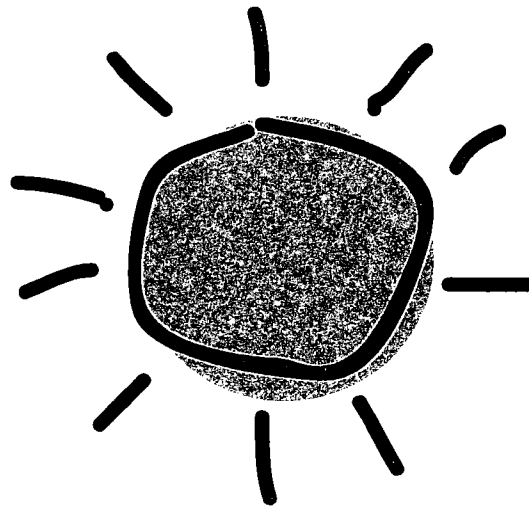
