SUBJECT: Meeting with Chinese Trade Minister Wu Yi Tomorrow at 10 a.m.

You are scheduled to meet with Chinese Trade Minister Wu Yi tomorrow morning at 10 a.m. The purpose of this meeting is to begin to build a working relationship with Wu Yi, because she may become a key figure in the WTO accession process. As of now, your meeting is Wu Yi's only White House meeting, so you will also want to convey a message about the importance President Clinton attaches to the broader U.S.-China relationship.

Wu Yi is in town for a meeting with Mickey Kantor under the auspices of the JCCT. Detailed talking points and background for that meeting are attached. As you know, Kantor is disappointed that Wu Yi is not bringing any airplane contracts with her, and there is some residual bad feeling from her recent meeting with Sasser, where she blasted USTR for the recent announcement of penalties for violations of the bilateral textile agreement (described in the attachments).

Apart from the detailed talking points that are attached on a variety of topics, you may want to make the following points:

- ° We are pleased that the relationship has been put on firmer ground in recent months by the successful conclusion of the intellectual property dispute and the MFN vote. The President views China as one of our most important partners. It is important to develop a bedrock of trust and confidence between our two countries that sustains the relationship even when disagreements arise.
- ° We would like to move forward on WTO accession. We sincerely want to work with you to make this possible. The President has indicated he will support granting China unconditional MFN when there is sufficient support in Congress and elsewhere. But we will need a strong accession package to make this possible. We will be flexible on transition periods. But you will need to make serious efforts on improving market access offers and meeting the WTO's basic obligations.
