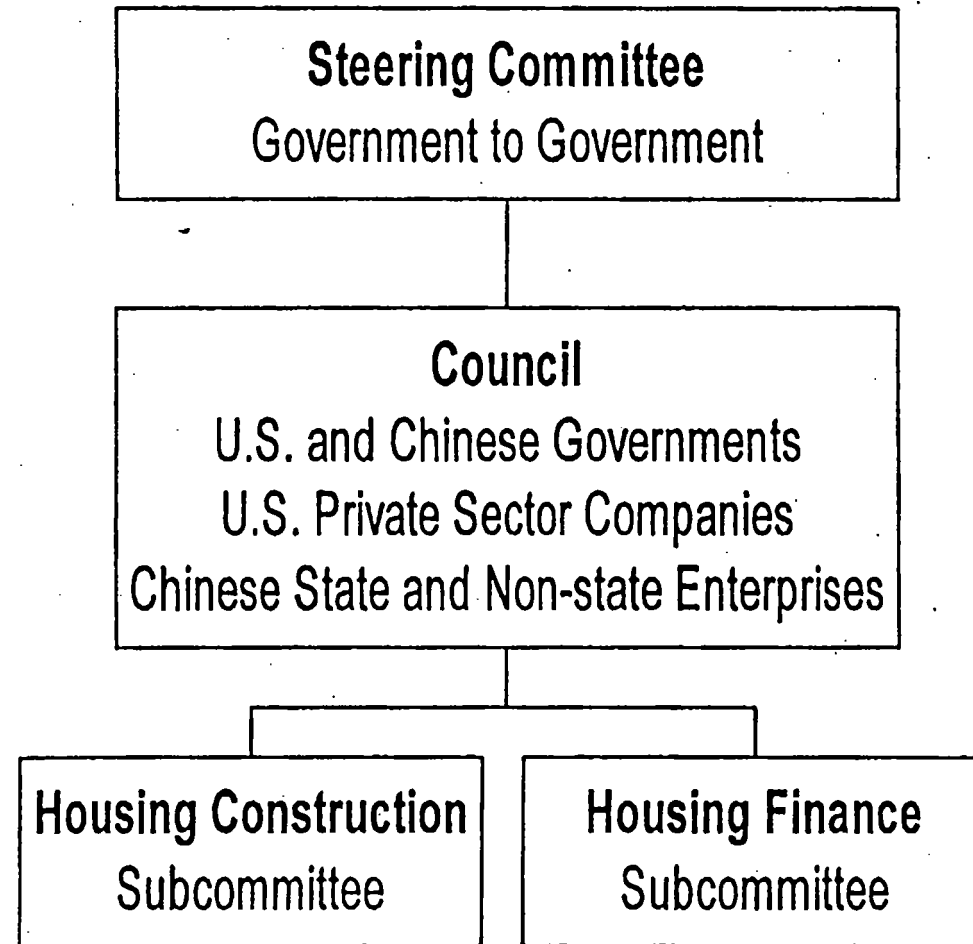

The purpose of this letter is to request a meeting to discuss with you a package of nuclear energy-related commercial proposals that Westinghouse is preparing to present to the Chinese government. Based on discussions with Chinese officials, we are hopeful that this package will be finalized and available in time for Premier Zhu Rongji's visit to Washington in April. We also hope that this package may serve to solidify commercial implementation of the nuclear cooperation agreement activated earlier this year.

I was in Washington last week for meetings with members of China's JCCT delegation to discuss our intended proposals. As a result of meetings with various officials, it is clear that a meeting with you is of critical importance to the success of our objectives.

I will be traveling to Beijing on January 6th and would very much appreciate the chance to meet with you on January 4th or 5th. I will have my secretary call your office shortly to inquire as to the possibility of arranging a meeting on these dates. I realize that you maintain a very busy schedule and would be willing to fly in from Pittsburgh to meet based on your availability on January 4th or 5th, 1999.

I want to call your attention to the accompanying letter on the subject of China's accession to the WTO that was sent to the President by the Chairs of the Emergency Committee for American Trade, the United States-China Business Council, and the Business Roundtable Task Force on Trade and Investment.

Dear Mr. President:

We applaud your leadership in developing a strategy for responding to the Asian economic crisis. In our view, securing China's accession to the World Trade Organization on the basis of a commercially viable protocol of accession would help to restore stability to Asian economies and should be incorporated as a major element in your global strategy to respond to the economic crisis. The chances of achieving this objective will be greatest if an agreement can be concluded by the time of the visit of China's premier, Zhu Rongji, this spring.

As the largest emerging economy in the world, China can take on a pivotal role in helping to chart the course for recovery in Asia, particularly in light of the continuing weakness in the Japanese economy. In addition, the growth of the Asian market is important for the United States; further opening China's market will lead to increased U.S. exports of goods, services and agriculture, which currently support over 200,000 American jobs.

Fully integrating China into global economic institutions such as the WTO is the best means to ensure that it will play a positive role in the global economy and provide broader market access for U.S. goods and services. In order to join the WTO, China would be required to enter into binding commitments to open its markets and abide by the disciplines of multilateral trading rules. The liberalization required under WTO rules would provide important new opportunities in the vast China market, which would help maintain global growth. WTO-mandated liberalization in China will also promote economic growth in China itself as the removal of discriminatory trade barriers creates new opportunities for economic activity and jobs. WTO accession would also provide another venue to encourage China to maintain a stable currency.

While China's WTO membership is important in and of itself for the benefits it would provide, it would also be read by financial markets throughout the world as a vote of confidence in the global economic system. China's WTO membership would also signal to Asian economies and other emerging markets around the world the importance of maintaining open markets and adhering to multilateral trading rules if growth is to be maintained.

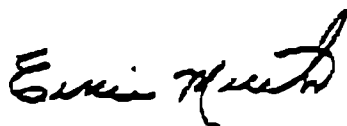
In advocating China's WTO membership, we do not suggest that it be at any price. China must be willing to agree to a commercially viable protocol of accession, which provides meaningful market access for U.S. goods, services and agriculture. These commitments must be in addition to China's full implementation of existing liberalization commitments. If China agrees to such a protocol, the United States should be ready to support its WTO admission and request that the Congress approve the permanent extension of normal trade relations (NTR) treatment to China.

We recognize that U.S. negotiators have diligently pursued WTO accession negotiations with the Chinese since your historic summits with President Jiang Zemin. We believe that these discussions are unlikely to reach a successful conclusion unless there is a reaffirmation of the commitment made at the November 1997 summit to reach an agreement on the terms of China's WTO accession. Such a reaffirmation might best be obtained by your direct intervention with President Jiang to secure his agreement to conclude WTO negotiations by early spring.

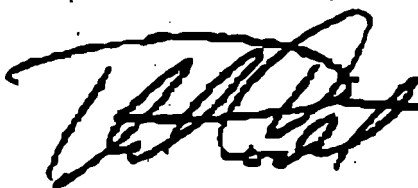
Bringing China into the community of nations as a fully responsible citizen subject to global trading rules must remain one of America's greatest priorities. We ask for your continued leadership in achieving this goal by making it an integral part of your global economic response strategy and commit our support to you on this endeavor.

We would appreciate the opportunity to discuss our ideas with you.

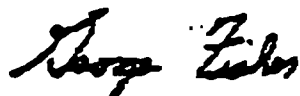
