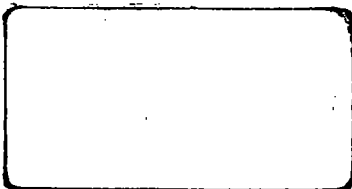

Dear Representative Mica:

Thank you for your recent letter conveying your views on Haiti.

I fully share your concern about the impact a large migration from Haiti could have on the State of Florida. We have worked to ensure that others in the region share in the responsibility of assisting Haitian migrants. We have signed Memoranda of Understanding with St. Lucia, Dominica and Suriname covering safe havens for Haitian migrants. Antigua and Grenada have agreed in principle to provide safe havens pending mutually satisfactory arrangements. Panama's President-elect has indicated to me that his new government will permit establishment of safe havens there as soon as he is inaugurated on September 1. In addition, the Central American heads of state recently declared their determination to explore the possibility of establishing safe havens in Central America. Since these agreements were reached, the number of Haitian migrants has dropped dramatically.

While seeking to tighten the sanctions against Haiti to pressure the military regime to step down and permit the restoration of democracy, I have not excluded any option that may be required to protect our interests in Haiti, including the use of force. Before I consider such action, I will ensure that our strategy maximizes multilateral participation, enables our departure in an orderly manner after the attainment of clear objectives and gains lasting results that will make the effort worthwhile. These are the principles underpinning UN Security Council Resolution 940 on Haiti, enacted July 31. Should I conclude that the use of force is required, I will consult with the Congress consistent with the War Powers Resolution and operational circumstances.

Let me also assure you that we have taken precautions to protect U.S. citizens in Haiti. The military regime understands the consequences of harming U.S. citizens.

I appreciate your taking the time to share your views with me.

Purpose

To respond to Representative Mica's recent letter on Haiti.

Background

Representative Mica expressed concern about several issues, including the impact of Haitian refugees on Florida and our policy of offshore asylum processing. His letter also encourages us to support the lifting of sanctions, warn Haitian authorities not to harm U.S. citizens and rely on international pressure rather than force to resolve the crisis in Haiti.

Your proposed response notes our successful efforts to establish regional safe havens and the subsequent decline in the number of persons fleeing Haiti. Your letter also updates Representative Mica on your position concerning sanctions and the possible use of force and the significance in this regard of the resolution on Haiti passed by the UN Security Council on July 31.

RECOMMENDATION

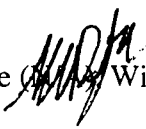

SUBJECT: Letter from Representative Mica on Haiti

Representative Mica wrote to the President expressing concern about the numbers of persons fleeing Haiti and their potential impact on Florida. He also called for an end to sanctions and to the policy of offshore migrant processing announced on June 16 and encouraged the President to ensure that the human rights of American citizens in Haiti are not violated. He asserted that international pressure, not military force, should be used to resolve the crisis in Haiti.

Our response updates Representative Mica on current policy and developments, including agreements to establish regional safe havens and the declining numbers of Haitians who are fleeing the island.

Dear President Clinton:

The purpose of this letter is to urge you to take several actions with respect to Haitian policy. As a Member of Congress from Florida, and someone who has had a long-term interest in Haiti, I am concerned about the safety of the thousands of people fleeing Haiti and the impact of this on the State of Florida.

First, I again urge you to lift the sanctions on Haiti. It is clear by now that the sanctions have failed and are crippling Haiti. In fact, more than a thousand Haitian infants are dying each month because of the sanctions. Our policy is devastating the lives of millions of poor Haitians and doing little to impact the thugs and criminals who have overpowered a gentle people.

Second, your latest June 16 policy of offshore asylum processing has been a disaster. Clearly, this triggered the mass exodus of the tens of thousands we've seen in the past few weeks. I urge you to restore sanity and stability to your policy by announcing a return to the policy of summarily returning Haitians picked up on the high seas to their country.

Finally, Mr. President, when you corner a dog, he bites those closest. There are American citizens and innocent Haitians who will suffer from your policies. Word should go out that the United States will seek retribution for any unfair or unjust act against American citizens. Thugs must be held accountable for human rights violations. I urge you to refrain from using U.S. troops, but continue to seek United Nations or international intervention to bring about the rule of international law and provisions of the Governors Island agreement.

Please carefully consider these suggestions. When I was working in the private sector, I was very involved in trying to restore economic development in Haiti. Until you create economic stability, this situation will not go away.
