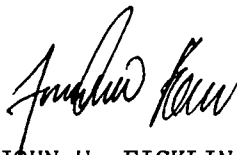

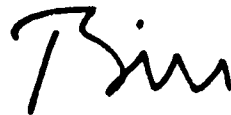

Dear Mr. President:

In recent days Cuban dictator Fidel Castro has threatened to permit another mass migration to Florida reminiscent of the 1980 Mariel boatlift. As Members of the Florida Congressional delegation, we are writing to request an immediate increase in the U.S. Navy's presence in South Florida to prevent another uncontrolled migration.

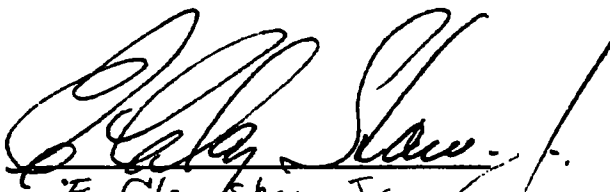
This morning 13 Members of Florida's Congressional delegation met with representatives of the State Department about current policy towards Cuba. Many of us left deeply disturbed by the fact that no Navy or Coast Guard ships have been mobilized to date. Further, detailed plans including timetables for mobilizing such assets apparently do not exist.

Mr. President, we call on you to bring Navy and Coast Guard assets into play to forestall this impending crisis.

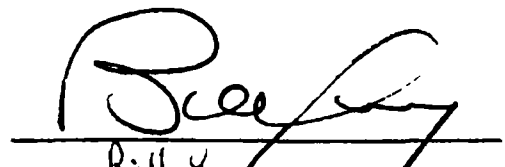
Anyone who lived through Mariel understands that a mass exodus cannot take place without the assistance of hundreds of boats from Florida. To date, the Cuban exile community in Florida has shown tremendous restraint in not playing into Castro's hand by aiding in an uncontrolled exodus. All are to be commended. We are concerned that a continued deterioration of this situation in the days ahead may drive some individuals to leave Florida for Cuba. Such a situation could quickly spin out of control.

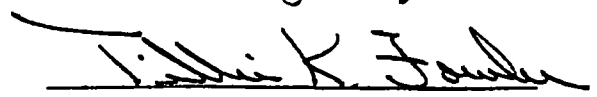
We must learn from our mistakes during Mariel. The first lesson must be that swift federal assistance is needed to prevent mass migration from Cuba. Florida simply lacks the resources to prevent such a mass migration, and we call on your help.
