Subject: Haitian Migrant Funding Plan

The Departments of State and Defense have reached agreement on the timing and procedures for the transfer of funds reimbursing Haitian migrant program costs on the basis of documented Department of Defense expenditures and consistent with the 7:5:2 ratio approved by the President for the division of costs among Defense-State-Justice.

Within available funds, the Department of State must first cover costs it is obligated to pay under agreements with third countries or international organizations. Reimbursements to the Department of Defense will be for costs identified on the previously circulated \$140,000,000 Defense expense list, subject to a determination that the Department of State has the necessary authorities to fund the specific expenditure items.

The Department of State will initially make use of available funds in the Migration and Refugee Assistance (MRA) appropriation, and funds remaining from the prior drawdown from the Emergency Refugee and Migration Assistance (ERMA) Fund, before requesting an additional ERMA Fund draw down. This sequence conforms to past practice for the use of emergency funds, ensures that FY 1994 funds will be used before no-year funds are tapped, and allows for more accurate cost estimates to be developed before the ERMA Fund is called upon.

The ERMA Fund has \$25 million available which will not be requested for any other purpose until the agreed list of Haitian migrant costs has been covered on the 7:5:2 ratio. A request for an ERMA Fund drawdown will be forwarded closer to the end of the fiscal year. In the interim the Department of Defense will refine its cost estimates, and the requirements for safehavens and other migrant costs will be clarified by the Department of State.

The Department of State has identified \$20 million in the MRA "refugee admissions" line for the purpose of reimbursement to the Department of Defense. In view of the concerns raised by Mr. Berman in his letter to Mr. Lake of July 20, 1994, we believe that it would be prudent to consult with him and the other relevant subcommittee chairmen prior to any transfer of these funds. Such consultation will address, inter alia, whether a reprogramming notice is required for the use of the \$20 million in MRA funds or any portion thereof to reimburse the Department of Defense.
