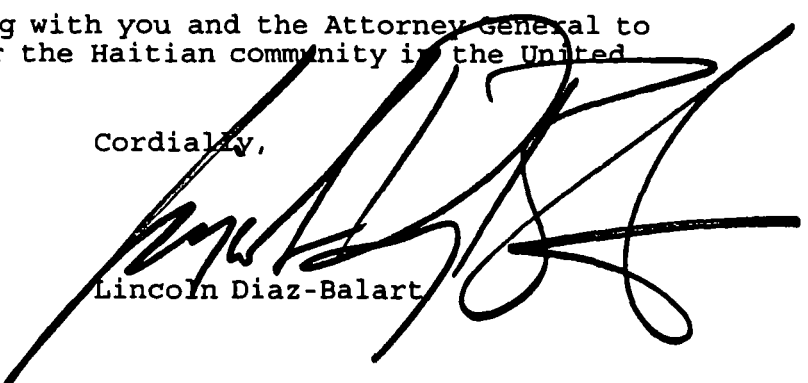
It is my understanding that legislation to remedy the concerns of the Haitian population in the United States will be introduced in the House and the Senate before the end of session this year.
