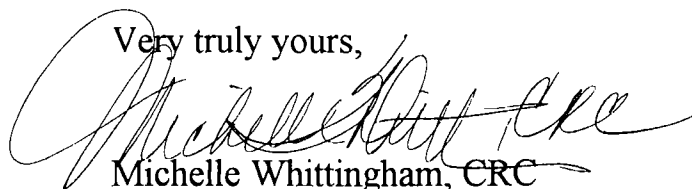

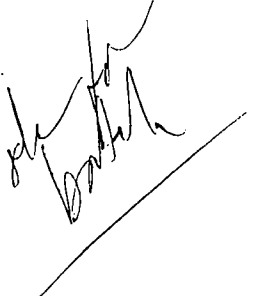

The White House Office for Women's Initiatives and Outreach, which serves as the primary liaison between The White House and America's women, was created by the Clinton Administration to better inform, respond to and listen to women across the nation.

The office's outreach efforts include a series of roundtables called **At the Table**. The roundtables, led by Administration officials, will give the Clinton Administration the opportunity to hear directly from women constituents about issues that are important to them, their families and their communities.

A report will be generated from each roundtable and submitted to The White House Office for Women's Initiatives and Outreach. The reports will be compiled and abstracted for monthly submission to the policy offices in The White House.

Several roundtables have already been held, including a series with the First Lady on working women's issues, discussions between the Vice President and local women leaders on domestic issues and a discussion between Mrs. Gore and women labor leaders. Other roundtables have been held in The White House on the U.N. Fourth World Conference on Women, focusing on domestic issues; in Chicago at a school for pregnant teenagers, focusing on education; and in Fall River, Massachusetts, focusing on working women.

President Clinton has exhibited strong leadership on women's issues and has worked steadfastly to ensure that Administration policies support women. Women across America are eager to share their concerns with The White House and to know that the President has heard their input. As women appointees, we can be the President's best representatives in listening to women and carrying their voices to the policy table.

I ask you now to join me in an important nationwide effort to reach out to women and to bring their concerns back to the President. The *At The Table* project relies on women appointees to meet with small groups of local women outside of the Beltway -- during your regular official travel or when you are home on Thanksgiving or the Holidays -- and then to report back to my office what women said. We will compile a monthly report to the President and policy-makers throughout The White House outlining women's concerns. Already, the President, the Vice President, the First Lady, Mrs. Gore and the Attorney General have gathered local women to hear their input, and we know the issues raised are having an impact inside The White House.

Please consider sitting down for an hour with local women when you go home for Thanksgiving. Many women appointees have already committed to hosting an *At The Table* discussion on the Friday after Thanksgiving. It can be as easy as getting together with your former community colleagues and asking what's on their minds. We must stress that *At The Table* is not a political activity and may not be used as such; rather, it is part of the Administration's efforts to include women in government policy and to share women's input with the President. This is about women getting the opportunity to talk to a listening ear about issues important to them.

We'll make it easy for you. You can be any level of appointee, from Schedule C to PAS. You do not need to be an expert on the President's domestic policy agenda. You merely need to be willing to spend some time listening to local women. My office will help you reach local women by providing contacts who can set up a meeting for you in any city. We'll provide a simple how-to kit with all the materials you will need, including a report-back form, and we'll help you gather any follow-up materials that would be helpful.

In January, we will include you in a White House event at which we hope to announce that women appointees have successfully held 100 *At The Table* roundtables and that you have several hundred more planned. We hope that each woman appointee will host at least one *At The Table* discussion.

Please respond to Carrie Wofford in my office, 456-7300 (or to the new women liaisons in your agency) by November 13. We'll send you a "How-To" kit and help you get set up for November 24.

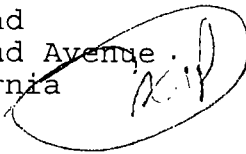
