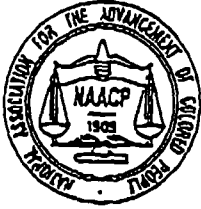

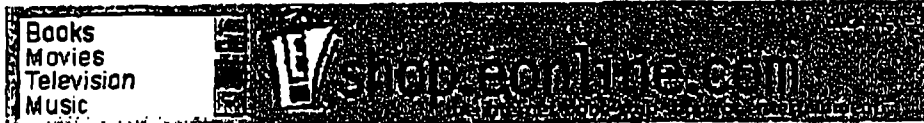

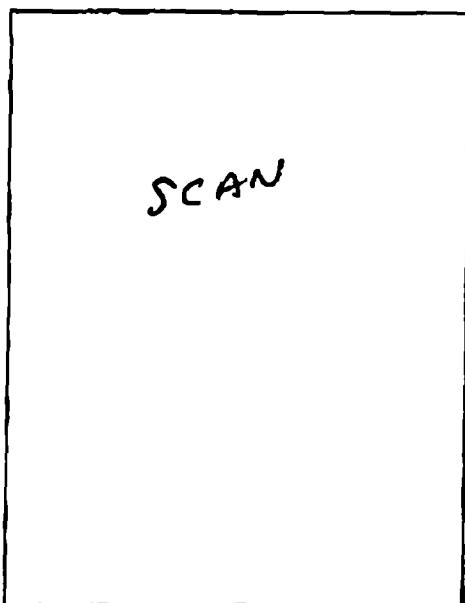

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Head Coach DENNIS GREEN



Green guided the Vikings to a 15-1 regular season record, only the third team to win 15 regular season games in NFL history and set the NFL scoring record with 556 points. For his role in the club's success, Green was named Coach of the Year by the Maxwell Club and tied for *Sports Illustrated's* Coach of the Year honors.

The youngest of five brothers, Green born February 17, 1949, grew up in Harrisburg, PA, where he earned All State honors as a running back at John Harris High School. Green also served as class president in high school. He started a season at flanker and two seasons at running back at Iowa, where he was recruited by current Vikings Vice President Frank Gilliam, then an assistant coach with the Hawkeyes. In '68, Green, who was a teammate of current Vikings

defensive backs coach Richard Solomon at Iowa, posted on of the best rushing days in school history with 175 yards and two touchdowns against Texas Christian. Green earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in '69 and '70. Following his collegiate career, Green played defensive back briefly for British Columbia of the Canadian Football League in '71.

In '93, Green, who earned his degree in recreation education at Iowa, received Pop Warner's Golden Football Award for his distinguished record of service to youth, community, country and humanity. An avid fisherman, Green hosts an annual bass tournament to benefit the Minneapolis Boys and Girls Clubs Outdoor Programs. He also serves on their Board of Directors and as a Trustee. Green also started the "Bus Green Music Team," named after his late father, to provide musical instruments and music education for inner city youth. Green also donates his time to the "Meals on Wheels" program, delivering meals to senior citizens. His other charitable endeavors include the American Red Cross, the Boys and Girls Clubs of St. Paul, the Community Bridge Consortium of Maplewood, the Epilepsy Foundation of Minnesota, Friendship Ventures in Annandale, the Minnesota Special Olympics, The PACER Center in Minneapolis, Project Offstreets in Minneapolis, the Second Harvest Food Bank of St. Paul, The Jacob Wetterling Foundation in St. Joseph and the United Negro College Fund of Minneapolis. He also enjoys playing the drums, keeping a set at the Vikings practice facility.

Dennis and his wife Marie have a daughter Vanessa Anna-Marie, and a son Zachary Dennis William. He also has two adult children, Jeremy and Patti living in the Phoenix, Arizona area.

REGINA D. JEMISON, J. D.

Ms Regina Diane Jemison was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan, and currently has a plaintiff's personal injury and criminal defense law practice in the City of Detroit. She received her Bachelor's of Business Administration from the University of Michigan and her Juris Doctorate degree from Wayne State University. After and during law school she worked for several law firms and sole proprietors. Prior to Ms. Jemison's personal law practice, she was employed at the Detroit Recorder's Court as a research attorney.

Ms Jemison is currently an active member of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church on Third at Philadelphia where the youth ministry there is her passion. She is a very involved lay leader in the church, both regionally and nationally. PROFESSIONAL BIOGRAPHY OF ATTORNEY MELISSA Z. EL

Melissa Z. El is a native of Detroit, Michigan and a product of the Detroit Public School System, where she attended Cass Technical High School. She majored in Business Administration there and went on to attend Michigan State University, where she majored in Communications and minored in Sub Saharan African History. Upon receiving her Juris Doctor Degree in 1978 from Valparaiso, Ms. El returned to Detroit and worked briefly for the City of Detroit Corporation Counsel's office. There she handled highly complex personal injury litigation and quickly established herself as a

premier trial attorney. Members of the bench and bar found her to be a well prepared and highly effective advocate. She often won victories for the City of Detroit against veteran attorneys with far more experience. Having risen quickly at the City of Detroit Law Department, Attorney El pursued private practice in 1981. Since that time, she has continued to win the praise of judges and her colleagues. Jeffrey Lee Edison is a 1969 graduate of Mumford High School, where he first became involved in student activism. He returned to Detroit and graduated from Wayne State University School of Law in December, 1975.

Mr. Edison has practiced law, primarily as a criminal defense lawyer, since May, 1976. He has recently begun a civil litigation practice. Jeffrey L. Edison is a Member, Board of Directors, National Conference of Black Lawyers (NCBL); Former National Co-Chairperson, NCBL; Former National Co-Chairperson, Criminal Justice Section, NCBL; Former President, NCBL, Michigan Chapter; Member, Board of Directors, Detroit/Wayne County Criminal Advocacy Program; and Member, Legal Redress Committee, NAACP.

Mr. Edison has lectured on various criminal justice issues and has trained lawyers on trial advocacy techniques. He has participated in various programs in correctional facilities to address prisoner concerns and has been involved in community organizing around prison issues.

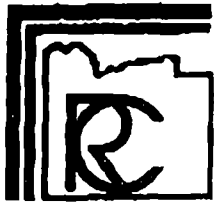

Some geography for the letter writers

To the Editor:

The ignorance of Americans regarding matters outside the United States has rarely been more apparent than in a number of recent letters alleging that the air war over Yugoslavia is somehow related to "access to the oil and gas resources of the Caspian Sea area."

Given that the majority of these letters were well written, the mind just boggles that otherwise intelligent and articulate people could be so intellectually irresponsible as to not only accept, but actually promote, such nonsense.

Even if one was not familiar with the politics and history of either the Balkans or the area adjoining the Caspian Sea, the briefest glance at a map shows that the two regions are thousands of kilometers apart and have no connection.

Yugoslavia is in southern Europe on the Adriatic Sea between Italy and Greece; the Caspian sea is a land-locked body of water in Asia, shared by Iran and a number of former Soviet republics.

There is an international controversy of sorts regarding the development of oil resources in and near the Caspian Sea, but it has nothing to do with Yugoslavia. The controversy involves the route of a pipeline necessary to carry such oil and gas to market, and the controversy is whether the pipeline should take the most direct route through Iran, or a more indirect route through the unstable former Soviet republics.

The United States, out of well earned enmity toward Iran, opposes the route through Iran and favors the route through the old Soviet republics to a terminal point on the Black Sea in our ally Turkey; whereas, the European and Japanese oil companies who would be building the pipeline favor the more direct, less costly route through Iran.

Building the pipeline through Iran would automatically invoke trade sanctions by the United States and could lead to counter-sanctions against U.S. companies.

As complex and acrimonious as the debate over the Caspian Sea pipeline may be, it is one among allies, and will be settled by traditional, boring diplomatic and trade negotiations, not by bombing.

This is not to say that the war in Yugoslavia has no effect on the oil industry. The vast majority of the world's proven reserves lie in or adjacent to Muslim countries, and failing to take action against Serbian ethnic cleansing of Muslim minorities in Kosovo and Bosnia may harden relations with these countries.

However, the Caspian Sea area is no more affected than any other Muslim region that will hold the West accountable if the West permits genocide against the Muslim minorities in Yugoslavia.
