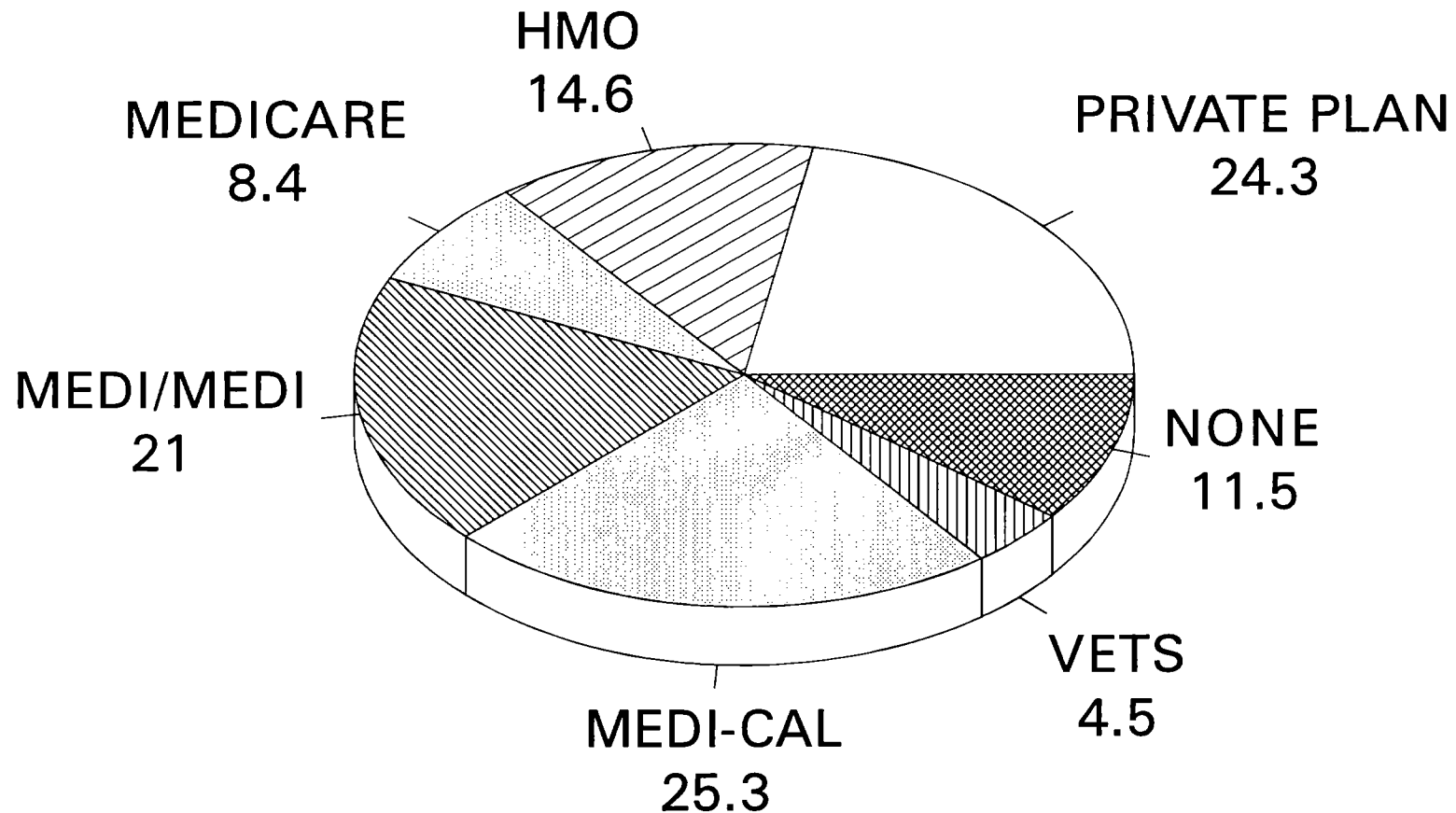

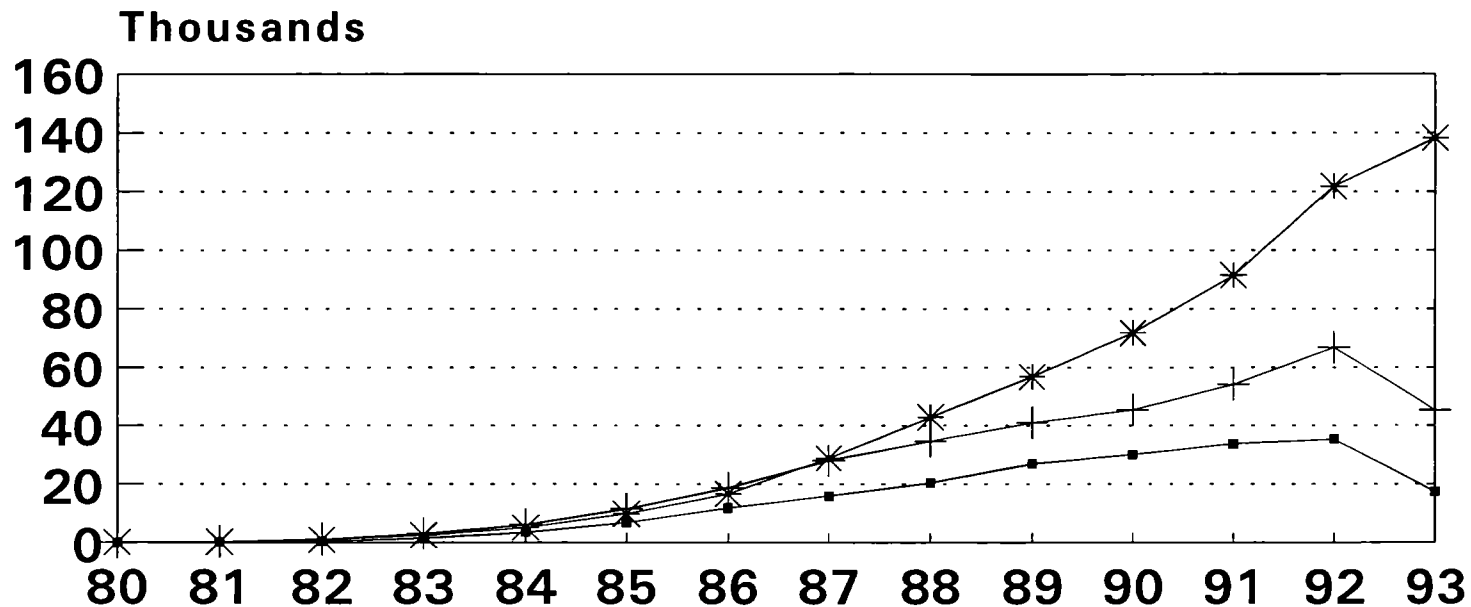

■ DECEASED + DIAGNOSED * LIVING W/AIDS

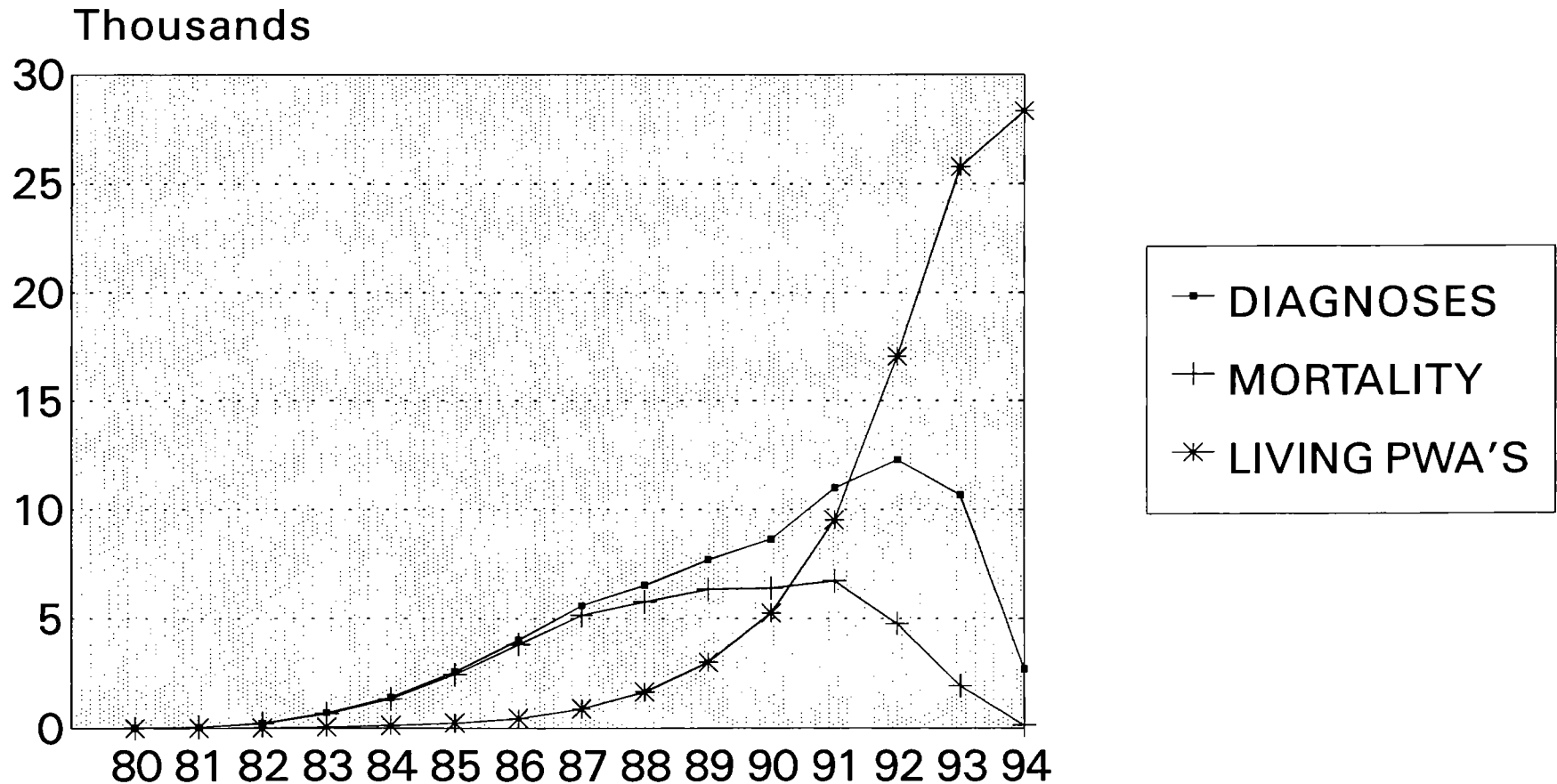

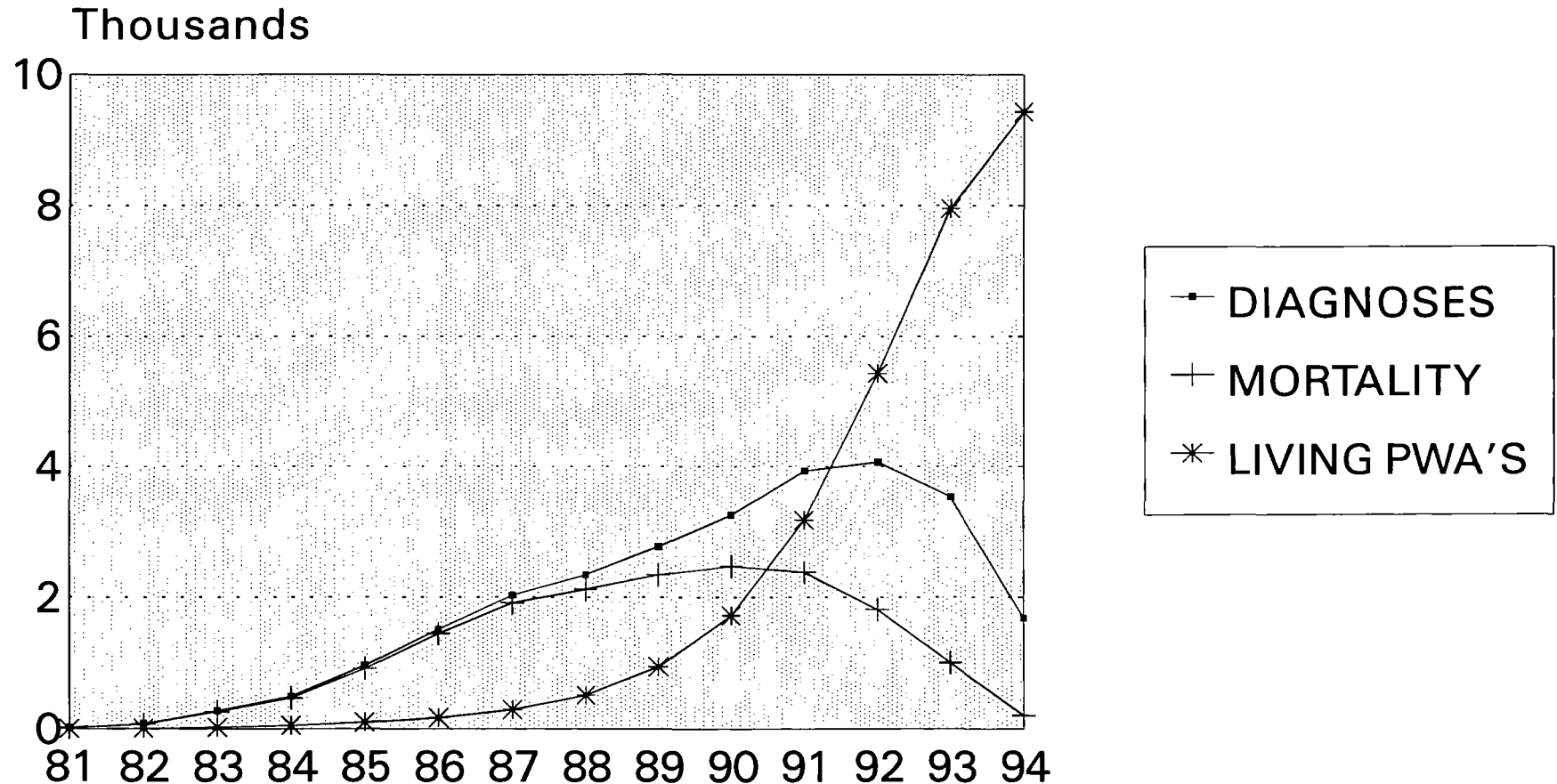

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askSam

askSam is a computer program used by the Planning Department of AIDS Project Los Angeles. This is a data-base program that allows us to enter information and re-call it by just keying in a Keyword. We have entered information from articles that relate to AIDS. Each article is assigned one or two words that are used for the Keyword.

Each entry will show the Keyword, the source or publication, date and title of the article. The text is sometimes a brief summary of the article and in some cases the entire article.

To date we have over 600 entries with Keywords ranging from AZT to Zimbabwe. We often get requests from reporters doing stories, college students doing papers and individuals needing information for speeches. The information is also valuable to the agency as a resource for information.

* UNICEF estimates that there are 80,000 orphans whose parents have died of AIDS in Zambia, 12,000 in the capital of Lusaka alone. By the year 2000, the number of AIDS orphans in Zambia will have grown to 602,415, representing 11% of children under the age of 15. 20% to 25% of Zambian women of childbearing age have HIV.

The new law, which takes effect January 1, will enable dying mothers and fathers to appoint a new guardian for their children without forcing them to give up custody of the children immediately

"AIDS to Orphan 600,000 in Zimbabwe"

* At least 600,000 children in Zimbabwe can expect to become orphaned by AIDS in the next six years, predicts a local health official. Independent experts estimate that, of Zimbabwe's population of 10 million, 60,000 individuals have AIDS, and another 800,000 are HIV carriers.

"US AIDS Orphans May Reach 125,000 in 2000, Study Says"

* US children orphaned by AIDS are projected to total between 72,000 and 125,000 by the year 2,000, according to the Orphan Project, a study group run by the Fund for the City of New York. That includes 30,000 such orphans in New York alone, the study's authors forecast. In 1993 the US CDC said AIDS cases resulting from heterosexual contact grew 130% to 9,288 from 4,045 in 1992. Overall, heterosexual AIDS cases have mushroomed to 9% of the total US caseload from less than 2% in 1985.

- * Researchers estimate that AIDS will leave more than 80,000 American children motherless by the end of this century, about 50,000 of them in just six cities. By the year 2,000, HIV will have killed the mothers of 30,000 people under the age 18 in New York City and 1,900 in Los Angeles.

"Motherless Child"

- * The AIDS epidemic will leave between 72,000 and 125,000 American children and adolescents motherless by the end of the decade, calculates Dr. David Michaels, an epidemiologist at City University of New York Medical School. "Unless increased attention and resources are devoted to this vulnerabble group, a social catastrophe is unavoidable he says.
 - * The CDC estimates that 93,000 to 112,000 healthy children will be born to HIV+ mothers between 1992 and the year 2000. Despite these projections, little is being done.

- * By the year 2000, half a million Zimbabwean children will have lost a parent to AIDS, according to National AIDS Programme Coordinator Everisto Marowa. An estimated 800,000 of Zimbabwe's 10 million people have contracted the fatal disease, as infection rates continue to skyrocket, he said.
