The Honorable Ronald H. Brown, *Secretary of Commerce*

Ron Brown was sworn in as Secretary of Commerce in January 1993 as the number one business and trade official of our country. Prior to his appointment, Mr. Brown was elected Chairman of the Democratic National Committee in 1988 and presented Bill Clinton with the most successful Democratic National Convention in a generation. Mr. Brown, who began his service to the Democratic Party in 1971 as a Mt. Vernon, New York District Leader, served as the DNC's Chief Counsel and Deputy Chair, and chaired the Task Force on Voter Rights and Voter Participation.

Following a four year Army tour in Germany and Korea, Brown began a twelve year career with the National Urban League. In 1981 Brown became a partner in the Washington, D.C. law firm Patton, Boggs and Blow. He is a member of the New York Bar, the District of Columbia Bar and the U. S. Supreme Court Bar.

The Honorable Robert J. Dole, *United States Senate, (R) Kansas*

Robert Dole has served as a member of the United States Senate representing the state of Kansas for 30 years. He has served as Senate Majority Leader and ten years as Minority Leader, which is his present position. Senator Dole is a respected policy leader with superb legislative skill. During his political career he has been Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, a two-time candidate for President, his party's nominee for Vice President, a four-term member of the House of Representatives, the Chairman of the Republican Party, a state legislator and a county attorney. He is a member of the Senate's Children's Caucus, Senate Caucus on North American Trade, Senate Caucus on the Family, Senate Human Rights Caucus and others.

During the second World War, Dole was a platoon leader in the Tenth Mountain Division in Italy where he was gravely wounded on the battlefield. His decorations include two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star with a Oakleaf Cluster. Senator Dole created the Dole Foundation to support hiring the disabled.



The Honorable John D. Rockefeller IV, *United States Senate, (D) West Virginia*

Jay Rockefeller is widely respected for service to this Nation as a policy leader, as an advocate of children and of health reform. He has been serving the people of West Virginia for more than 25 years and has been a member of the U.S. Senate since 1984. During his time in the Senate, Rockefeller has served on the Finance, Commerce, and Science and Transportation Committees. In addition, Senator Rockefeller is Chairman of the Senate Steel Caucus and the National Commission on Children. He also serves on the Senate Steering Committee on Democratic Policy and is a member of the Rural Health Caucus, Drug Enforcement Caucus, Coal Caucus and others.

Prior to joining the Senate, Rockefeller was elected to a two-year term in the West Virginia House of Delegates. He then served four years as Secretary of State, three years as President of West Virginia Wesleyan College and eight years as Governor.

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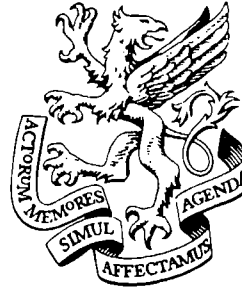

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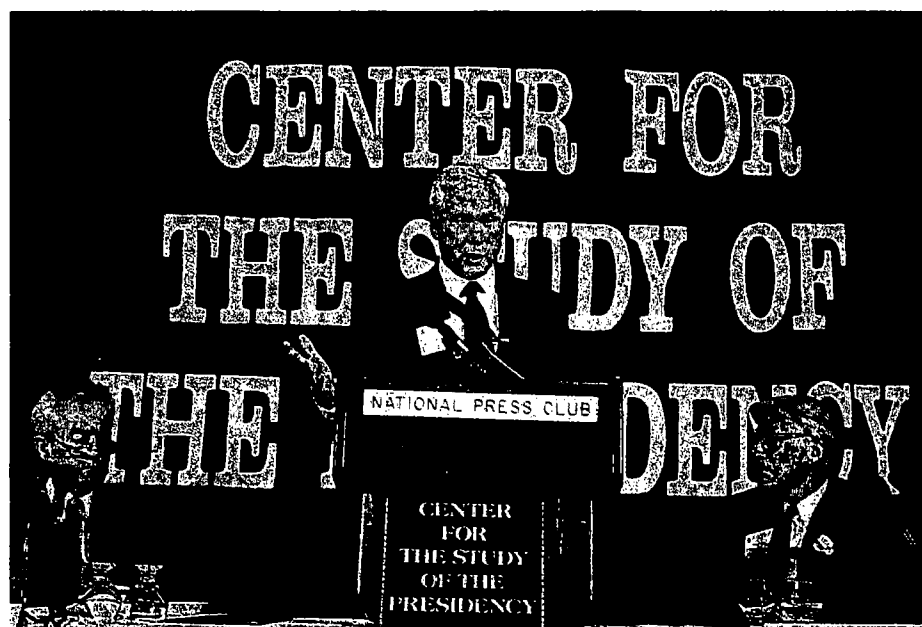
