Resolution Supporting Efforts to Increase the Minimum Wage

WHEREAS Business and Professional Women/USA (BPW/USA) is the leader in fighting for economic equity for women; and

WHEREAS women are disproportionately clustered in low-income, minimum wage positions; and

WHEREAS 4.2 million people earn the minimum wage, half of whom provide 50 percent of their family's income and two-thirds of whom are women; and

WHEREAS an individual working full-time at the current minimum wage of \$4.25 per hour will earn only \$9,000 per year, well below the poverty level for a family of four; and

WHEREAS raising the minimum wage is an enabling tool to achieving some of the goals of the Fair Pay Act, BPW's principal public policy priority; now therefore be it

RESOLVED that BPW/USA supports efforts to raise the minimum wage; and be it

RESOLVED further that BPW/USA urges Congress to adopt legislation raising the minimum wage, thus showing a commitment to strengthening the American family's ability to be self-sufficient.
