EXECUTIVE RESIDENCE HVAC PROJECT

Proposed work schedule

Increased daily access on a sustained basis to the Second and Third Floor, as well as the Attic is absolutely critical in preparation for the new mechanical equipment which will provide conditioned air to the First Family, and other areas of the Second and Third Floors; these areas must be completed as one unit. An average of six working hours per day, at least five days a week will be required to meet the schedule. It is requested that the contractor be allowed access to the Attic and Third Floor (except Exercise Room and Solarium) immediately after Chelsea departs for school each morning. Access to the Second Floor will be permitted after the President and Mrs. Clinton have left the floor according to their daily schedules. If events are required on the Second Floor, the work schedule will be adjusted as necessary. However, it should be emphasized that advance notification of planned events in the First Family's living quarters is imperative to allow work schedules to be adjusted to continue work as efficiently and economically as possible - the government must pay the labor costs for all contractors on site whether they actually work or not.

April 25 - May 8

Work required includes the installation of new ductwork for the Second and Third Floor (requires access from each floor and is noisy), and approximately one fourth of the ductwork in the Attic remains to be completed. Both floors require the installation of control system components above ceilings and in the walls. Temporary piping will continue to be installed outside the East elevation to the roof.

May 9 - May 12

Work will begin immediately after Chelsea departs for school each day and continue until approximately 5:00 pm on the Second Floor and until 7:00 pm on the Third Floor and Attic. Required work will include duct installation and control system component installation.

May 13 - June 25

Work will continue with the assembly of the North Portico air handlers, duct work installation, and control system installation.

TEMPORARY SYSTEMS

Note: The concept of temporary systems utilization is totally dependent on the completion of the North Portico air handlers, duct and control system completion in the Attic, Second, and Third Floors. Failure to complete this work by the first week in July will result in delaying the start of the following critical work until the summer of 1996.

June 26 - July 27

STATE FLOOR

Two large portable units capable of both cooling and heating will be placed on the south center portion of the main roof by crane. Two holes will be cut through the roof deck to allow ductwork to be tied into the existing systems. This will supply nearly all of the State Floor except the East Room

One large portable unit will be placed on or adjacent to the East Terrace to provide conditioned air to the East Room through diffusers cut into the wall panels in front of the filled in windows or through existing ducts.

Note: There will be no appreciable detrimental aesthetic or comfort impact on the State Floor, required presidential events/functions will be possible; although a reduced number of discretionary functions are desirable.

GROUND FLOOR

A small portable unit will be placed on a mezzanine level in the Ground Floor Chair Room to supply the Center Hall through existing diffusers - if possible, and the Curator's Office and USSS through temporary ducts. The Diplomatic Reception Room will be supplied through the existing diffusers. The remaining rooms will require window air conditioning units.

July 28 (Request First Family out for weekend)

Existing Ground Floor, State (1st) Floor, Basement Mezzanine, and Basement air supply distribution system is shut off and isolated in the Basement Mezzanine Ductspace from the rest of the building.

Temporary systems for conditioned air are enabled to supply the State Floor and Ground Floor.

Asbestos abatement and duct demolition begins in the Basement Mezzanine - (completion by August 25). Begin demolition of all airhandlers in the Basement Fan Room, some asbestos abatement will be required.

August 12 - September 4

First Family NOT in the Residence - on Vacation (NO HOUSEGUEST)

Work will be accelerated throughout period; concentrating on remaining demolition, asbestos abatement, permanent duct and control system installation in the First Family's living quarters as well as remainder of the Second and Third Floor.

December 4

State Floor temporary systems removal to be completed, air distribution transferred to new permanent system. Ground Floor will remain on temporary systems until late spring.

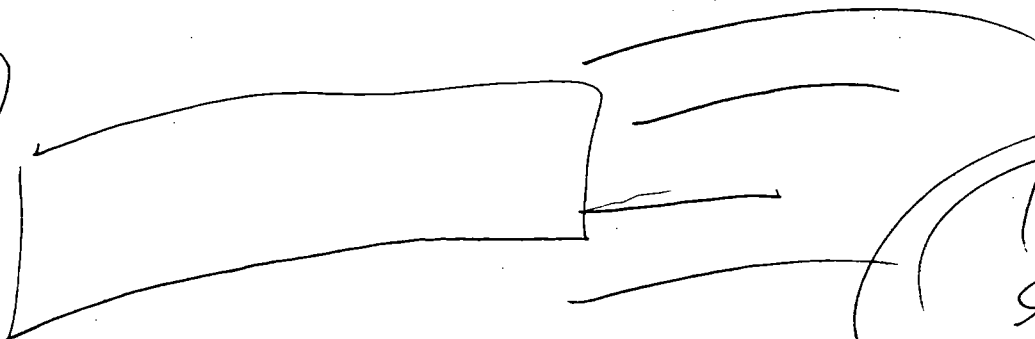
