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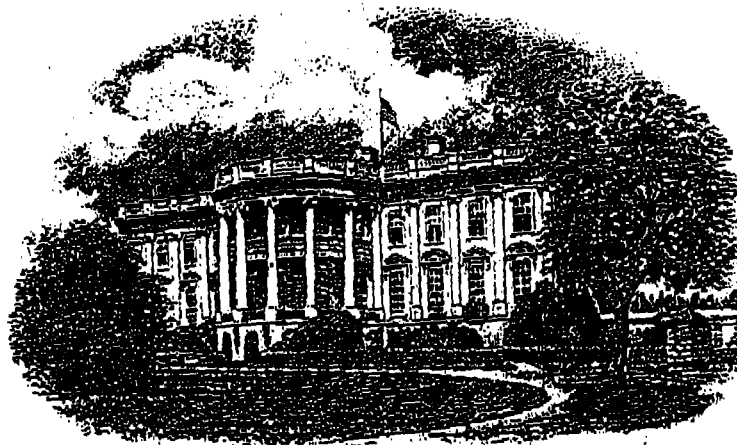

TALKING POINTS ON JUSTICE DEPARTMENT BRIEF
DEFENDING CONSTITUTIONALITY OF RFRA

- The Justice Department has filed a brief strongly supporting the constitutionality of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act, or "RFRA."
- The Justice Department brief, filed last week in the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, reflects the Administration's firm support for RFRA, which President Clinton signed into law at a special White House ceremony in November 1993.
- When he signed RFRA, President Clinton observed that the statute "affirm[s] the historic role that people of faith have played in the history of this country and the constitutional protections those who profess and express their faith have always demanded and cherished."
- The Justice Department affirmatively chose to intervene in the pending litigation when the defendants challenged RFRA's constitutionality. The Department's brief sets forth Congress' authority to enact RFRA and explains that RFRA's express purpose is to protect and promote the free exercise of religion against state intrusion.
- RFRA specifically provides that even in the case of a law that does not discriminate against religion, the government may not substantially burden a person's exercise of religion unless there is a compelling governmental interest and the government has adopted the least restrictive means of furthering that interest.
- The pending Fourth Circuit case involves a claim by a Virginia state prisoner that, under RFRA, the Virginia Department of Corrections is required to provide him with the Kosher diet required by his religion. In defending the suit, the Virginia Department of Corrections has challenged the constitutionality of RFRA, asserting that Congress lacks authority to compel states to comply with the statute.

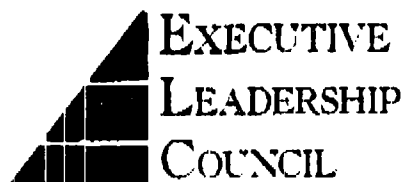

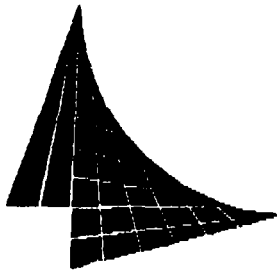

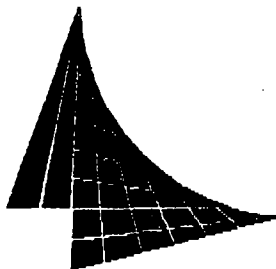
