The fourth session of the New Paradigm seminar will take place on Thursday, December 8, from 4:00 to 6:00 pm in the Library of the Woodrow Wilson Center, located at 1000 Jefferson Drive, SW.

This session will begin to articulate the larger policy and strategy implications of the New Paradigm, transcending polarization in response to the job downsizing, increasing economic insecurity and political backlash.

Barbara Brandt is coming from Cambridge to report on a network of organizations committed to shorter work-time as an alternative to downsizing, better reflecting human needs and values. **Jeremy Rifkin**, author of *The End of Work*, will discuss the long-term economic changes and corporate development required by the New Paradigm. **Sondra Myers** of the National Endowment for the Humanities will discuss the larger philosophical implications and **Eileen Boris** of Howard University will discuss the historical battle that resulted in the eight-hour day.

We will also discuss directions we wish to pursue when we continue the seminar next year. New approaches to welfare, child support, child care, pay equity, and access to good jobs, and, more generally, ways to restructure the economy to better meet the needs of women and men, children and adults will all be on our agenda.

WDCU, Turning Up The Power

Channel 50 Drops Protest to 'Jazz 90'

They're juicing up the jazz at WDCU, which has won a seven-year battle to increase its signal at 90.1 FM.

Victory came last week when WFTY/Channel 50 dropped its opposition to a power increase on the radio-TV tower adjacent to a new tower at Ninth and Peabody streets NW. Channel 50's signal is beamed from atop the new tower.

WDCU-FM General Manager Edith Smith said yesterday that "Jazz 90" expects to move to the top of the older tower and increase its power to 50,000 watts from 6,800 watts by June. She said engineering studies indicate that the improved signal will fill in reception gaps in Southeast and Northeast Washington and expand the signal beyond the city. That should give the station, owned by the University of the District of Columbia, a shot at 900,000 more listeners.

The radio station won approval from the Federal Communications Commission in 1988 to increase power. But before the boost could take place, WDCU reapplied to the FCC to move the signal to the new tower now occupied by Channel 50. The move was okayed, but the then-owners of the TV station claimed that the radio signal would interfere with the District's police and fire antennas on the tower and with its own signal. Smith said.

WDCU commissioned three engineering studies, which concluded there would be no airwave disruption if it stayed on the older tower and boosted its signal. At a Wednesday meeting between the two sta-

and David Burd late last year. Madagement now says a new morning show will be unveiled around April 15.

Program Director Steve Streit said Sunday that Kevin Gossett—who programs hot adult contemporary WGRD-FM and WLHT-FM in Grand Rapids, Mich., and hosts their morning show—has been hired on for the early stint at WASH. He replaces Bill Worthington, who agreed to take over on a temporary basis following Baker and Burd's departure. Streit said Gossett will be in town soon to learn the area, make sales calls and do some production work and overnight shifts to get acquainted with the soft-rock station's studio.

News anchor Bob Madigan, hired in January, will continue to be a part of the morning show. Streit acknowledged that he had considered pairing afternoon voice Randi Martin with Gossett but thinks it's unlikely.

"Randi may audition with him, but she is doing so well in afternoons that I don't want to cannibalize her show," Streit said, noting that Martin has shown little enthusiasm for getting up before the sun.

Worthington said Sunday that he'll look for another job in radio. "It's all I've ever done"—and may try to do some commercial voiceovers. Before signing on at WASH last summer, he had worked for many years at WMZQ-AM/FM (1390/98.7).

In a Buying Groove

Craig Ashwood managed to turn some heads during his Saturday shopping spree at Nobody Beats the Wiz in Rockville.

Ashwood, the program director of WARW-FM (94.7), tossed into his cart \$600 worth of CDs featuring rock-and-roll hits from the late '60s through the early '80s—and he was happy to tell the dazzled onlookers that he was adding to the CBS station's playlist.

It was a different story in November, when the station made its sudden switch from the "continuous soft hits" format. Ashwood headed to Tower Records to stock up in anticipation of the change, but couldn't tell the folks there the real reason he was buying \$1,000 worth of CDs. Instead, the Australian had a bit of fun with those who asked about the big purchase.

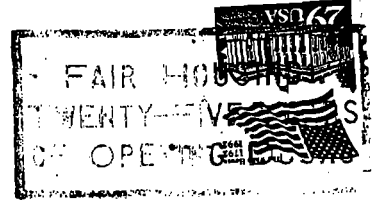
