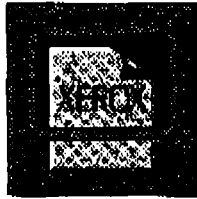

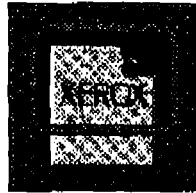

About the Baltimore Alumni Chapter

Ten years after the founding of KAPPA ALPHA PSI Fraternity at Indiana University in 1911, the Baltimore Alumni Chapter was chartered on September 9, 1921. The founders consisted of a banker, a lawyer, a physician, three pharmacists and two educators. From this distinguished nucleus has evolved a seventy-five year parade of professional men dedicated to the concept of ACHIEVEMENT IN EVERY FIELD OF HUMAN ENDEAVOR. The present chapter of 200 Brothers in Phi Nu Pi reflects this ideal.

The chapter has a history of aid to, and development of, youth. It has expanded the fraternity's National Guide Right Program into a year round activity. Young men of middle and high school age engage in tutorial programs, leadership training, ski trips, swimming, SAT training and attendance at pro sports games. We have been a 35 year sponsor of the James Mosher Little League. We have adopted the Calvin Rodwell Elementary School and operate a reading program there. Kappas are members of BIG BROTHERS and life members of the NAACP.

The chapter maintains Kappa Alpha Psi Student Revolving Loan Funds at Coppin State College, Morgan State University and Towson State University and contributes to these funds annually. We have contributed \$25,000 to the Kappa Alpha Psi Foundation for scholarships and established our own Foundation of Metropolitan Baltimore. The United Negro College Fund has been a beneficiary of our concern for African-American education.

The Baltimore Alumni Chapter contributes to local charities annually. In 1995 the chapter awarded over \$20,000 to 20 charities. A unique contribution was made to the Nehemiah project to pay the closing costs on a dwelling for a disadvantaged family. Our annual Thanksgiving dinner for senior citizens attracted 250 this past year and was followed by distribution of 80 Christmas baskets to the needy.

A glance at the roster of the Baltimore Alumni Chapter currently shows high achievement among its members which include (1) in the United States State Department, (1) State Senator, (15) physicians, (14) attorneys, (16) educators, (9) dentists, (12) Ph.D.'s, (3) C.P.A.'s, (45) executives and administrators, (1) veterinarian. A myriad of occupations find our members making contributions to society and the community at large. Eight members have been inducted into athletic Halls of Fame.

Within the fraternity we have furnished both national and regional (Province) officers. One of our members, Dr. G. James Fleming, received the Laurel Wreath, the fraternity's highest award. The second highest award, the Elder Watson Diggs Award, was bestowed upon Dr. I.W.E. Taylor and Charles G. Tildon, Jr. Richard Edwards received the distinguished Guy L. Grant Award given to outstanding undergraduates. Howard L. Tutman, Jr., former Eastern Province Polemarch and Grand Board member is the current Senior Grand Vice Polemarch of the fraternity. Other members of the Baltimore Alumni Chapter, too numerous to name, have ably served and are serving as officers on the provincial and national levels. Additionally, Silhouette Elva Edwards serves on the national Kappa Alpha Psi, Inc. Foundation.

Socially the Annual Night in Kappa Vegas is the premiere event. The chapter also sponsors a Morgan Homecoming Fest. For our Silhouettes we have the Annual Black and White Ball, Christmas and Valentine parties.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

Thank for your letter urging the completion of the review of James Webster Smith's separation from the United States Military Academy on June 26, 1874.

As with the case of Johnson Chestnut Whittaker, I assure you that the Secretary of the Army is conducting a thorough review of this matter and should provide a recommendation relatively soon. I understand that this review has proven to be more difficult than Mr. Whittaker's, because there is less material readily available concerning Mr. Smith's tenure at the Academy.

I recognize your concern for timely completion of Mr. Smith's review. I can assure you that, as in Mr. Whittaker's case, I will not hesitate to grant Mr. Smith a commission if the review so warrants.

Thank you again for writing. I look forward to working with you on this important issue.

Dear Mr. President:

Section 555 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 1995 directed the Secretary of the Army to conduct a thorough review of the discharge from the Corps of Cadets of the United States Military Academy of James Webster Smith in 1874 and Johnson C. Whittaker in 1880.

I am proud to participate with you today in posthumously commissioning Johnson C. Whittaker in the Army. This recognition that Cadet Whittaker suffered a terrible injustice is long overdue. I congratulate the Army on its courage in acknowledging that, over 100 years ago, Cadet Whittaker was incorrectly and inappropriately denied his commission.

On the occasion of Lieutenant Whittaker's commissioning, I urge you and the Secretary of the Army to complete the review of James Webster Smith's discharge at the earliest possible date and, if determined to be appropriate, grant Cadet Smith a commission in the Army.

Timely completion of the review of the circumstances surrounding the discharge of Cadet Smith will bring these events in our history to a conclusion. I am optimistic that we will meet again soon to recognize Cadet Smith as yet another son of South Carolina who served his Country proudly.
