John Allen Buggs, former Executive Director of the United States Commission on Civil Rights (USCCR), passed on March 7, 1995 at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles after a long struggle with Alzheimer's Disease and other conditions.

Buggs a native of Brunswick, GA was born in 1915 to Leonora Clark and Dr. John Wesley Buggs, southern Georgia's first Black physician.

Buggs received a BA in History from Dillard University in New Orleans, LA and an MA in Sociology from Fisk University in Nashville, TN. He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Sociology from Chapman College in Santa Ana, CA.

His long and distinguished career in civil rights and community relations began in 1942 in Florida, where he was appointed Director of Fesenden Academy in Marion County. During the same period 1942-1951 he also served as Executive Secretary

of the Marion County NAACP and as Co Chair of the Florida State Committee on School Integration.

Buggs moved to LA where he served as Executive Director of the Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations from 1954-1967, and gained national prominence as a peacemaker and truthsayer in the aftermath of the 1965 Watts riots.

Buggs served under President Carter as the Staff Director of the Model Cities Administration at HUD 1967 to 1969. From 1969-1971 he served as Vice President of Field Operations for the National Urban Coalition. In 1971 Buggs was appointed by President Nixon to the post of Executive Director of United States Commission on Civil Rights (USCCR) in Washington, DC where he also served under President Ford..

Buggs retired in 1978 after suffering a stroke, and was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease in 1993. He came back to LA in 1994 where he was cared for by the staff at the St John of God nursing hospital until shortly before his death.

Taylor III; two grandsons, Robbie John Dix, a senior at Morehouse College and William R. Taylor IV, "Will", a sophomore at Cornell University; Sister-in-law Maggie Buggs and many nieces, nephews and cousins.

Funeral services will be held at 1:00 p.m. Monday, March 13, 1995 at St. Philip's Episcopal Church, 2800 Stanford Ave., (1 block east of San Pedro St, 3 blocks south of Adams Blvd.) LA, CA. The Reverend Dr. Jesse Moses will officiate; Father James Temple and the Pastor, Reverend Altagracia Perez will assist. Former Mayor Tom Bradley will participate.

John Allen Buggs; Led U.S. Commission on Civil Rights

John Allen Buggs, former director of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights who was a leading advocate for the black community after the 1965 Watts riots and then an adviser to three Presidents, has died.

A daughter, Zara Gale Taylor, said her father was 79 and died Tuesday at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center after a long struggle with Alzheimer's disease.

Buggs began his 53-year career in community relations in Florida and moved in the early 1950s to Los Angeles, where he rose to national prominence as a peace-maker in the aftermath of the Watts riots.

He served under Presidents Richard M. Nixon, Gerald R. Ford and Jimmy Carter as executive director of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights and as staff director of the Model Cities Administration at

the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

He came to the federal commission in 1971 after serving on the Los Angeles County Human Relations Commission from 1954 to 1967. Buggs retired in 1978 after a stroke.

Born in Brunswick, Ga., Buggs was the son of southern Georgia's first black physician, Dr. Charles Wesley Buggs, the family said.

He served as executive director of the NAACP in Marion County, Fla., and was co-chairman of the Florida State Committee on School Integration before moving with his family to California.

In addition to his daughter, Buggs is survived by his wife of 52 years, Mary Gale (Polly) Buggs, another daughter, Diane D. Dix, and two grandsons.

Funeral services are scheduled for Monday at 1 p.m. at St. Philip's

DALLAS—Morris Bernard (M.B.) Zale, a poor Russian immigrant who dropped out of school in the sixth grade but founded a \$1.2-billion jewelry company based on an inventive concept, has died at 93.

Zale, founder of the Dallas-based Zale Corp., died Wednesday of complications from pneumonia, said his son, Donald Zale, chairman and chief executive officer of the chain when it was sold in 1986.

Morris Zale was credited with revolutionizing jewelry retailing in the United States by using bold newspaper ads and gifts to attract customers, extending credit to the working class, and offering a profit-sharing program, sales training and corporate child-care center to his employees.

Zale emigrated from Russia with his family in 1908. The family

John Allen Buggs, 79, Is Dead; Worked for Civil Rights Panel

John Allen Buggs, an expert in community relations who was the staff director of the United States Civil Rights Commission for much of the 1970's, died on Tuesday at Cedars-Sinai Hospital in Los Angeles. He was 79.

He had Alzheimer's disease, his family said.

Mr. Buggs retired after suffering a stroke in 1978. In addition to his work on the Civil Rights Commission, he had served as staff director of the Model Cities Administration in the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

He was the Civil Rights Commission's deputy staff director before he became acting director in 1971, and then permanent director.

In that post he was often outspoken. In 1971 he contended, before a House Judiciary subcommittee, that Federal agencies were ignoring open-housing laws or enforcing them ineffectively. In 1972, writing about New York, he argued that "racial and ethnic data are essential in order to help assess the nature and extent of discrimination in city employment."

The reports prepared by the commission while he was its director include "A Generation Deprived: Los Angeles School Desegregation" (1977).

Mr. Buggs was with the Los Angeles County Human Relations Commission from 1954 to 1967 and became widely known for his peace-making after the 1965 riots in the city's Watts section.

Earlier he was an official with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in Marion County, in north-central Florida, and co-chairman of the Florida State Committee on School Integration.

A doctor's son, he was born in Brunswick, Ga. and earned a B.A. in history at Dillard University in New Orleans and an M.A. in sociology from Fisk University in Nashville.

He is survived by his wife of 52 years, Mary Gale Buggs, who is known as Polly; two daughters, Zara Taylor and Diane Dix, and two grandsons.

His long and distinguished career in civil rights and community relations began in 1942 in Florida where he was appointed Director of Fessenden Academy in Marion County, an experimental boarding high school for Black students which taught self-reliance, independence of thought and racial pride.

During this same period (1942-1951), John also served as Executive Secretary of the Marion County NAACP, and as Co-chair of the Florida State Committee on School Intergration. Having received numerous death threats, he often went armed while leading voter registration drives and delivering speeches.

In 1951, John moved his family to Los Angeles, where he was a social case worker and deputy probation officer until his appointment in 1954 as Executive Director of the Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations, the oldest and most prestigious race relations agency in the nation. John served in this position for 13 years and gained national prominence as a peacemaker and a truthsayer during the Watts Riot in August of 1965, saying prophetically, "...it would be sheer folly to ignore the signs and signals that are being hoisted everyday in Los Angeles, and in every major city of this nation, by the dissatisfied, the disaffected and the disappointed...if we do not exercise concern and join with those who now feel that they have a part of the power in their hands, and help them use it wisely and well, we may have more Augusts in Los Angeles and other communities throughout the nation."

John served under President Carter as Staff Director of the Model Cities Administration at HUD from 1967-1969.

John served as Vice President of Field Operations for the National Urban Coalition from 1969-1971.

In 1971, John was appointed by President Nixon to the post of Executive Director of the United States Commission on Civil Rights, an independent Federal watchdog agency in Washington, D.C. where he also served under President Ford.

John retired in 1978 after suffering a massive stroke, and was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease in 1993. He came back to Los Angeles in 1994, where he was cared for by the extraordinary staff at St. John of God Nursing Hospital until shortly before his death at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center.

John was a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and the Boule, and held offices in various organizations including the National Association of Intergroup Relations Officials, Anytown USA, and the Episcopal Society for Cultural and Racial Unity.

He received the "Bishops Award of Merit," from the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles, the John Anson Ford Award from the County Human Relations Commission, and the Brotherhood Award from the National Conference of Christians and Jews, among many others.

John is survived by MaryGale "Polly" Buggs, his wife of 52 years; their two daughters, Diane D. Dix and ZaraGale Taylor; sons-in-law, Robbie Dix III, and William R. Taylor III; two grandsons, Robbie John Dix, a senior at Morehouse College and William R. Taylor IV, "Will," a sophomore at Cornell University; sister-in-law, Maggie Buggs and many nieces, nephews, and cousins.

I am writing this from my hospital bed at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke Medical Center, where I am recovering from congestive heart failure.

You must know how much I want President Clinton and his wife to inhabit the White House for the next four years.
