Because the number of police survivors has dramatically increased over the years and the costs associated with National Police Week are phenomenal, the COPS National Board has initiated a registration fee for all Seminar participants who did not lose a loved one in 1994. The registration fee for each adult is \$100 and the registration fee for each child under the age of 18 is \$25.

If there is a family that truly needs the support of the COPS seminars and finds the registration fee to be a hardship, they may call the COPS National Office to request a Registration Waiver Form. The scholarship committee will review the incoming requests for this waiver.

The Thomas Cook Travel Agency is our "official travel agent". By making air reservations through this agency you will help COPS secure air passes to provide transportation for seminar support staff. Please call 800-544-2855. They will provide you with quality service and secure discounted rates for your air travel.

If you are planning to travel by automobile, directions to the hotel should be requested from the hotel when you make your room reservations. Parking at the Radisson is \$5.00 per day, \$5.00 at the Sheraton and no charge at the Ramada.

The 14th Annual Peace Officers' Memorial Service is hosted by the United States Park Police.

I. REPORTING TIME AND STAGING -

- A. All personnel wishing to participate should report no later than 0900 hours to the staging area located on the Mall, between 3rd and 4th Streets on Madison Drive. (A)
- B. Agencies attending the service with state and departmental flags may unload their equipment at the designated parking areas on the Mall, and enter from 4th and Jefferson Drive, S.W. (B) ***ONLY STATE, DEPARTMENTAL, OR ORGANIZATIONAL FLAGS CAN BE CARRIED. THE HOST AGENCY WILL BE THE ONLY BEARER OF THE NATIONAL COLORS.**
- C. All escort/representative officers must report in at the staging area off of Madison Drive no later than 0900 hours (C).

II. UNIFORM OF THE DAY -

- A. All personnel participating and/or attending the Service should wear "Class A" dress uniform. All shields/badges are to be covered with a black sash.

III. PARKING -

- A. Out-of-state marked cruisers are to park on the inner gravel pathways, on the Mall, in a parallel manner (D).
- B. Reserved parking for the survivors' buses will be on the east curb of 4th Street, between Jefferson and Madison Drives. Committee parking will be on the left curb of Jefferson Drive and media parking will be on the right curb of Jefferson Drive (E).
- C. Guest speakers, Chiefs of Police, VIPs, and handicapped parking will be on Madison Drive, from 3rd to 4th Streets (F).
- D. The subway (METRO) is available to the area. The closest stops are located at the Smithsonian Station (12th Street and Jefferson Drive) and Federal Center, at 3rd and D Street, S.W.

IV. COFFEE AND DOUGHNUTS -

- A. Coffee and doughnuts will be provided to those in attendance from the hours of 0830 until 1030 on Jefferson Drive at 4th Street (G).

V. SPECTATORS -

- A. All personnel and civilians coming to the Memorial Service should respond to the center panels of the Mall between 3rd and 4th Streets. Please leave clear the areas immediately behind the stage and the center pathway from 4th Street. Unless you are a survivor, do not sit in the seating area cordoned off in the center area.
- B. Surviving family members of officers killed in previous years may report to the Host Hotel's lower level no later than 0900 hours, if they want transportation to the service, otherwise, they may report directly to the Mall. 1994 surviving families must report to the Ballroom of the Radisson Plaza Hotel, 5000 Seminary Road, Alexandria, Virginia, no later than 0900 hours for assembling for their participation in the service.

VI. RESTROOMS -

- A. Comfort stations are located in the Air and Space Museum and in the National Gallery of Art. In addition, porta-johns will be provided at 4th and Madison Drive (H).

VII. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES -

- Emergency medical services will be available in the middle of the block on Fourth Street between Madison and Jefferson Drives, and at Third and Jefferson, adjacent to U.S. Park mobile command (I)

- A. In order to achieve a more ceremonial Service, all commands for movements and/or honors will be voiced by the Officer-in-Charge of the United States Park Police Honor Guard. Immediately following the service, the wreath will be posted on the podium where photo opportunities will be permissible.
- B. Personnel are reminded that this is a Memorial Service, and that many government officials, members of the media, and the public in general will be in attendance. If one of the volunteers on the Police Week Committee asks you to do something, please follow these requests.
- C. All attendees are encouraged to bring bottled water to the service.

A. Travel Time Services is the "official travel agency" for the FOP during National Police Week 1995. Call 1-800-777-4203 for hotel and air reservations. Also contact Washington, D.C. Accommodations 1-800-554-2220 to make hotel reservations.

All armed law enforcement personnel must have police identification in their possession. Armed law enforcement officers, in uniform and possessing police identification, will be permitted to enter the U.S. Capitol and the House and Senate Office Buildings. Law enforcement officers not in uniform will be required to check their weapons prior to admittance to any Congressional building.

Federal Aviation Administration regulations require police officers transporting firearms aboard airplanes to declare to the airline that the weapon is in the luggage. The weapon must be unloaded and secured in a hard-sided suitcase. Please allow extra time at the airport to file the necessary paperwork with the airline.
