(MACK'S REMARKS)

- I want to briefly mention a couple of staff changes that have been the focus of some speculation over the past few weeks, but which should simply restate the obvious for most of you.

- As you know, Bruce Lindsey has worn two hats since Bill Clinton came to office in January. Not only has he served as the President's confidential advisor on a wide range of issues, Bruce took on the huge responsibility of staffing the entire federal government as Director of Personnel.

- Bruce and the entire Personnel office have done a great job and have at least identified more than 80% of all the Senate-confirmed appointments.

- The President has now asked Bruce to move full time into the advisory role only he can perform. As senior advisor to the President, Bruce will be a liaison between the President and the outreach operations of the White House.

- Over the next few weeks Bruce will wind down his involvement in Personnel and, as soon as the Congress adjourns he will turn over the reins of that office to Phil Lader, who will assume the position in addition to his current duties as Deputy Director for Management at OMB.

- John Emerson, currently a Deputy Director of Personnel, will move into a new position with Bruce.

- As you all know, Phil Lader is a long-time, trusted friend of the President and First Lady, a successful businessman, and college president. We believe this handoff will be smooth and productive for the entire White House.
