PURPOSE:

To present the 1994 National Medal of Science and the 1994
National Medal of Technology (the Nation's highest honors
given for achievements in science and technology) and honor
the recipients, and to give a Science and Technology policy
Speech focusing on the Administration's accomplishments
and goals, and economic impact.

BACKGROUND:

The National Medal of Science was established in August
1959 to provide recognition for Americans who make
outstanding contributions in the physical, biological,
mathematical, engineering sciences, and social and behavioral
sciences (P.L. 86-209). This is the nation's highest science
award. Under this statute, not more than 20 individuals
shall be awarded the Medal of Science annually. This year
there are eight individuals, selected from a group
recommended by the President's Committee on the National
Medal of Science.

Mandated by Congress in 1980 and awarded annually by the
President of the United States, the National Medal of
Technology is our nation's highest technology award.
Recognizing excellence in technological innovation and
commercialization, it is awarded to our country's economic

heroes. These historic American individuals, teams and companies have all significantly contributed to American job creation, economic prosperity, increased competitiveness and a higher standard of living. There are six individual awards this year, two awards to corporations.

The National Medal of Science and the National Medal of Technology offer the opportunity for the Administration to project its message that "technology is the engine of economic growth" and "science the fuel of technology's engine" by highlighting those individuals and companies that have made a tremendous economic difference for the United States. This is an opportunity to tell our story through the successes of real people.

These Presidential Medals also offer an excellent opportunity to underscore the Administration's commitment to scientific and technological innovation and to reach out to the technological business and university communities. The Board of the Foundation for the National Medals of Science and Technology consists of twenty leading American high-tech executives who can become allies in communicating the Administration's policies and achievements.

Previous administrations failed to capitalize on these opportunities. Through the National Medal of Science and the National Medal of Technology we can show that the Clinton Administration is committed to scientific and technological innovation and economic growth.

SUBJECT:

Rescheduling Presidential Awards Ceremony for the
National Medals of Science and Technology

This awards ceremony for the National Medals of Science and Technology was scheduled for Tuesday morning, October 25, 1994, with the President presenting the Medals. Due to the President's travel to the Middle East this ceremony had to be canceled from the President's schedule. I have spoken with Leon Panetta about the cancellation. He agreed to rescheduling the event for early December.

It is very important that these awards be given within this calendar year by the President. In the 30 years of the Science Award the President has always given the Medal. Both Medals have been described as the American equivalent to the Nobel Prize for Science and Technology. Science and technology are essential to the economic growth and goals of this Administration.

Therefore, I submit the attached proposal for rescheduling. We, of course, understand the difficulties in scheduling, but due to the short notice cancellation, we request a new date as soon as possible so that we can inform the Medal recipients.
