On April 14, 1993 the Forest Service published, in the Federal Register, its proposed rules for commenting on, and appealing project level decisions (such as timber sales).

Previously, the Forest Service appeals process gave a 30 day comment period with comments to be postmarked on or before the 30th day. The new proposed rules provide only a 15 day comment period, with comments received in Washington D.C. by the 15th day.

Given the time required to find a copy of the proposal, read and understand the 83 page document, write comments, and have them delivered to Washington D.C., a period of 15 days is grossly insufficient. Most people who care about these issues are volunteers who work at their own careers full time and donate their valuable free time to the management of their public lands. They cannot afford to devote forty hours per week to satisfy the impatient whim of the Forest Service.

This is clearly an attempt by the Forest Service to lock the American Public out of decisions which directly affect public lands and public tax dollars. It is also a violation of the law passed by Congress last fall which attempts to improve public participation in Forest Service management decisions.

Therefore we, the undersigned, protest the 15 day comment period and urgently request a minimum 30 day comment period with comments to be postmarked on or before the 30th day.
