Keith Laughlin suggested I write you with an offer of free law school analysis and research staff assistance to the new Council on Sustainable Development.

In sum, the offer is the efforts of two, and later more, experienced law faculty and their students to research and write in order to assist the Council's staff. The faculty have worked on the Council's issues since the late 70's. We have access to complimentary WESTLAW, Dialog, LEXIS and NEXIS research services in order to assist in training our students. We also can create a free, secure e-mail system to keep the Widener law crew in touch with the Council staff.

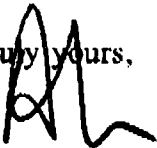
Professor John Dernbach and I, who both attended the University of Michigan Law School in the mid-70's, have extensive hands-on experience in environmental and energy issues.

John worked for 12 years for the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources, developing and implementing innovative and effective environmental laws concerning municipal waste recycling, industrial wastes, mining and pollution prevention. These laws include a mix of regulatory measures and economic incentives. John's work has helped to put Pennsylvania's waste and mining programs in a national leadership position.

I worked in Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley's Special Litigation Division from 1981-88 as one of the country's couple of dozen consumer-side litigators on utility energy issues. I served as a NASUCA officer for a number of years. I now teach law students how to litigate utility cases, and to advance environmentally benign energy technologies, including DSM, courtesy of a multi-year grant from the Energy Foundation and the Pew Charitable Trusts (as part of the Mid-Atlantic Energy Project).

I have written you, with copies to the Council's co-chairs, because John and I understand that your office is doing the leg work to find staff. Please call us if you think that we might be of service. We will need some short time to plan for the work.

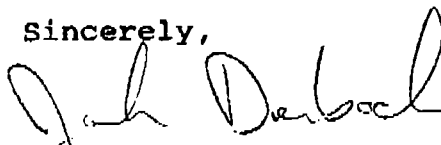

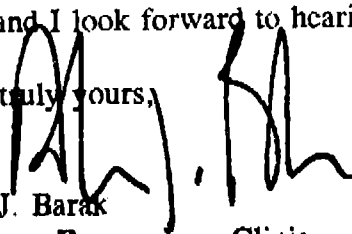
Dear Mr. Buzzelli:
