CHARTER

1. Official Designation

The "President's Council on Sustainable Development ("Council"). The Council was established by Executive Order No. 12852, dated June 29, 1993.

2. Objectives, Scope of Activities, and Description of Duties

The Council shall:

- * advise the President on matters involving sustainable development. In furtherance of the mission, the Council will develop and recommend to the President a national sustainable development action strategy that will foster economic vitality.

- * advise the President on fashioning an annual Presidential Award recognizing exemplary efforts toward the advancement of sustainable development ideals and submit nominations for the award to the President; ~~and~~ and

- * advise the President on conducting a public awareness and participation campaign on the importance of and the appropriate uses of the nation's natural and cultural resources.

~~The~~ The Council shall provide a copy of ^{its} ~~such~~ advice to the Secretary of the Interior.

The duties of the Council are solely advisory in nature.

The Council may form subcommittees and teams to assist it in the accomplishment of its objectives and duties. The subcommittees and teams may include individuals other than members of the Council and shall be fairly balanced in terms of the interests represented and the Council's objectives and duties. The chairperson of the Council may invite experts to submit information to the Council and report to the Council on specific matters concerning sustainable development.

3. Duration

The Council shall exist for a period of at least two years commencing June 29, 1993, unless extended by the President. The Council will have continuing responsibility for advising the President during its existence.

4. Official to Whom the Advisory Council Reports

The Council will report to the President.

5. Agency Responsible for Providing Support for the Council

In FY 1993, the Council will receive initial administrative and other support from the Department of the Interior's Take Pride in America Program. In FY 1994 and thereafter, to the extent available, contributions to the Interior Department's Take Pride in America program will be used, as appropriate, to support the Council. The Director of the White House Office on Environmental Policy will name a Designated Federal Official to manage and coordinate the Council's activities. Additional administrative support will be provided, to the extent authorized by law, by the White House Office on Environmental Policy and individuals and organizations serving the Council, its subcommittees, and its working teams.

6. Estimated Annual Operating Costs

The annual operating costs for the Council are estimated to be approximately \$750,000 and five (5) person-years.

7. Estimated Number and Frequency of Meetings

The Council shall meet approximately four times a year, at regular intervals, and at such other times as the President or the Designated Federal Official may direct. The total number of meetings during the two years of operation will, therefore, be approximately eight.

8. Membership

There shall be not more than twenty-five members of the Council, appointed by the President, and shall include individuals representing the interests of environmental and conservation groups, business and industry, charitable foundations, and governmental and private sectors with experience in matters of sustainable development, and individuals and entities with expertise concerning the appropriate use of (and appreciation for) Federal, State, and local lands, facilities, and natural and cultural resources. The chairperson of the Council shall be appointed by the President. Each member shall serve for an initial two-year term and may be reappointed for additional terms at the President's discretion.

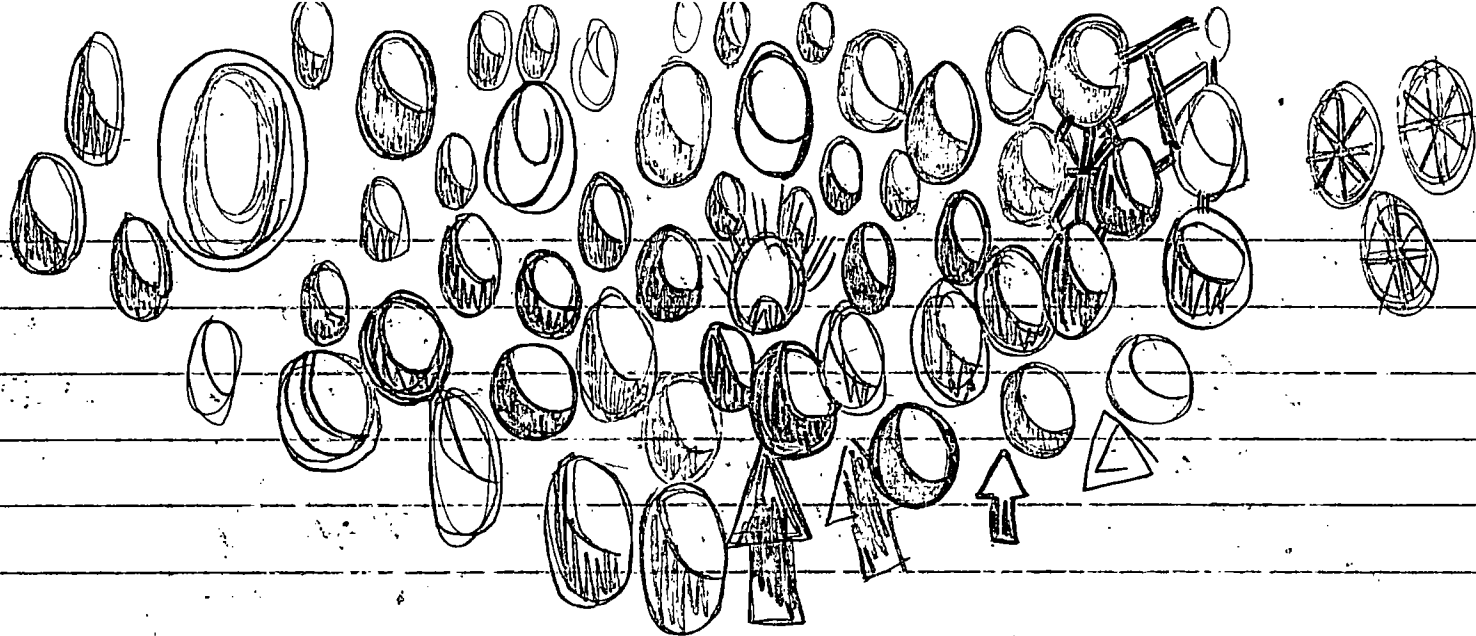

I. BACKGROUND

The White House Office on Environmental Policy ("OEP"), and the United States Department of the Interior ("DOI") enter into this Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA"), for the purpose of establishing a framework for a cooperative relationship under which the OEP and DOI, to the extent permitted by law, will assist each other in the areas of mutual concern as set forth below.

OEP, established pursuant to Executive Order, is charged with among other things: coordinating the environmental policy-making process within the Executive Office of the President; advising and assisting the President; ensuring that his proposed programs, goals, and decisions are consistent with federal environmental protection laws; and assisting the President in the development of immediate and long-range national environmental strategy. In furtherance of this mission, President Clinton has directed by Executive Order that OEP create, organize, manage, and administer the President's Council on Sustainable Development ("PCSD"). This council will assist the OEP in creating a National Sustainable Development Action Strategy that provides plans for ~~use~~ ^{appropriate} use and respect for our Federal, State, and local lands, facilities, and

DRAFT

natural~~s~~ and cultural resources, and advise the President on sustainable development initiatives critical to the development of a National Environmental Strategy. The PCSD will also be responsible for communicating with the public concerning the importance of the appropriate uses of the nation's natural resources. Further, the PCSD will fashion an annual Presidential Award recognizing exemplary efforts toward the advancement of sustainable development ideals.

The mission of the DOI includes the management of the nationally-owned public lands, waters, and other natural, cultural and historic resources for which the Department is responsible. This includes protecting and enhancing certain fish and wildlife refuges and historic places; providing outdoor recreation opportunities; and assuring the development of energy and mineral resources in the best interests of all our people.

In furtherance of DOI's mission, Congress authorized a Take Pride in America ("TPIA") program within DOI. See 16 U.S.C 4601-4608. Under this program, TPIA's mission is to conduct a public awareness campaign, in coordination with other public and private sector organizations, to encourage and promote the appreciation and protection of the Nation's resources. 16 U.S.C. § 4601. TPIA's other mission is to conduct a national awards program to honor those individuals and entities that have distinguished themselves through their endeavors in instilling in the public the importance

of the appropriate use of federal, state, and local lands, facilities, and natural and cultural resources. Id. Further, 16 U.S.C. § 4602 authorizes the Secretary to solicit, accept, administer and invest in government securities, gifts and bequests of money and other property in furtherance of the TPIA program. The OEP and the DOI enter into this MOA in furtherance of the missions of the PCSD and the TPIA program.

II. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The White House Office on Environmental Policy, working with the U.S. Department of the Interior, will foster communications to, and awareness by, the public with respect to the PCSD's functions relating to national development and growth through effective resource and cultural management, protection, and conservation.
2. The Secretary will accept donations of and bequests of money, and other personal property to TPIA from non-federal entities to aid and facilitate the purposes of the PCSD consistent with the mission of the TPIA program. ~~The Secretary or his designee will transfer these gifts and bequests in trust of the PCSD to the OEP and/or its lawful administrative agent.~~

3. The Secretary shall take steps to assure that gifts and bequests ~~transferred to OEP~~ under this MOA are used for purposes consistent with the missions of the TPIA program.

4. This MOA is entered into under the authority of 16 U.S.C. § 4605 and 31 U.S.C. § 1535.

III. DURATION

This MOA will ~~remain~~ ^{remain} in ~~effect~~ ^{effect} ~~indefinitely~~ ^{indefinitely}. However, either party to this MOA may withdraw from it, provided that it gives the other party at least 30 days' written notice of the intent to withdraw.

IV. FUNDING

This council will assist the OEP in creating a National Sustainable Development Action Strategy that provides plans for appropriate use and respect for our federal, state, and local lands, [White House

comments left "federal, state, local" capitalized] facilities, and natural and cultural resources, and advise the President on sustainable development initiatives critical to the development of a National Environmental Strategy. The PCSD will also be responsible for communicating with the public concerning the importance of the appropriate uses of the nation's natural resources. Further, the PCSD will fashion an annual Presidential Award recognizing exemplary efforts toward the advancement of sustainable development ideals.

The mission of the DOI includes the management of the nationally-owned public lands, waters, and other natural, cultural and historic resources for which the Department is responsible. This includes protecting and enhancing certain fish and wildlife refuges and historic places; providing outdoor recreation opportunities; and assuring the development of energy and mineral resources in the best interests of all our people.

In furtherance of DOI's mission, Congress authorized a Take Pride in America ("TPIA") program within DOI. See 16 U.S.C 4601-4608. Under this program, TPIA's mission is to conduct a public awareness campaign, in coordination with other public and private sector organizations, to encourage and promote the appreciation and protection of the Nation's resources. 16 U.S.C. § 4601. TPIA's other mission is to conduct a national awards program to honor those individuals and entities that have distinguished themselves

through their endeavors in instilling in the public the importance of the appropriate use of federal, state, and local lands, facilities, and natural and cultural resources. Id. Further, 16 U.S.C. § 4602 authorizes the Secretary to solicit, accept, administer and invest in government securities, gifts and bequests of money and other property in furtherance of the TPIA program. The OEP and the DOI enter into this MOA in furtherance of the missions of the PCSD and the TPIA program.

II. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The White House Office on Environmental Policy, working with the U.S. Department of the Interior, will foster communications to, and awareness by, the public with respect to the PCSD's functions relating to national development and growth through effective resource and cultural management, protection, and conservation.
2. The Secretary will accept donations of and bequests of money, and other personal property to TPIA from non-federal entities to aid and facilitate the purposes of the PCSD consistent with the mission of the TPIA program. [White House deleted the next sentence. The Secretary or his designee will transfer these gifts and bequests in trust of the PCSD to the OEP and/or its lawful administrative agent.]

3. The Secretary shall take steps to assure that gifts and bequests [White House deleted transferred to OEP] under this MOA are used for purposes consistent with the missions of the TPIA program.
4. This MOA is entered into under the authority of 16 U.S.C. § 4605 and 31 U.S.C. § 1535.

III. DURATION

This MOA will remain in effect indefinitely. However, either party to this MOA may withdraw from it, provided that it gives the other party at least 30 days' written notice of the intent to withdraw.

IV. FUNDING

In FY 1993 the Secretary will transfer to the White House changed OEP to TPIA Program], under [White House deleted the] conditions set forth above in II.2 and II.3, \$400,000 in [White House inserted "available funds"] appropriated [White House deleted funds available to the TPIA program and inserted "to DOI"].
