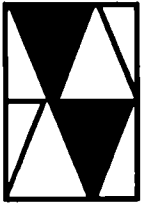

The Inter-American Dialogue and Amnesty International would like to invite you to a briefing on "U.S. Foreign Policy and the World's Indigenous Peoples." The breakfast meeting will be held from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. on Friday, June 18, in Room 2255 of the Rayburn building. Following brief presentations by five experts on the diverse ways indigenous communities are affected by U.S. policies, there will be a discussion of 1992's Cultural Survival Act (a/k/a the Cranston Amendment), and pending legislation affecting U.S. foreign policy and indigenous peoples.

As you may be aware, the Cultural Survival Act requires the State Department to report on the situation of indigenous peoples in its annual human rights reporting to Congress. It also requires the United States to monitor the democratic participation and access to economic resources of indigenous peoples in countries receiving U.S. economic assistance. The focus of the discussion will be the implementation of this legislation in light of the change in Administration and the reorganization of the State Department and USAID.

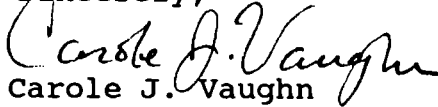
In June, the town of Huachuca City, Arizona will be dedicating its new Regional Recycling Center. The center is designed to recycle, process, and compost waste from Huachuca City and the surrounding communities, and will extend the current landfill's life expectancy by approximately 12 years.

It is our belief that small communities like Huachuca City need to take an aggressive and innovative role in addressing and solving America's solid waste management challenges. The recycling center is the latest of our projects and one in which we take a great deal of pride. The center is unique in that 1) its affordable capital cost of \$11,000 per ton of capacity makes it cost effective for a small community like ours; 2) by recycling and processing the entire waste stream it reduces the volume by 70%, thereby allowing the city to avoid future costs of landfilling; 3) the system is environmentally sound in that the waste that has to be landfilled is stabilized and consists of inert material.

On behalf of the people of Huachuca City, I am writing to invite you to participate in our dedication ceremony. We have set a tentative date of June 18, 1993 for the official opening of the new recycling center, however, the date and time of the event are flexible. Your participation in the ceremony would bring attention to one of the leading efforts in solid waste processing and show other communities around the nation that the current Administration encourages this kind of aggressive local innovation and action to preserve our environment.
