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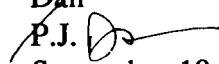

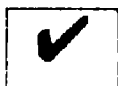

WORLD CONGRESS ON URBAN GROWTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT

I am writing to you to ask whether it would be possible for you to see Lord Jenkin of Roding.

2. Lord Jenkin was formerly a senior member of the British Cabinet, and served as Secretary for Social Services, for Industry, and from 1983 to 1985 as Secretary of State for the Environment. He was created a life peer for his services to politics in 1987. Lord Jenkin is a senior Vice President for the World Congress on Urban Growth and the Environment which is taking place in Hong Kong in 1994. The joint Presidents of the Congress are His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, and the Vice President. As you will know, the Vice President wrote to my Ambassador recently, confirming that he would be continuing in this capacity.

3. The Congress is one of the major international follow-up events to the Rio Earth Summit. It will address the serious environmental and human problems posed by the growth of big cities, particularly in developing countries. Among the other senior figures involved in the Congress are Kazuo Aichi, former Japanese Environment Minister, Dr Qu Geping, Director of the Chinese National Environmental Protection Agency, and Dr Thomas Malone, Director of the Sigma Xi Scientific Research Center in North Carolina.

“I have argued for many years the importance of the concept of stewardship in resolving some of our ecological dilemmas. For me, stewardship operates at two levels; firstly, at the level of good housekeeping; living thriftily, saving energy, repairing, re-using and recycling, not wanting by not wasting, accepting personal responsibility, and so on.

Secondly, it also operates at a level which recognises that we are as much a part of the living world as it is a part of us. Good stewardship celebrates the beauty and diversity of the natural world. We should not, I believe, just be “managing the Earth’s resources more efficiently” (relying on a traditional utilitarian ethic), but seeking to live in balance with the rest of creation, even if we cannot discern any direct and immediate material benefit to ourselves in that process.”

“In today’s world, the links between social injustice and environmental degradation can be seen everywhere: the placement of toxic waste dumps in poor neighborhoods, the devastation of indigenous peoples and the extinction of their cultures when the rain forests are destroyed, disproportionate levels of lead and toxic pollution in inner-city ghettos, the corruption of many government officials by people who seek to profit from the unsustainable exploitation of resources.

The promotion of justice and the protection of the environment must go hand in hand in any society, whether in the context of a nation’s domestic policies or in the design of “North-South” agreements between the industrial nations and the Third World. Without such commitments, the world cannot contemplate the all-out effort urgently needed.”

URBAN AND THE ENVIRONMENT

OUTLINE PROGRAMME

GLOBAL OVERVIEW

POPULATION GROWTH. The combined effects of Rural Migration (net Rural to Urban Migration, in some cases), which is largely the result of better chances of employment and survival in Urban Areas, as well as services not available on the land, and Natural Reproduction, which raises major issues of family planning and education. Cities that are Unsustainable or Underdeveloped, or both.

HUMAN PROBLEMS. The plight of the poorest communities, obliged to live on derelict or unsuitable land, beyond the reach of even the most basic city services such as tap water, electricity and sewerage. The transmission of diseases through lack of sanitation, as in the case of non-existent drainage and garbage collection.

MORAL ISSUES. The urgent need for Social Equity and a fairer distribution of all available opportunities. The acceptance of the concept of Stewardship in our dealings with the Natural Environment, which is vital to the mental, spiritual and recreational well-being of city dwellers.

ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

ATMOSPHERIC POLLUTION. The high energy needs of cities, and their contribution to Global Warming, Stratospheric Ozone Depletion, Acid Rain and human health problems. The effect of harmful industrial emissions, combined with the uncontrolled rise in both the number of private motor cars and heavy traffic, where adequate Public Transport and Railway alternatives are not available.

The need for improved energy efficiency at all levels, coupled with the development of new and renewable sources of power.

WATER POLLUTION AND SOLID WASTE. The effect of Industrial Effluent and Urban Sewage on the pollution of both Surface and Ground Water. The ecological consequences of the large-scale contamination of Rivers and their Estuaries, including the destruction of the Marine Resources of coastal areas. The relevance of such issues to the supply of clean water and the safe disposal of sewage in urban areas.

New forms of disposal and recycling of solid waste and urban garbage, to alleviate the health-threat to low-income areas.

LAND USE. Land Dereliction and Erosion, including the impact of Urban Peripheral Development on the Rural Environment. Planning a more balanced environment by improved land use management. The provision for Urban Green Spaces to help improve the quality of life, especially of poorer communities.

URBAN MANAGEMENT

GOVERNMENT AND COMMUNITY. The combined role of Central and Local Government in tackling the urban degradation and resulting health hazards of low-income areas, by allowing legal tenure of unutilised land and providing Community Development Projects with subsidised building materials. The acceptance that all people living in either Squatter Settlements or Slum Areas have a right to basic infrastructure and services (Health Care, Piped Water, Sewerage, Electricity, Education), and that there can be no real progress in sustainable development until the worst cases of human deprivation and misery are eliminated.

The specific contribution of women in managing the environment in a sustainable manner.

DEVELOPMENT LEGISLATION. The importance of being able to guarantee the enforcement of laws that must be clear and equitable, after due consultation with Local Authorities, Industry and citizens' groups. New legal frameworks, safeguarding both the urban and rural environments, should ensure that Economic Growth occurs within the bounds of natural laws.

TOWARDS GREATER SUSTAINABILITY. The relevance of widening the scope of the interaction between the Urban and Rural Environments, with due regard to the interests of smaller cities, and ensuring that urban areas benefit from an adequate and reliable supply of affordable food-stuffs and other renewable resources.

Intermediate Technology to assist with the implementation of programmes of Afforestation, Irrigation, and the supply of energy alternatives to wood for either cooking or heating.

The abolition of unnecessary Trade Barriers as an essential requirement for the viability of Rural Hinterlands and the long-term sustainability of cities.

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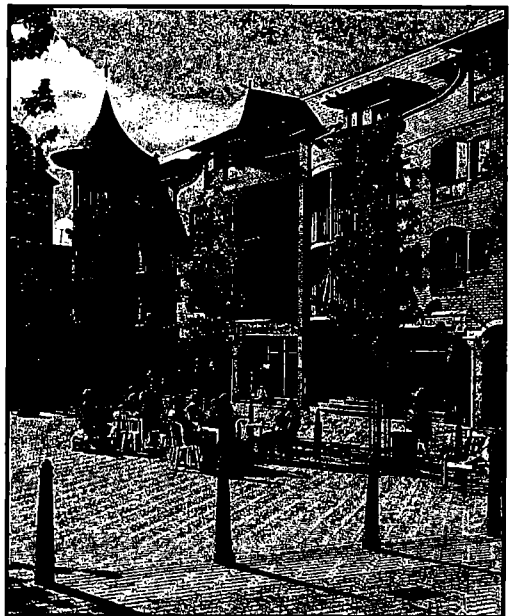
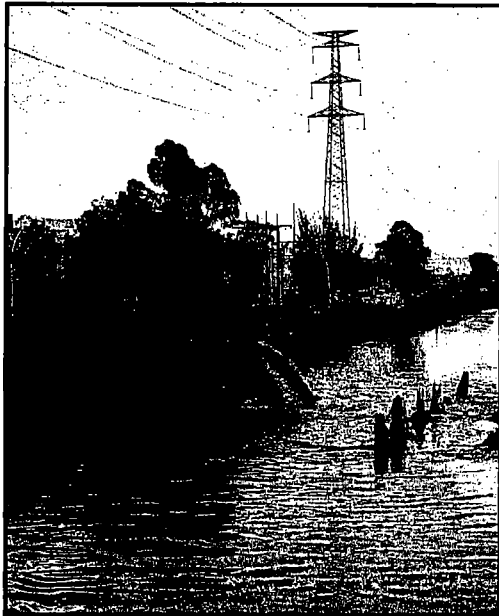
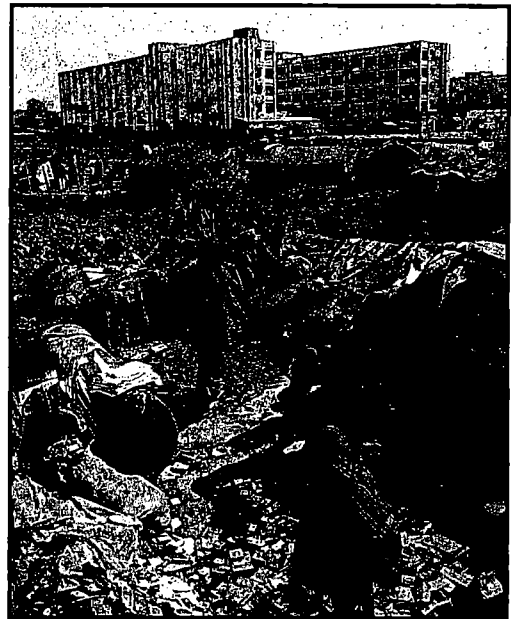
