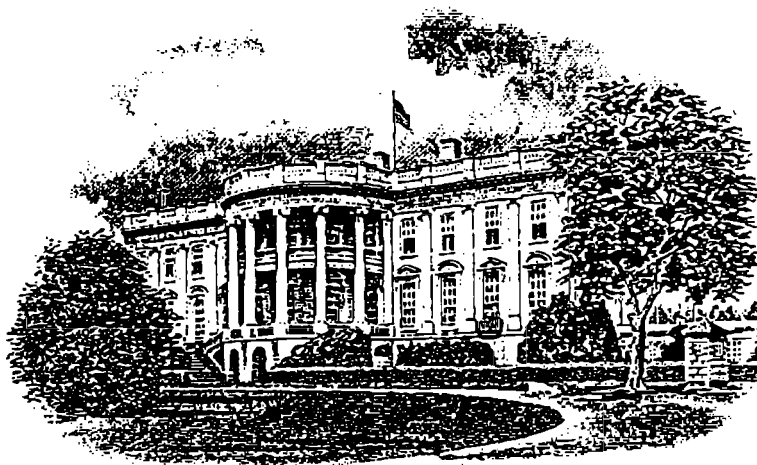

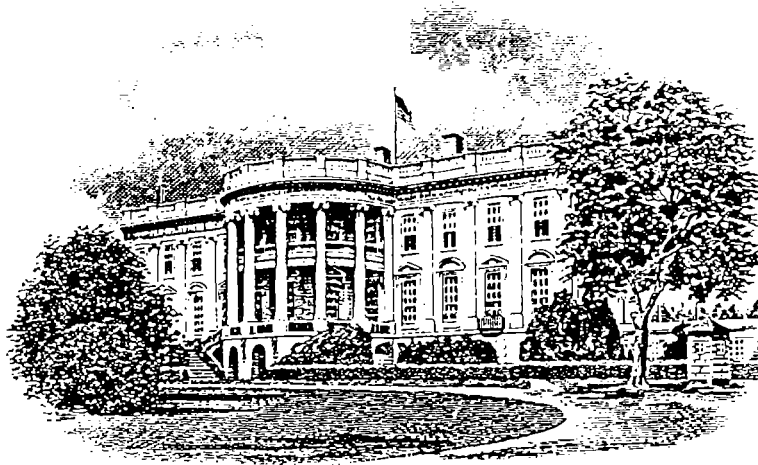

Thomas P. Grumbly has been President and Chief Executive Officer of Clean Sites, Inc. since October, 1987. Clean Sites is a neutral, non-profit company that works with all parties to accelerate the cleanup of hazardous waste in the United States. During his tenure, Clean Sites has become a major force in the hazardous waste policy arena because of its reputation for objectivity. This is a reputation borne from its hands-on work as mediators and technical project managers at nearly 100 hazardous waste sites in the nation. Clean Sites is in the vanguard of organizations that explicitly bridge the gap among industry, environmentalists and the government. In his capacity as CEO, Mr. Grumbly manages a significant staff, and works closely with perhaps the most diverse Board of Directors in the environmental arena. Mr. Grumbly has built Clean Sites from a good idea into a major force in environmental protection.

Prior to leading Clean Sites, Mr. Grumbly ran another pathbreaking environmental venture, the Health Effects Institute in Cambridge, Massachusetts. HEI is a unique scientific alliance between the EPA and the world's automotive community. It conducts much of the nation's research on the health effects of automotive emissions. Working with former Watergate Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox and others, Mr. Grumbly built this organization nearly from scratch, and turned it into what one author believes is "perhaps the most innovative approach to addressing the regulatory science dilemma that has yet been attempted." At both Clean Sites and HEI, Mr. Grumbly has demonstrated convincingly that functioning, practical major partnerships among government, industry and the environmental community can really work.

Mr. Grumbly has other significant senior managerial and policy experience that have prepared him for a senior public role. After graduating from Cornell University in 1971, cum laude, with a degree in government, Mr. Grumbly obtained masters degrees in political economy and public policy analysis from the University of Toronto and the University of California, Berkeley, respectively. After beginning his public service with a short stint in the Department of Justice as an analyst, Mr. Grumbly was a budget examiner at OMB from 1975-77. He then served as Executive Assistant to the Commissioner of the FDA, and from 1979-81, was Deputy Administrator of the USDA Food Safety and Quality Service, where he had line authority for over 14,000 federal meat and poultry inspectors, as the youngest career member of the Senior Executive Service of the United States.

From 1981-82, Mr. Grumbly served as Staff Director for the Investigations and Oversight Committee of the House Science and Technology Committee, chaired by then Representative Albert Gore, Jr. Together with Gore, Mr. Grumbly put together the first hearings on the so-called "greenhouse" effect, as well as a wide range of other areas. Mr. Grumbly has also been a senior management consultant at a major consulting firm in Lexington, Massachusetts, specializing in working with the private sector on environmental and regulatory problems.

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Mr. Grumbly currently holds a position as a Visiting Lecturer at the Center for Risk Analysis at Harvard University. He has written several articles on regulation and the environment, and has held several committee posts with the National Academy of Sciences on a variety of important topics. These range from the problems of risk communication in regulation to the quality of the Department of Interior's hazardous waste materials program.
