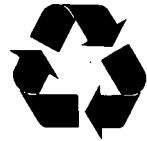

FOE

1) Quickly close down 33 most unsafe reactors
primarily thru direct assistance of western scientists
(over 3 mth period while alternative energy sources
(gas turbine & generator plants are available)
Starting w/ EBR-1

2) Investment & loans of at least \$10 billion
mobilized per alt energy alternatives over next 5 years
- focusing on safety & efficiency

3) replace Nuclear reactors w/ supply side option

4) Assist in development of country energy strategies
- energy efficiency / demand reduction
- long term safe & sustainable energy development
- pollution reduction from fossil fuels

5 - recommends closing all reactors starting w/ most
dangerous

- encourage decrease in energy intensity
(opportunities for efficient electrification)

Focus - all energy sector efforts at implementation of
least-cost planning, demand reduction & provision of
safe & clear supplies - do not attempt to support
western Nuclear industries



- money to close reactor in form of grants rather than loans (closure will not yield profits)
- technological/expert assistance in closing facilities

NROD

- Direct Funding completely away from VVER ^{440/230} & RBMK
current funding discourages alternatives & subsidized ^{continued} operation
- funding assistance must define long term objective and broader @ consideration of risks
include: fuel cycle, waste management, env. isolation
weapons disarmament & nonproliferation
