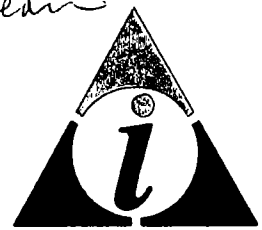

I'll drop off the Washington report that describes the program, a file on Georgia's welfare initiative, and an MDRC report "Encouraging Work, Reducing Poverty" (Chapter 3 profiles a few state programs). Margy may look into a few more states that received high performance bonus awards for strongest outcomes in job entry/retention. Here's other info:

(2) A recent weekly submission (not sure if it ever went up) on Washington's program:

Welfare reform -- Research: A recent evaluation of Washington state's WorkFirst program shows strong positive outcomes associated with welfare reform changes including work requirements, work incentives, and time limits. The study compared AFDC recipients in the first quarter of 1996 to WorkFirst participants in the first quarter of 1998, and controlled for client characteristics and economic conditions. WorkFirst participants were 56 percent more likely to work, had 48 percent higher earnings, worked 34 percent more hours, and were 21 percent more likely to be off welfare by the fourth quarter. These findings reinforce Washington state's receipt of the high performance bonuses you announced last December, when the state received nearly \$11 million for being the nation's leader in job placement improvement and among the top ten states that improved job retention and earnings.
