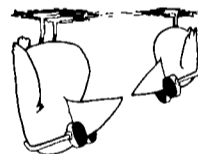

What is Control Theory?

Control Theory is a theory of human motivation and behavior. It provides a scientific explanation of internal motivation. Control Theory concepts can be applied in many different fields including counseling, education, and business management. The International Association for Applied Control Theory (IAACT) sponsors intensive training sessions that will enable professionals in these fields to gain an understanding of Control Theory and to become proficient in its use in these and related fields.

Certification Process

In order to become certified in Applied Control Theory, you must successfully complete the following: (ACT 1) Basic Intensive Seminar in Applied Control Theory, Basic Practicum, (ACT 2) Advanced Intensive Seminar in Applied Control Theory, Advanced Practicum, and (ACT 3) Certification Week, (one will be held in Charlotte, NC, November 1999). The ACT 1 and 2 seminars are both four-day courses that provide intensive training in Control Theory. Upon completion of each seminar, you must enroll in a practicum. The Basic and Advanced Practicums each require a commitment to perform 30 hours of field work over a minimum of six months (your work is done in consultation with a certified IAACT supervisor). The last step, ACT 3, is held several times a year. The entire certification process takes approximately 18 months to complete.

The Intensive Seminars

The Intensive Seminars are designed to help people in all areas involving human interaction. The basic concepts of Control Theory are fairly easy to comprehend. However, learning to apply them successfully takes time. This is the aim of the Intensive Seminars. New View offers both ACT 1 and ACT 2 training with senior members of IAACT.

ACT 1

A four-day course intended for those with little or no exposure to Control Theory. The emphasis is on small group work, where the major activity is practicing the use of Control Theory through role playing. Other workshop activities include: lectures, discussions, problem solving, viewing video tapes, and planning for implementation of the ideas and techniques studied during the week. Limited to 13 participants per group.

ACT 2

This four-day course is designed to develop and refine skills in the application of Control Theory-based counseling techniques. One-on-one role playing exercises and group practices are emphasized. Close supervision is provided. The prerequisites are completion of both the ACT 1 seminar and Basic Practicum. Limited to 13 participants per group.
