## REPORT

[To accompany H.R. 2491]

The Committee on Appropriations to which was referred the bill (H.R. 2491) making appropriations for the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and Urban Development, and for sundry independent agencies, boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, and for other purposes, reports the same to the Senate with various amendments and presents herewith an explanation of the contents of the bill.

service should not be seen as a new program. Instead, it should be seen as a means for predominantly young citizens to partake in America's opportunity structure through service to others. Benefits are conferred only upon the completion of one's service, instilling in the participants that postservice job training and educational benefits are earned, not given. In addition, for many of those who will participate in national service, the chance to do so will serve as the kind of "boot camp" experience that will help them mature and better understand the value of hard work so they will make better adults.

**Operating plan, reprogramming, and reorganization guidelines.**—As it does with the other major departments and agencies funded in the VA, HUD, and Independent Agencies appropriations bill, the Committee directs the Corporation to submit an annual operating plan for the review and approval of the Committees on Appropriations not later than 30 days after the VA, HUD, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act is signed into law by the President. The annual operating plan should include an explanation of how the Corporation intends to implement the fiscal year budget approved by the Committees in the annual appropriations bill. The Committee expects this to be a standing requirement for the Corporation for all fiscal years beginning with fiscal year 1994. Since the Corporation is in its nascent stages, the Committee expects the first operating plan to be submitted not later than December 1, 1993.

In addition, the Committee is setting the Corporation's initial reprogramming threshold at \$250,000. Any changes to the budget request, or the approved appropriations, by the Corporation, whose dollar amounts that equal or exceed this threshold must be submitted to the Committees on Appropriations for their review and approval 30 days before they are to take effect. The Committee has set this initial threshold at \$250,000 because it wishes to be apprised of the startup costs for this new organization in greater detail than if the Corporation were an already standing Federal organization. Once the Corporation begins operations in earnest, the Committee will revisit this threshold during deliberations on the fiscal year 1995 budget.

The Committee also wishes to be advised 30 days in advance before any proposed reorganizations are implemented by the Corporation. Again, this guideline is fully consistent with the reorganization guidelines for all agencies that receive funds in the VA, HUD, and Independent Agencies appropriations bill.

**Program activities.**—The Committee allocates the fiscal year 1994 appropriation as follows:

**Full- and part-time service.**—\$306,000,000 is for subtitles C and D full- and part-time service opportunities. This should provide for

20,000 service opportunities in the first year, an amount more than three times the level provided during the peak years of the Peace Corps. Of the amount provided for full- and part-time service, \$94,500,000 is designated for educational awards from the National Service Trust Fund. Of the remaining amounts, \$114,000,000 is for grants to States—\$57,000,000 by formula and the remaining \$57,000,000 to be awarded competitively; \$3,000,000 is for U.S. territories; and \$3,000,000 is for Indian tribes. The Committee expects the Corporation to provide it in the operating plan with some general idea of the ratio of funds that will be used for full- and part-time activities. In allocating funds to the States, the Corporation should initially focus its outreach on those programs that were funded under subtitle D of the 1990 act—the national models. In allocating funds to the States, the Committee directs the Corporation to instruct States to give highest priority to funding those existing service organizations and activities which meet the criteria of quality, innovation, replicability, and sustainability without Federal funds.

**Service learning.**—\$40,000,000 is provided for activities under subtitle B for the school-based and community-based service learning.

**Civilian Conservation Corps.**—No additional funds are provided for this activity because \$20,000,000 in previously appropriated funds is available for fiscal year 1994. The Committee expects the Corporation to provide a full explanation of the use of these funds in the operating plan, and to incorporate all programs funded with previously appropriated funds for the CCC in its first evaluation of national service programs around the country.

**Administrative expenses.**—The Committee has placed a limitation on the amount available for administrative expenses of \$25,000,000. These funds should be apportioned between the Corporation and State commissions consistent with the terms of the authorization act. The amount provided is \$15,000,000 below the authorized ceiling provided in the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993. The Corporation may hire not more than 50 full-time equivalent permanent positions in fiscal year 1994. As part of its administrative activity, the Committee expects the Corporation to hire all existing permanent employees of the Commission on National and Community Service who seek employment with the Corporation. The Commission staff is an excellent one, and its expertise will add greatly to the ease with which the transition is made to a much broader national and community service program.

**Miscellaneous limitations.**—Not more than \$9,500,000 is available for technical assistance; \$2,000,000 has been designated for use by persons with disabilities. Up to \$15,000,000 is available for a second Summer of Service Program, and \$10,000,000 for disaster assistance. Not more than \$15,000,000 is available for activities under subtitle H and \$5,000,000 is available for the Points of Light Foundation. The Committee has provided these limitations, without prejudice, in order to maximize the amount available directly for full- and part-time service opportunities. Since the appropriation request for full- and part-time service is substantially less than that initially requested in the budget submission, the Committee believes that every effort should be made to allocate re-
