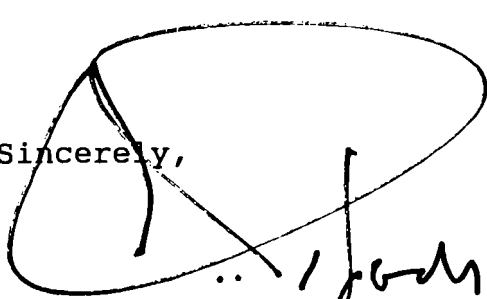
Dear Mr. Paster:

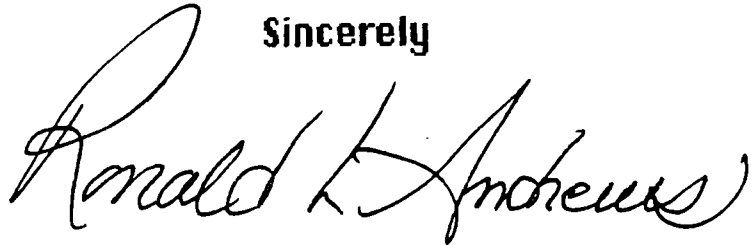

Dear Mr. President:

As elected officials in this great land, we are so busy concentrating on the complicated problems facing our nation that we sometimes forget that the future really lies in the hands and minds of our children.

The bi-partisan efforts to propel job training programs to reach our youth have been admirable, and have had phenomenal results. However, I believe that we must now move further along in the process to train those same young people to realize that they have an opportunity and a responsibility to contribute to society.

It is in this spirit, and with the knowledge of your commitment to youth service, that I write this letter. The Interlocken Educational Opportunities Fund in partnership with Antioch New England Graduate School, The National Council of Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, and the Maruzen College have recently sent a proposal to the Commission on National and Community Service for funding under the Summer of Service Program. This proposal has been spearheaded by Geri Crichley, one of my constituents, who is a public servant in her own right, having served in the Peace Corp in Senegal, Africa. The winning feature of this proposal is that to my knowledge it is the only one that will utilize the resources of former Peace Corp volunteers. These Peace Corp alumni not only have the knowledge of international exposure, but also the experience of how to best transfer skills into true public service.

With the opportunity to bring together young people from all backgrounds into this project, we are encouraging these students to be tolerant, understanding, and accepting of their peers. With so much pronounced division among the citizens of this nation, what better way to eliminate some of that same intolerance from our youth. I believe this proposal is worth careful consideration.

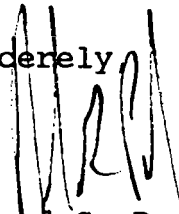

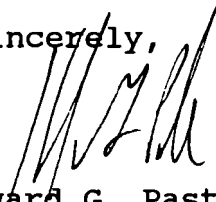
