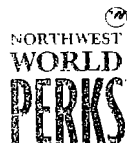
Check-In Information

To retain their assigned seat, passengers with *Advanced Seat Requests* who do not have boarding passes must present themselves for check-in at the departure gate *at least 15 minutes prior to departure*.

International Flights: To retain their assigned seat, passengers with *Advanced Boarding Passes* must be either on board the aircraft or present themselves for check-in at the departure gate *at least 30 minutes* prior to scheduled departure flights to and from Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean and *60 minutes* prior to scheduled departure for all other international flights. To retain their assigned seat, passengers with *Advanced Seat Requests* who do not have boarding passes must present themselves for check-in at the departure gate *at least 40 minutes* prior to scheduled departure of flights to and from Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean and *60 minutes* prior to scheduled departure for all other international flights.

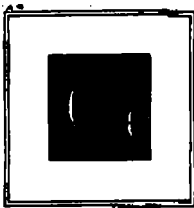

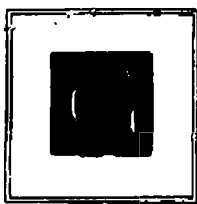

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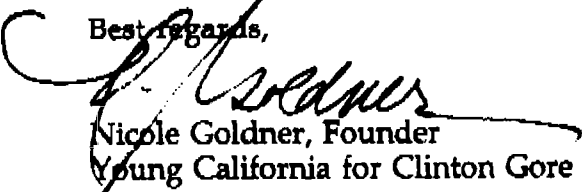
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
